CRISIS IN RUMANIA HAS BEEN AVERTED

GERMANS CAPTURED IN WHALEBOAT NEAR THE FIJI ISLANDS

The Men Had Come from the German Raider Seadler

London, Oct. 8.—An exchange telegraph company's dispatch from Melbourne, says it is reported there, that a whaleboat with a crew of Germans from the raider Seadler, has been captured in the region of the Fiji islands. The boat contained a gun, and machine guns, the crew, 25, and the Germans admitted they had been detailed from the Seadler to make raids.

The presence of two German sea raiders in the south seas, was made known in dispatches from London, to the navy department last week. Both vessels were said to have been manned by the crew of the Seadler. Several merchantmen are reported to have been sunk.

But Hamilton Colonel Will Take Job If Requested

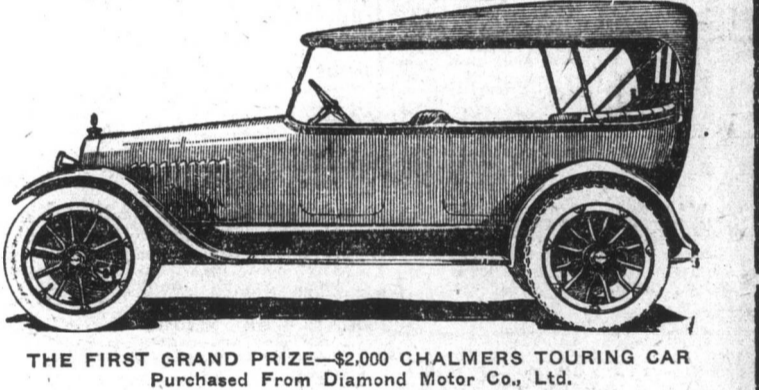

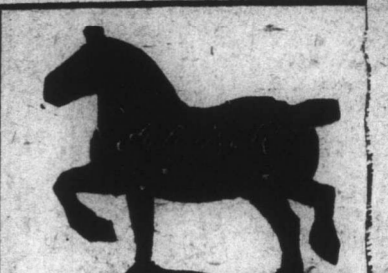

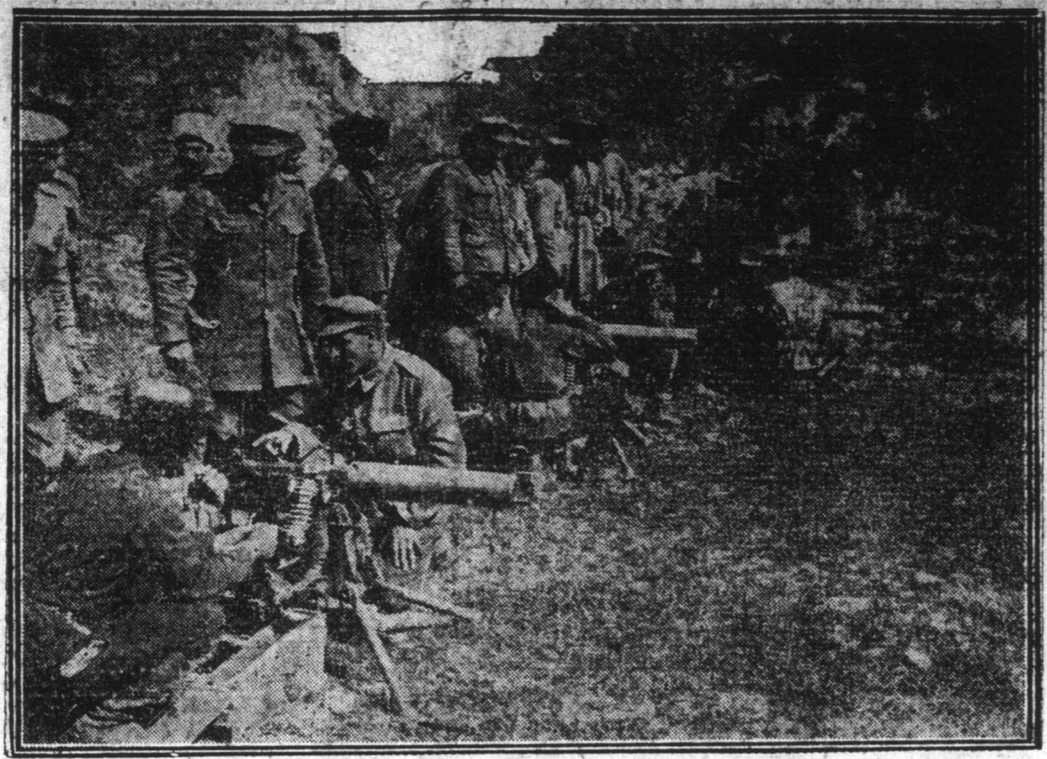
