Annual Report

OF THE

Committee of Management

OF THE

St. George's Society of the City of Toronto.

FOR THE YEAR 1878.

With the expiration of the Year, for which the Committee were elected, it becomes their duty to present this, the forty-fourth Annual report of their operations, and it is with mingled feelings of gratification and regret, that they do so; gratification at the continued success and prosperity of the Society; regret at having again to record the amount of destitution and want that prevails among our Countrymen.

The continued depression in trade, and the great want of employment, causes the number of applicants, for relief to augment, and consequently it is largely in advance of last year.

The balance in the hands of the Treasurer, at the close of the last year, was \$444.00. The receipts during the year, have been \$2046.68, making a total of \$2490.68.

The expenditure of the Society for the relief of the destitute

Advertising, Office expenses, &c., has amounted to \$1880.55, leaving a balance in the hands of the Treasurer of \$510.13, \$100 being deposited on Interest.

RELIEF.

Relief has been given during the year, to 1304 Applicants, representing, at the usual average number to a family, about 6500 Individuals, to the amount of \$946.04, and Christmas distribution, \$385.71.

This amount has been expended in Bread, Meat, Money payment, Railway passages, &c., as usual.

Orders for the ground for Interments have been given in six cases, and assistance towards the expenses of the Funerals also.

The Committee have not spared either time or trouble to assist the deserving, and to prevent imposition.

MEMBERSHIP.

There have been 15 Life Members, and 51 Annual Members elected during the past year. The number of Members now on the books being; honorary life members, 16; life members 201; annual members, 253. A careful revision having been made by a special Committee appointed for that purpose resulting, in having again to strike off a number, who for over two years had omitted paying, or who had positively declined.

One member only so far as is known has died during the year, viz., Mr. J. H. MEAD, who was an old resident and a very highly respected gentleman.

CONCERT IN ST. JAMES'S SCHOOL ROOM.

On the 26th of February, a Concert was given in the St. James's School Room; most courteously granted by the Dean and Church Wardens; by various ladies and gentlemen taking an interest in the work of the Society, who kindly volunteered

their services, and resulted in a net gain to the funds of the Society of \$100.00.

ANNUAL RELIGIOUS SERVICES.

The Annual Religious Services were held in St. James's Cathedral, on the 21st of April, and in the Elm Street Methodist Church, on the 28th of April; and the Committee would desire to express their appreciation of the very courteous way in which those Churches were granted for the services:

The Sermon in St. James's Cathedral was preached by the Rev. J. Pearson; and that in Elm Street Methodist Church by the Rev. T. W. Handford, the Chaplains of the Society.

The collections amounting to \$258.77.

DINNER ON ST. GEORGE'S DAY.

On the evening of St. George's Day a Dinner was held in the American Hotel, only 60 gentlemen, sat down thereto; the dinner was well served, and a very pleasant evening was spent; but the pecuniary gain was small, being only \$7.00, which was appropriated to the Charitable Fund.

UNION OF ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETIES OF NORTH AMERICA.

The three Vice-Presidents were elected as the representatives of this Society at the meeting of this Union at Guelph. They were received and entertained by the brethren at Guelph, with all kindness and hospitality. The excursion to Guelph on the 28th of August, barely met the cost.

LECTURE BY THE REV. T. W. HANDFORD.

The Rev. T. W. Handford delivered a lecture in Shaftesbury Hall, on behalf of the Funds of the Society, the subject being "The Pilgrim Fathers:" the evening proved very unfavourable, being very stormy. The net proceeds amounted to \$46.58.

CHRISTMAS DISTRIBUTION.

The Annual Christmas Collection was made in December, by the Committee and Stewards and other members of the Society. The amount collected was \$607.95. Besides the donations of meat, bread, tea, &c., there were purchased 4,000 lbs. of beef, 3,000 lbs. of bread, 143 lbs. of tea, and 540 lbs. of sugar. The distribution took place in a large store, No. 23 King Street West, very kindly lent by Messrs. Mason & Risch for the purpose. Relief was given to very nearly 600 families, comprising according to the statement furnished, over 3,000 individuals.

TENT.

