STANDING RULES
FOR THE
CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT
OF THE
Newfoundland Church Society.

NAME.

1.—The name of this Society shall be "THE NEW-FOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

OBJECTS.

2.—The objects of this Society shall be, (1) to contribute towards the maintenance of the Clergy and Licensed Lay-Readers, (2) to assist in the erection, enlargement, or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, or School Rooms, and in the purchase of Land for Glebe or other Church purposes, (3) to provide for sale a supply of Bibles, Prayer-Books, School-Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts, (4) to assist in creating and sustaining a Special Fund for the Endowment and Support of the Theological College in St. John's, and (5) to create and maintain a separate Fund for assisting the Widows and Children of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese.

MEMBERS.

3.—The Members of this Society shall be, (1) all persons who shall have paid to their Clergyman or the Treasurer the two preceding years the annual

sum of ten shillings for the objects of the Society; and (2) all Clergymen who shall have officiated in Newfoundland or Labrador the two preceding years with the Bishop's license.

4.—All Members shall have power to vote at the annual and other general meetings.

OFFICERS.

5.—The Officers of this Society shall be (1) the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, President; (2) the Venerable the Archdeacon and the Rural Deans, Vice-Presidents; (3) a Treasurer; and (4) a Secretary; the last two to be chosen by the members of the Society at the annual general meeting; but in case of resignation of office, or removal, of either Secretary or Treasurer, during the interval between two Annual Meetings, the Committee shall appoint a person to act in either case, until the next Annual Meeting.

MANAGERS.

6.—The Committee of Management shall consist of the officers of the Society, and certain Lay-Members, elected as Representatives in each of the Deaneries; viz., four elected by Members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Bonavista Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Notre-Dame Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by Members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay.

7.—The election of Representatives shall be as follows:—On some day in Easter Week, in the year 1859, and in every succeeding fourth year, a Meeting of the Members resident in each mission shall be convened by the Clergyman in charge at some convenient hour and place, of which notice shall be given (with the Bishop's consent) in each Church in the

Mission, on some Sunday in the previous month; at which Meeting the Clergyman or in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the Members shall preside, and the Members present shall vote *seriatim* for the proscribed number of Representatives.

8.—When the voting (which may be continued, if necessary six hours, but not longer) is completed, the presiding Officer in each Mission shall report the result to the Rural Dean, and the persons who have obtained a majority of votes in the Deanery, shall be elected Representatives; provided that every person to be a member of the Committee must be a Communicant of the Church of England.

9.—The Rural Dean shall report the result of the election in his Deanery to the Secretary in St. John's, the first convenient opportunity.

10.—The new Representatives shall be convened by the Secretary at the Michaelmas Quarterly Meeting; until which time the former Representatives shall continue in office.

11.—As often as it shall become necessary, from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, disqualification, or refusal to serve, of any of the Representatives, to appoint another or others in their place, a special meeting of the Members, in the Deanery where the vacancy has arisen, shall (as soon as the Rural Dean, or, in his absence, the Clergyman next senior in standing in the Diocese may in his discretion appoint) be convened in like manner as the Easter meeting, when the required Representative or Representatives shall in like manner be elected.

12.—The President, or a Vice-President, and six other Members of the Committee shall be competent to manage the business at every meeting duly convened.

13.—All Clergymen of the Diocese holding the Bishop's license, shall be *ex-officio* honorary Members of the Committee with the right of speaking, but not, with the exception of the Officers, of voting at its Meetings.

TRUSTEE:

14.—The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Trustee of this Society, and shall have power to let or to take houses or lands, and to receive all rents and interest of monies as the same shall fall due, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer for the time being, taking his receipt, and handing it over to the Committee.

GENERAL MEETINGS:

15.—An Annual General Meeting of the members and friends of the Society shall be holden in St. John's on the second Thursday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint. The Secretary shall give notice to each of the Clergymen in St. John's who shall publish it (with the Bishop's consent) in his Church on the previous Sunday.

16.—At the annual general meeting a report on the state of the Society, with the Treasurer's accounts duly audited, shall be submitted by the Committee, to be printed, or otherwise, as shall be then and there determined by the members.

