

REPORT OF THE COMMITT'S FOR THE YEARS 1844-5 & 1845-6.

S.M.E. 1964

A PERIOD of two years has nearly clapsed since the Committee of the QUEBEC LADIES' BENEVOLENT SOCIETY addressed their kind friends and supporters; and in again bringing under their notice the interests of an institution which since its formation has enjoyed so large a share of generous sympathy, they avail themselves of the opportunity to tender their warmest acknowledgments for past benefactions, and feel encouraged to anticipate from their present appeal results of a character similar to what they have bitherto experienced.

The relief of the necessitous by those who have to spare of this world's goods, is an act which, like the quality of mercy, is twice blessed—" it blesseth him that gives and him that takes;"—the former, by its exercise experiences the luxury of doing good, whilst it rescues the latter from the gripe of pinching penury and destitution. But while admitting that the principle of benevolence is twofold in its operation, we have the warranty of scripture in asserting that, "it is more blessed to give than to receive!"

Owing to the painful visitation with which it pleased the Great Ruler of events to afflict this city in 1845, your committee did not conceive it advisable to publish that year their seventh annual report; in consequence of which it will be necessary to embody in this the particulars which under other circumstances they would then have had the pleasure of laying before their patrons.

The amount of collections realized for the year 1844-5 was £105 12s. 2d. out of which relief was administered to nearly

400 cases, consisting as in former years, of afflicted settlers, indigent young females, poor women with large families, the sick, the widow and the orphan.

Subsequent to the above-mentioned period the dreadful fires of May and June 1845 occurred, through which so unusual a demand was made upon the charitable public, the contributors themselves in many instances being heavy losers, and the fund raised for the relief of the sufferers by those calamities being so ample and generous, your committee, influenced by a consideration of these facts, hesitated about taking up any collection and allowed the usual time to elapse without making an effort. It was, however, suggested to them that there were many deserving poor who had not suffered by the fires, and had therefore no claim upon the relief fund, who would greatly feel the want of that assistance they had been accustomed to receive from the Society; besides, that the sufferers themselves would not, in every case, have all the comforts they formerly enjoyed; and in addition, that many of their former contributors were waiting a call from the collectors. Stimulated by these arguments, your committee decided to solicit subscriptions for the year, although at a later period than that usually chosen by them for such a purpose. The amount collected on this occasion, as may be reasonably conceived, was much more limited than on any previous year, amounting to £52 14s. 1d, out of which about 250 cases have been relieved.

In conclusion, the committee would state, that owing to this relaxation of their efforts, at no period since the institution of the Society have their funds been so low or their stock of material so small as at present. They feel persuaded, however, that the simple announcement of this fact to their benevolent supporters, without any further appeal to their sympathy, will be productive of the desired effect, in again placing the Society in that pleasing state of efficiency by which until now it has been characterized.