The tent has not been a source of profit during the past year. It was thoroughly repaired in the spring, and lent to the Sons of England Society to go to Oshawa on Dominion Day. On its return it was carried past Toronto, to some distant station, and lost sight of for some time, consequently a portion of the best of the season was lost. Twenty dollars has, so far, been the amount received for its use during the season.

INVESTMENT.

The Investments remain in the same position as last year; but there are two special deposits in the Canada Permanent Loan and Savings Company, one of \$150, and one of \$100, bearing interest at 6 per cent, which more than covers the 19 Life Memberships received.

CONCLUSION.

In conclusion, the Committee would express to the membership the gratification they feel at the amount of good they have been enabled to do among their needy fellow-countrymen,

BY-LAWS.

I. The Society shall consist of such persons of English or Welsh birth or descent, in the male line, as shall be elected members thereof according to the regulations hereinafter made.

II. The objects of the Society are to unite Englishmen and Welshmen, and their descendants, in a social compact for the promotion of mutual and friendly intercourse, and for affording to persons of English or Welsh birth or descent who may be in distress, their advice and counsel, and if necessary, such pecuniary assistance as the funds of the Society will admit of.

III. In addition to the Officers named in the Act of incorporation, six Stewards shall be elected, who shall co-operate with the Committee in all celebrations to be held by the Society; also a Marshal and Standard Bearers shall be appointed by the President.

IV. The Officers of the Society shall be elected as follows: any member may nominate a Candidate for each office, in succession; and in the event of more than one nomination for any one office the decision shall be by ballot.

V. The President and Vice-Presidents shall not be eligible for re-election to the offices respectively filled by them for the next succeeding year.

VI. The Annual General Meeting of the Society shall be holden on the third Friday, in January in each year. In each year there shall be holden four Quarterly General Meetings, viz: 1st. The Annual General Meeting, and one each on the first Friday of the months of April, July, and October. Monthly Ordinary Meetings shall be held on the first Friday of each month

throughout the year, excepting in January, April, July, and October, as otherwise provided.

VII. Any gentlemen desirous of joining the Society shall, at a General or Ordinary Meeting, be proposed and seconded by members, and may be elected by a majority of such meeting, on payment of first year's subscription.

VIII. The Annual Subscriptions of Members shall be Two Dollars. The subscription year shall be from 1st January to 31st December. Any new Member elected between the 1st of January and 30th of September, shall pay the full subscription for the current year; any elected on or after 1st October, may be admitted on paying for the current quarter only.

IX. A subscription [of \$10 shall be a life-subscription, and the same, together with all donations of \$10 and upwards, unless such donations are made for a specific purpose, shall be invested by the Managing Committee, and form a portion of the permanent fund, the interest on which shall be applied to the charitable purposes and ordinary expenditure of the Society. No ordinary member shall be eligible to life membership until he has paid all arrears of subscription as such ordinary member.

X. The Annual Meeting shall order the investment of such proportion of the surplus fund as may appear desirable, and in such manner as may be then determined, and the annual subscriptions, with the interest of investments shall constitute the ordinary funds applicable to the charitable purposes and ordinary expenses of the Society.

XI. The Treasurer shall be authorized to advance to a distressed individual a sum not exceeding two dollars, upon the written recommendation of the President or either of the Vice-Presidents, or of any member of the Managing Committee by them appointed to grant such relief; provided always, that such recommendation does not involve the payment of more

than two dollars to any one person or family. In cases demanding more than the ordinary relief thus afforded, the same shall be referred for further enquiry and action to the Managing Committee as hereinafter set forth.

XII. The Managing Committee shall meet weekly, and any five members thereof shall form a quorum. It shall be their business to direct the affairs of the Society generally, under this Constitution; to determine all matters referred to them by the Society, and to prepare for each Annual Meeting a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year, to be submitted previous to the election of Officers.

XII. The Managing Committee may make loans (not exceeding twenty dollars to one person or family (from the ordinary funds of the Society, to persons in temporary distress or trouble, upon receiving such reasonable security as they may deem expedient, provided the period of such loans does not exceed six months. It shall have power to grant extended relief, in particular cases at discretion, the orders upon the Treasurer being in all such cases signed by two or more of the Members of the Committee.

XIV. The Committee assisted by the Stewards shall arrange for the Annual Celebration of St. George's Day, and report such arrangements at the Monthly Meeting in March. No expense of any celebration or social entertainment whatever, shall be charged against the funds of the Society.