17.—A special general meeting may be convened at any time, (1) by the President; (2) by a Vice-President and six members of the Committee; or (3) by any twelve members of the Society whose payments are not in arrear; provided notice of such meeting be duly given as in the case of annual general meetings.

18.—The Chairman shall not vote at any general meeting, except in the case of an equality of votes.

COLLECTIONS.

19.—It is expected that a Collection for the various objects of the Society will be made every year by every Clergyman in the Diocese, from every head of a family and every adult member of the Church in his Mission, assisted if need be by his Church-wardens and other respectable Members of his congregation.

20.—Every Clergyman shall transmit to the Secretary a list of the Contributors to the objects of the Society in his Mission, with the amount of their several payments, and to the Treasurer one-fourth at least of his whole collections on or before the last day in every year, or as soon after as practicable.

N.B.—This Rule does not apply to the Clergy of St. John's, who shall send in the whole of their Collections to the Treasurer.

21.—All Clergymen who have collected as far as possible from every head of a family, and from every adult Member of the Church in their Missions, towards the objects of the Society, for the two years immediately preceding, and who have remitted to the Treasurer one-fourth of the whole Collections, shall be entitled to assistance from the funds of the Society towards any of its objects in their own Mission; provided that no Clergyman shall make a collection for his own maintenance separate from, or independent of the general collections; and that pew-rents and assessments be not considered as part of the said collection or collections.

GRANTS.

22.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the Funds, by making grants towards the objects of the Society under the recommendation and sanction of the President.

23.—No Clergyman declining or neglecting to collect for the Society, or to transmit a list of the con-

tributors, and their payments, and a fourth-part of his collection (as directed in Rule 20) shall be entitled to receive any grants from the Society, for himself, or for any of the objects of the Society, in his Mission; provided that where a Collection has been duly made, and the list with the fourth part of the collections transmitted for the two previous years by his predecessor, any Clergyman newly in charge may, before sending his annual collections, ask and receive for any of the objects of the Society, excepting only his own maintenance.

24.—It shall be competent to the Committee to make grants in the usual manner to any Mission, in connection with the Society, which supports its own Clergyman; and any such Mission shall be held to be in connection with the Society whose Clergyman subscribes ten shillings, and makes a collection in his Mission, annually towards the general funds of the Society.

25.—If a Clergyman leave his Mission before the time for sending in his annual collection, the Committee shall have power, on the recommendation of the President, to grant him a sum which shall appear equitable.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

26.—In the absence of the President, the Archdeacon, or, in his absence, the Senior Vice-President shall take the Chair at all meetings of the Committee or Members, and shall have a casting vote.

27.—The Treasurer shall receive all monies forwarded to him for the objects of the Society, and shall pay or disburse the same as determined by the Committee, and shall furnish to the President and Committee a statement of accounts up to the day appointed for auditing the same.

28.—No money shall be paid or disbursed by the Treasurer except on a written order, specifying the

amount to be paid, and its object; which order must be signed by the Chairman of the Committee at which the grant was made, or in his absence, by the Senior Officer of the Society in St. John's.

29.—The Committee shall meet for the despatch of business in St. John's, on the first Thursday after every quarter day, at 2 o'clock, P.M.

30.—A special meeting of the Committee may be convened at any time, either (1) by the President, or (2) by two Vice-Presidents, or (3) by any five Members of the Committee; provided due notice of such meeting with its objects be given the day before to all the other Members of the Committee in St. John's.

31.—At a special meeting to be holden seven days before the annual meeting, the Committee shall appoint two of their number to examine the Treasurer's Accounts up to that season, which accounts examined, approved, and signed by the Auditors as correct, shall be submitted to the Committee to be by them incorporated in or appended to the next yearly Report and so presented to the members at the next annual general meeting.

32.—The Committee shall fix the salary of the Secretary, and shall provide for all the contingent expenses of the Committee and the Society.

DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

33.—The Secretary shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee and Members, and shall arrange the business, and record minutes of the same to be signed by the Chairman. He shall prepare the Annual Report, and superintend the printing of the same; shall conduct the correspondence with the Clergy and others on behalf of the Committee; and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books, receipts and papers belonging to the Society.

PRAYERS.

34.—All meetings of the Society, or of the Committee, shall be opened and closed with the prayers used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or others provided for the purpose by the Bishop of the Diocese.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

35.—These Rules may be altered, repealed or added to by the Members assembled at any general meeting; provided the proposed alteration has been stated in writing by any person intending to propose it to the Secretary at least a month before for the information of the President and Committee, and that assent has been given to it by the President and a majority of the whole Committee convened for its consideration; and provided also, that it shall be competent to the President to propose any alteration to a general meeting, notwithstanding such alteration may not have received the assent of the Committee.

NEW DEANERIES.

36.—New Deaneries created by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be allowed to elect Representatives; provided that in every Deanery there shall be at least two resident Clergymen, and ten Churches and Congregations.

SECURITIES.

37.—At each annual meeting there shall be appointed three members of this Society who shall be requested to examine all securities belonging to the general funds of this Society, or belonging, or appertaining to the Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund, or to any other fund over which the Society has, or shall have control, and to report in writing to the President, or, in his absence, to the Senior Vice-President in St. John's, their opinion upon the sufficiency or insufficiency of the same, and if necessary a special

meeting of the Committee shall be convened to consider such report, and to take such action upon it as shall be deemed requisite.

38.—All Title Deeds, Mortgages and other Securities belonging to the Society, or over which it has control, shall be deposited and preserved in a suitable muniment box to be provided by the President for the time being, at the expense of the Society, and to be always kept in his charge for the use of the Society.

NOTE.—While it is expected that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

PROCEEDINGS

At the Twenty-eighth Anniversary of the *Newfoundland Church Society*, adjourned from Thursday, July 1, and holden at St. John's in the Cathedral Sunday School Building on Tuesday, July 6, 1869. The chair was taken at a quarter before eight P. M., by His Excellency Governor MUSGRAVE, supported and assisted by the Right Reverend the LORD BISHOP of the Diocese, President, and the LORD BISHOP Coadjutor.

After prayer, which was said by the Rev'd. G. M. JOHNSON, Secretary, the business of the evening commenced with the reading of the Report and the Treasurer's Accounts, after which the following Resolutions were proposed, seconded, and carried unanimously:—

1st.—Moved by Hon. ATTORNEY GENERAL, seconded by H. LEMESSURIE, Esq:—

That the Report now read be adopted, and printed with the Treasurer's accounts.

2nd.—Moved by Rev G. HUTCHINSON, seconded by Rev. E. COLLEY:—

That this meeting desires to acknowledge with humble and hearty thankfulness the great goodness of Almighty God in prospering the endeavours of the Church Society during the past year.

3rd.—Moved by Hon. Judge ROBINSON, seconded by W. H. MARE, Esq., and supported by Rev. E. BOTWOOD:—

That this meeting receives with special satisfaction the intelligence of the formation and permanent establishment of a fund for the endowment of the Theological College in this Diocese.

4th.—Moved by EWEN STABB, Esq., seconded by J. H. WARREN, Esq. :—

That the thanks of this meeting be given to the Officers and Committee for their management of the affairs of this Society since the last annual meeting; and that W. H. MAKE, Esq., be Treasurer, and the Rev. G. M. JOHNSON, Secretary, for the ensuing year. Also, that EDWIN DUDER, Esq., THOMAS CLIFT, Esq., and A. O. HAYWARD, Esq., be appointed to perform the duties indicated by the 37th standing rule.

5th.—Moved by Rev. T. M. WOOD, seconded by the Lord Bishop Coadjutor :—

That the best thanks of this meeting be respectfully tendered to His Excellency the Governor for his kindness in presiding over the business of the evening.

Notice was given by the Hon. ATTORNEY GENERAL of the following alterations in the rules of the Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund to be moved at the next Annual Meeting :—

RULE 8.—The Widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid his Annual Subscription, and forwarded an Annual Collection till his death, or till incapacitated by mental or bodily infirmity shall be entitled to receive a yearly pension of Fifty pounds currency, during Widowhood.

