### Port de Grave Notes

The Sunday Schools of Port de  
Grave and Barened have recent-  
ly been re-organized. The  
Canadian system has been intro-  
duced by the Incumbent, Rev. D.  
R. Bailey, B. A., who took a course  
in Sunday School work while train-  
ing in Canada. The results here  
have been most gratifying. The  
system is as follows:—Each child is  
provided with a quarterly leaflet,  
containing graded lessons, senior,  
Junior and Primary. Each lesson  
consists of two parts, viz: Prayer  
Book Lesson and Bible Lesson.  
The Bible Lesson for this year is  
the "Acts of the Apostles," of which  
an outline is given for children.  
Besides the Quarterly Leaflet  
there is a special book for teach-  
ers. This book, which is called  
"The Teachers Assistant," is re-  
vised monthly and lessons are pre-  
pared for the three different grades.

The teachers of Port de Grave  
and Barened, numbering 26, have  
organized themselves into a  
"Teachers Guild" and the Incum-  
bent meets them once a week,  
when the following procedure of  
business is gone through:—The  
lesson for the coming Sunday is ex-  
plained by chairman, which serves  
two purposes, viz: that of a Bible  
Class for teachers, and preparation  
of lessons for classes. Then follow  
comments, questions, minutes, etc.  
It has been decided that this Guild  
adopt a badge with the letters C.  
E. T. G. (Church of England  
Teachers' Guild) on it, and that  
each member be entitled to wear  
one. In order to create interest  
in the Sunday School a committee  
is formed for each class. The  
duties of the class committee are  
varying, such as reporting attend-  
ance, new scholars, collection, look-  
ing up sick and absent, etc. The  
system is adaptable to ages vary-  
ing from 4 to 18, and the fact that  
there has been an increase of al-  
most 26 per cent. in our schools,  
shows the interest taken and there-  
by ensures success.

A concert in aid of the Sunday  
Schools was recently held here, at  
which over fifty dollars were realiz-  
ed. The C. E. T. G. has now \$30  
in the bank and all expenses paid  
for the coming year.

### Barened also held a pancake social on Shrove Tuesday at which \$15 were realized. Eight dollars of this were sent to the "Cot Fund."

After the system is well organ-  
ized the Incumbent proposes form-  
ing a "Sunday School Teachers'  
Training Class." This class will  
take examinations and receive  
diplomas from the Board of the S.  
S. Committee in Canada, when  
they will then not only be qualified  
to act as teachers in case of absent-  
ees but will fall in line when  
vacancies occur.

The fact that the Editor of this  
system is Canon Powell, one of the  
most prominent men in Canada  
and is acknowledged to be a suc-  
cessful one, adds to this, however,  
are the improvements which have been  
made in this system during the  
past four years. The teachers  
here will now be in a position to  
partly make up for the training  
and instruction received by those  
who have the privilege of attend-

### Orangemen Are in Session Delegates at Coley's Point

A large number of delegates to  
the annual session of the Provincial  
Grand Black Chapter of Newfound-  
land, Royal Black Knights of  
Ireland, and to the annual session  
of the Provincial Grand Lodge of  
the Orange Order for Newfound-  
land, which is taking place at  
Coley's Point this week, arrived  
here by the noon train on Tuesday,  
March 21st.

They were met at the railway  
station by the officers, members

berg Lodge, and after lining up two  
deep proceeded to the Orange Hall  
at Coley's Point, the band playing  
several appropriate selections en  
route.

The Provincial Grand Black  
Chapter of Nfld. opened its 7th  
annual session at 7:30 o'clock  
Tuesday evening, Grand Master  
Sir R. A. Russell presiding. The  
Grand Black Chapter continued  
in session until 2 p.m. Wednesday,  
when it finished its deliberations.

The Provincial Grand Lodge of  
the Orange Order for Newfound-  
land opened its session on Wed-  
nesday evening, March 22nd, at 7  
o'clock, in the Orange Hall at  
Coley's Point, Hon. R. A. Squires,  
Grand Master, presiding. Reports  
of the various officers were present-  
ed.

Thursday morning at 11 o'clock  
the Grand Lodge officers and  
delegates with a number of local  
brethren attended Divine Service  
in St. John the Evangelist Church,  
Coley's Point, when the Deacon in  
Charge, Rev. E. Hunt, delivered a  
very thoughtful, impressive and  
patriotic sermon, basing his remarks  
on the 8th verse of the 13th  
chapter of Hebrews, "Jesus Christ,  
the same yesterday, today and  
forever."