XV. The President (or in his absence, the Senior Vice-President,) shall direct the Secretary to convene a Special General Meeting of the Society, upon requisition (stating the purpose thereof) from any five members, and the Secretary shall call a Special Meeting of the Managing Committee, either by direction of the President (or in his absence the Senior Vice-President) or upon the requisition of any two members of the Committee.

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XVI. The chair shall be taken thirty minutes precisely after the hour appointed for meeting, and if there be not then a quorum of at least ten members present, the meeting shall be forthwith adjourned.

XVII. Any member in arrear of subscription for two years may be considered as having withdrawn from the Society; and his name shall be erased from the list of members, after due notice being given him. No member shall be entitled to vote at the annual election of Officers or at any subsequent meeting, neither shall he be eligible for election to any office of the Society, if he shall not have paid his previous year's subscription.

XVIII. The annual subscription shall be considered due and payable in advance, on or before the 23rd day of April in every year.

XIX. The duty of the President shall be, to preside and preserve order at all the meetings of the Society, and to protect and further its interests to the best of his ability. In his absence the Senior Vice President present shall exercise the authority and duty of the President. In case of the absence of the first four officers from any meeting, the members present shall be empowered to elect a Chairman out of their number.

XX. The Secretary shall have charge of the Seal, Banners, and other Insignia of the Society. He shall keep a fair register of all proceedings, orders, rules, and regulations, and manage the correspondence. He shall, when applied to, and on payment of such fees as may be determined on by the Committee, issue certificates of admission to each member (on his having signed the Constitution,) to which he shall affix the Seal of the Society. He shall, when necessary, summon the Society to its various meetings, and shall sign such cards of Invitation to all Celebrations as may be required of him by the Committee and Stewards. He shall also, at all meetings of the Society

and of the Managing Committee, enter into the respective Minute Books the names of the members present at such meetings.

XXI. The Treasurer shall have the custody of the funds. He shall countersign such certificates of admission as may be issued by the Secretary. His accounts shall be fairly kept, and exhibited to the President and the Managing Committee, whenever called for, and shall also be laid before the Society at its January meeting. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to open an account with such one of the Chartered Banks in the City as may be approved of by the President and Managing Committee of the Society, and there deposit the securities of the Society in the joint names of the President and of himself; and when directed by the Committee, all funds belonging to the Society, and paid to the Treasurer, shall be deposited in such Bank.

XXII. All vacancies in the offices of the Society, happening in the interim between two succeeding Annual Meetings may be filled by election in the usual way at the Quarterly Meeting next after the same shall have occurred.

XXIII. To preserve order, and to expedite the business of the Society, any member who may have proposals to make, or observations to offer upon any propositions, shall rise and address the President; and no person shall interrupt another when speaking, if the speaker be in order.

XXIV. The introduction of political or religious subjects, or their discussion shall never be allowed at any meeting of the Society.

XXV. The members of this Society shall faithfully observe and conform to all the rules and regulations that shall be made by the Society, and entered in the books thereof, on pain of being dismissed from it, and having their names erased from the list of members.

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XXVI. If the majority of all the members present at any General Meeting shall vote for the expulsion of a member, his name shall be erased; and he shall never afterwards be admitted to any meeting of the Society, unless again elected by ballot as in the first instance; provided always, that no proposition for the expulsion of a member shall be in order, unless one month's notice has been given of an intention to submit it at the then next ensuing Quarterly Meeting.

XXVII. The Banners and Flags of the Society shall not be used except on occasions when the Society as a body takes part in the proceedings, or where the Society is represented by its officers.

XXVIII. At any Quarterly or Annual Meeting the members present may, on one month's notice previously given, elect any one of its members an honorary life member, in consideration of services rendered the Society; and also may elect any distinguished person eligible to become a member, in like manner for services rendered either to the Society or the country, and such honorary member shall be entitled to all the privileges of an ordinary member.

XXIX. An Obituary Record shall be kept by the Secretary of any member of this Society who may hereafter die, stating his birth and parentage, if known, date of admission as a member, his position, general character, and such other facts in regard to him as may be interesting to chronicle. Such record to be published with the Annual Reports.