RULE 9.—If the state of the Fund should at any time not warrant the continuance of the Pension as directed by Rule 8, the amount of the said Pension may be reduced so far as may be absolutely necessary.

REPORT FOR 1868-9.

It will perhaps be remembered by some of the friends of the Newfoundland Church Society assembled on the present occasion how much satisfaction was expressed by several speakers at the last anniversary, and especially by His Excellency the GOVERNOR from the chair, at the state of prosperity in which the funds of the Society were then declared to be, after a season of so great depression, as that through which the community in general, not only in St. John's but all other parts of the island, had lately passed.

Your Committee are thankful to be able to declare that the Church Society continues to prosper under the blessing of ALMIGHTY GOD, neither is it doubted that the cause of GOD'S Church, to the furtherance of which, as to its temporal interests, their endeavors are always directed, will ever be the object of His providential care, or that, albeit perhaps amid trials from time to time of various kinds and degrees, His favor will still be vouchsafed.

Your Committee proceed at once to a statement of the amount of contributions received by them and of their administration. The total sum of the various collections of the St. John's and Out-harbor Clergy reaches £799 3s. 6d. against £909 6s. 0d. contributed in the same way last year. The deficiency may be accounted for by the falling off in the amount of collections from the congregations of St. Thomas' and St. Mary's in this town. The Cathe-

dral collection has this year not quite reached the amount contributed last year, so far as the regular subscribers list is regarded. Many members of our Church have during the past year left the country involving the loss of some considerable subscriptions, while on the other hand the names of nearly 40 persons have been added to the list whose payments altogether amount to upwards of £20. The Secretary has been also very successful among the crews of the sealing steamers whose contributions amounted, from the *Nimrod*, *Lion*, *Martin*, and *Hawk*, to £76 5s. 0d., so that the collection made the Cathedral Clergy not only does not fall short but actually exceeds that of last year and most previous years. Of this sum the Secretary has paid to the Clergy of the adjoining Out-harbors, from which many of the men came, £33 7s. 6d.; deducting the fourth only of these collections as due to the Church Society. The profit to the Church Society from this collection has been £34 10s. 0d. from St. John's, and £8 7s. 6d. from the Out-harbors.

Your Committee rejoice in the incorporation among the supporters of the Church Society this year of the Mission of Bay Roberts, while at the same time they regret the absence from its accounts of the names of the Missions of King's Cove, Exploits, and White Bay. They trust however, that this is temporary and accidental only inasmuch as, though the Secretary has written to the Clergy of the two former places, no explanation has been yet received. Two years collections have been received since the last meeting from New Harbor, and it is hoped the Missions now omitted will be found similarly placed next year. The omission of the Mission of Exploits is the more remarkable inasmuch as the first moiety of a considerable grant, made some time back, has been lately paid towards the new Parsonage being erected at Exploits, Burnt Island for the comfort of the Clergyman.

It will thus be seen from comparing the expenditure of the past with that of the previous year that the expenses of the Society have been £104 11s. 7d. larger, while the income, as has been already shown, has been £110 2s. 6d. less than that of 1867. The meeting will be prepared from this to learn that the balance of £347 17s. 3d. with which the accounts of the year 1868 began has been diminished at the present date to £242 5s. 3d. It is evident therefore that unless the funds of this Society are liberally maintained its grants must be necessarily curtailed. It is evident also that this Society is only limited in the promotion of the various objects contemplated in its rules by the means thus placed by her members at the disposal of our

Church. It is surely also further evident that all who refuse to contribute according to their several ability to the funds of this Institution incur the responsibility of hindering the Society in its endeavor to spread the ministrations of religion in those outlying and destitute settlements which need the help of their brethren more largely blessed with the means of grace.