In the course of the sermon the  
preacher extended a welcome to  
the officers, members and delegates  
of the Grand Lodge on behalf of  
the congregation of Coley's Point.  
The Grand Lodge resumed its  
regular business at 2 o'clock Thurs-  
day afternoon, and at 7:30 o'clock  
Thursday night a Patriotic meet-  
ing was held in the Orange Hall,

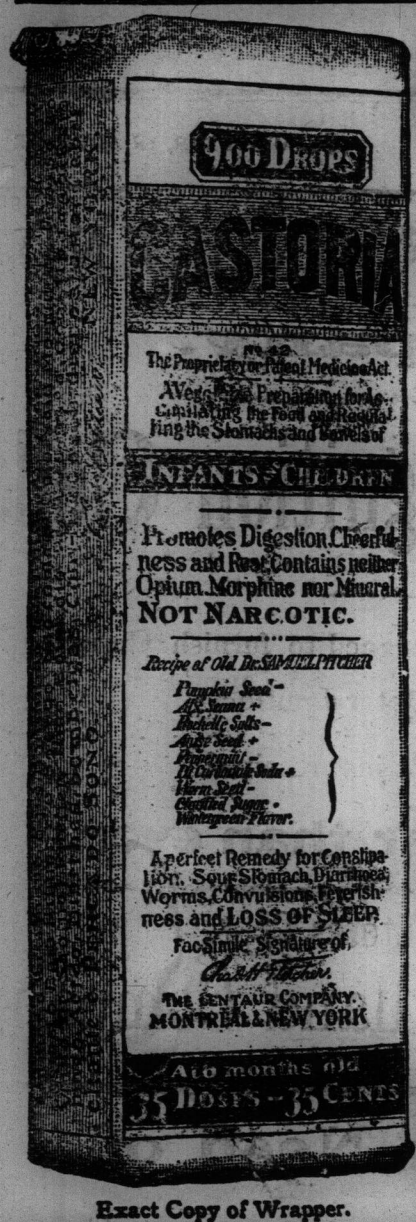

Governor's Speech

Mr. President and Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council; Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Honourable House of Assembly:

Since the last session of the Legislature the terrible struggle between the warring nations of Europe has continued to rage with unabated violence. The splendid traditions of the fighting forces of the Empire have been admirably upheld, and, in conjunction with our Allies, substantial progress has been made towards achieving the result which is inspiring us all, the conclusion of a peace that will preserve the liberties of the world and the advancement of the nations along the pathways of enlightened civilization.

The contingents from this country for military and naval service have, I am proud to say, conducted themselves with such gallantry and devotion to duty as to have won the highest praise from the responsible authorities, and the enthusiastic response made during the past year to the appeals for further recruits is, I am glad to say, likely to be continued on a similar scale during the present year.

At the beginning it was hoped and expected that the War would be short and the end attained without exceptional demands upon the manhood or resources of the Mother Country and the Overseas Dominions. Instead of that, however, the conflict is proving one which threatens the very existence of the British Empire and of the nations associated with her in the effort to maintain civil liberty and the rights of free states.

Unexampled calls have been made on the Mother Land and the other portions of the Empire, and they have been nobly met. A measure of compulsory enlistment has been enforced in the British Isles; Canada, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa have undertaken obligations proportionately great; and I have every confidence in the new invasion now being addressed to the young men of the Colony to do their part in the fighting line and to the rest of our people to organize what is required from those who remain at home, that there will be a response that will keep Newfoundland where she was at the outset, in the very first rank in proportion to her population and resources.

The industrial operations of our people during the past year have been attended with highly satisfactory results. The high prices obtained for the staple products of the fisheries, forests and mines have enabled the working classes to enjoy a high degree of prosperity. This is all the more gratifying when we remember how the economic interests of every country have been disturbed by the far-reaching effects of the War, and we have surely cause for thankfulness that here in Newfoundland we have suffered so little.

One of the lessons which this War has taught the people of the British Empire is the desirability of promoting inter-imperial trade, and we may not unreasonably hope that one of the results will be a very great increase in the demands for the products of our fisheries, and that the development of our forest and mineral resources will be even more actively undertaken than heretofore.

Bills will be submitted to you for the consolidation of the laws of the Colony, a work last undertaken twenty-five years ago; for bringing up to date the Education Law; for bringing the law with regard to Weights and Measures into conformity with the standards existing in other countries; and to provide for the Municipal Government of the town of St. John's, as well as other measures.