CLERGY WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

This fund still continues to prosper and increase. During the year now closed the following sums have been added to the amount reported last year, viz.: Clergy payments £303 9s. 7d. Collections £68 5s. 7d. Donations £9 4s. 6d. Interest on money invested £146 6s. 8d. making the total income for the year £331 6s. 3d.: against which is to be placed the sum of £80 paid to meet the pensions with which the fund is chargeable as granted to Mrs. MORETON and Mrs. MEEK. This fund now possesses capital as follows:—£1000 Water Company Stock at 5 per cent. £650 loaned at 5 per cent., £600 at 6 per cent., and £1093 16s. 8d. lying in the Commercial Bank at 3 per cent., in all £3343 16s. 8d. For the sum deposited in the Bank your Committee are looking out for a permanent investment of a safe character at a higher rate of interest, but have not yet succeeded in meeting with any they have deemed suitable. Your Committee have lately heard with much concern of the death of the Rev. JOHN MARSHALL of Belleoram, by which event the people of that settlement have been deprived of the valued services of a tried and faithful Clergyman whose ministrations among them have extended over a period of more than twenty years, during the whole of which time he was never absent for a longer season than was necessary for attendance upon the Bishop's visitations. Mr. MARSHALL had been long in feeble health but was seized with the attack which speedily terminated his life while en-

gaged in one of the public services of the Church; his last act having been the baptism in Church of one of the little ones of the flock. Mrs. MARSHALL, with whom all present we are assured will sympathize, has a claim upon our Pension fund, thus making a third widow in the course of the eleven years that have elapsed since its first establishment.

BOOK DEPOSITORY.

Your Committee regret to have to report a falling off in the amount of sales this year of one third as compared with any of the previous four or five years. It is believed that the last year has been one of unparalleled depression in business of all kinds in this town, which is the only explanation that can be offered. It could not of course but be expected, since the case is such, that our Book Depository would feel the prevailing dulness of trade, and your Committee can only express the hope that it may also share in the revival of business which they trust will be the result this year of the good success which has attended the sealing voyage, and promises to be realized in the summer fishery. The usual stock of Books &c., is well maintained.

ENDOWMENT FUND.

Your Committee rejoice at being able to report considerable progress since last year in the establishment of this important Fund, which has now reached the amount of about £6,000 Stg. derived from the following sources as nearly as can be stated at the present time, viz. :—

Very nearly the whole of this sum has been invested by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, acting as Trustees for the College, in the manner mentioned in the last report. Your Committee hope after this statement that they are not premature in declaring the permanence of the College from henceforth secured. About £125 Cy. still remains in the Commercial Bank, and about £70 or £80 are also due on account of subscriptions promised here.

No regular voyage or journey of visitation has been undertaken by the Bishop since last year, but his Lordship in the latter part of last summer spent some weeks at Harbor Ereton in Fortune Bay, during which he visited the neighboring settlements, in several of which Candidates were presented to him, and a considerable number were Confirmed. No other Episcopal service was asked or performed at that time, but within the last month the Bishop proceeded to Brigus, where he had been invited for the consecration of a comely and well built Church in the adjacent settlement of Burnt Head, which service was duly performed with the assistance of the neighboring Clergy and the Rev. Messrs. HUTCHINSON and PILOT, in the presence of a numerous congregation.

At the last meeting of the Committee of the Church Society a grant was made towards the purchase of a building at Upper Gullies on the South Shore of Conception Bay, newly built, and hitherto used as a Wesleyan Chapel, which it is proposed as soon as the

purchase has been completed to consecrate as a Church to be used for the benefit of the inhabitants not of Upper Gullies only, but of Seal Cove and Lance Cove adjacent; within easy access of all which populous settlements it is conveniently situated.

The Coadjutor Bishop has been absent from this Colony during the past winter in Bermuda, which has thus benefited by the presence of a Bishop when this privilege could not otherwise have been enjoyed. His Lordship is at present in Nova Scotia, but may be expected very shortly in a new vessel which has been built there for his visitation duties, the outfit of which he has spent a short time in superintending on his way here from Bermuda.