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Honourable House of Assembly: The accounts for the past fiscal year, and the Estimates for the coming year, will be submitted to you in due course, and I am sure that you will make suitable provision for the requirements of the Public Service, with special reference to the increased obligations which the War will impose on the Colony. You will be glad to know that there is a very substantial increase in the revenue from all sources, encouraging the hope that, at the end of the fiscal year in June next, our receipts will suffice to meet the expenditure on current account. It is now apparent that the decrease in revenue for the last fiscal year of \$720,000 was largely due to the reduction in imports consequent on the uncertainties as to trade development during the first year of the War; but we may reasonably assume, seeing there has been such a marked recovery the present year, that there is no longer any reason to fear a return to the conditions of twelve months ago. On the contrary, we may hope, as the months pass and the outlook for the Allied cause grows brighter, that this condition will re-

fect itself in still larger imports and more enhanced prosperity.

Mr. President and Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council; Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Honourable House of Assembly:

In accordance with the Act passed at the last session of the Legislature providing for the prohibition of the importation and manufacture and sale of alcoholic liquors, an election was held in November last resulting in the number of votes polled in the affirmative being a majority of the total number of votes on the register, as required under the Statute. Under these circumstances a Proclamation called for by the Statute will issue at an early date, prohibiting the importation, manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors into or in this Colony at any time after the first day of January, 1917, except as provided for in the said Act.

I commend the duties of the session to your assiduous care and pray that the guidance of Divine Providence may attend you. The sentiments of profound loyalty expressed by the Colony and the practical manifestations of patriotism which have supported the same since the beginning of the war will, I feel sure, stimulate you all to the zealous performance of the session's tasks.

Growing Carrots, etc.

The Chantony is one of the best carrots for table use. For a winter cabbage the Danish Ball-head is one of the best, and for early the Early Jersey Wakefield or Copenhagen Market. The plants of early varieties should be started in a hot bed to have the plants well advanced before setting out. The ground should be heavily manured. Cabbage would succeed in partial shade if there was an abundance of moisture and abundance of plant food in soil, but one seldom gets these conditions in shade. Soldiers Raided Pastor's Residence

Berlin, Ont., March 5.—The home of Rev. C. R. When the soldiers requested the reverend gentleman to put on his hat and overcoat and accompany them off his premises. The soldier, however, opened the door, which had been closed and locked during the preliminary conversation, took Rev. Mr. Tappert out of the house, and amid the singing of patriotic songs and cheering, he was taken along Alma, Benton, King and Queen Streets to the barracks.

An effort was made by the soldiers to induce their captive to sing the National Anthem, but he declined. The officers of the battalion were informed of the excitement and, immediately on reaching the men's quarters, dismissed the soldiers, and Capt. Fraser and Deputy escorted the Lutheran minister to his home. He was not seriously injured, but suffered considerably from the cold.

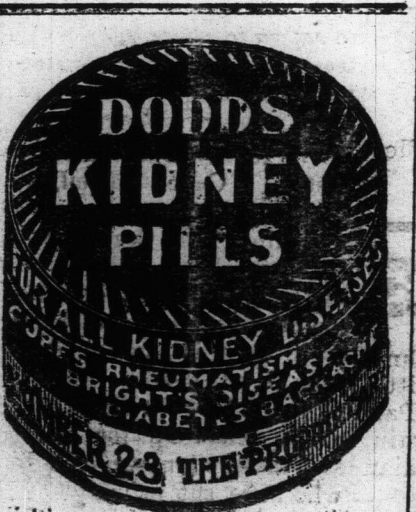
Rev. Mr. Tappert was on duty at the services in St. Matthew's Church this morning, but merely made a passing reference to his experience of last night. He conducted confirmation services. These services are usually held at Easter, but owing to his proposed removal from the city they were held earlier.

The reverend gentleman submitted his resignation to his congregation last Wednesday evening, which was accepted, and he delivered his farewell sermon to-night. The soldiers had been given to understand that he had agreed to leave Berlin by Marsh St. and the long deferred raid was accordingly pulled off last night. Contrary to expectations, the evening service was conducted entirely in German, with the sole exception of one solo. Judging from his very expressive gestures, Rev. Mr. Tappert delivered an impassioned sermon. The soldiers who attended the service gave no outward expression of their disapproval.

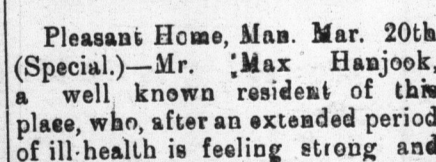

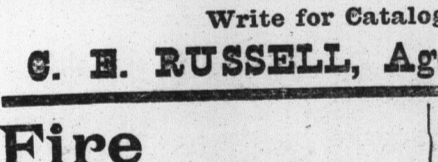