Your Committee are thankful to be able to report the establishment of a new Mission upon the Cape shore, having the now important settlement of Tilt Cove for its centre, by which the Missionary at Exploits, Burnt Island has been relieved of a portion of his too unwieldy charge. The Rev. Mr. LOCKWARD, ordained in September last, has taken up his abode at Tilt Cove, where he has been favorably received. Your Committee rejoice to be able to say that this Mission has been undertaken not only without any grant from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, but also without any call upon the funds of this Society, and they are pleased to be able to add that through Mr. BENNETT's influence, and with means which he is understood to have provided, a Church is now being erected in Tilt Cove, for the benefit of the now numerous population working in the valuable copper mine of that place.

Two Ordinations have taken place in the Cathedral since our last years meeting, by which four deacons, Messrs. NETTEN, LOCKWARD, SMITH, and BISHOP, have been added to the number of the Clergy. At the Trinity Sunday Ordination the Rev. R. T. DOBIE of

Forteau, Labrador, was also advanced to the higher order of Priesthood. The Rev. ARTHUR WOOD from Pictou, Nova Scotia, has also been nominated Stipendiary Curate of St. Thomas' Church in this town, thus adding five to the Clergy list of last year. On the other hand the Rev. Mr. MARSHALL has been removed by death, as already stated, and the Rev. Messrs. MILNER and CHAMBERLAIN have left the Diocese.— The office of Rural Dean of Conception Bay, vacant by the retirement of the Rev. M. BLACKMORE, has been filled up by the appointment of Rev. J. C. HARVEY of Port-de-Grave as the Senior Clergyman, collated by the Bishop on the petition of his brother Clergy, in that Deanery. While speaking of the changes that have occurred lately among the Clergy, your Committee cannot omit mention and grateful acknowledgment of the consideration and liberality of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, as manifested towards this Diocese, in their promise to continue, till the end of the year 1870, all the stipends hitherto paid for the maintenance of the Clergy; a boon the greatness of which will be understood when it is known that the sum amounted last year to no less than £4785 0s. 0d. Nor would it be right to pass over or neglect to acknowledge thankfully the addition by the sister Society (the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge) to the many acts of munificence for which the Church in this Colony is already indebted of the grant already spoken of in this report of £500 Stg. towards the Theological Collego Endowment Fund.

Your Committee mention with great regret the prospect of the removal of His Excellency the Governor, who ever since his arrival in this Colony has held the office of Patron of this Society. His Excellency has not only held this honorary office in relation to the Church Society, but has also been a constant and liberal contributor to its funds, and above all has been ever ready to promote by his personal interest in our proceedings, (evidenced, as in other ways, by his unfailing attendance at our annual meetings in the chair,) to the utmost of his power; the prosperity of this Society. Nor has the Church Society only been the object of his support, but, the other charitable Institutions connected with our Church have also been assisted by him in the same liberal and hearty manner. Your Committee refrain from adding more upon this subject from respect to His Excellency's expected presence in the chair, as they much regret to add, for the last time. At the same time that they give utterance to these expressions of regret at the removal of Governor MUSGRAVE, they also desire to congratulate His Excellency on the fresh token he has received of the confidence of his Sovereign in his appointment to the Government of the important Colony of British Columbia and Vancouver's Island. They desire to assure him that he will carry with him their best wishes for himself and for his family, and their humble prayers to GOD for his success in the discharge of the duties of the office which has been committed to him.

ON Monday July 26, 1869, the Right Reverend the President and the Officers and Committee of the Newfoundland Church Society waited on his Excellency the Governor by appointment, and presented the following Address:—

*To His Excellency STEPHEN JOHN HILL, Esq'r.,
C. B., Governor and Commander in-
Chief, in and over the Island of New-
foundland and its Dependencies, &c. &c.*

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY:—

The Officers and Committee of the Newfoundland Church Society beg leave to approach Your Excellency to express their respectful and hearty congratulations on your safe arrival in this Colony as the Representative of Her Majesty the Queen, and for the exercise of the high office of Governor of this ancient and loyal Dependency of the British Crown.

We come before you as the Governing body of a Society, the nature and purpose of which Your Excellency has been informed by a copy of the last printed Report, containing the Rules and Regulations, and we shall only detain Your Excellency while we state briefly that this Society has obtained, year by year, continued and uninterrupted favor and support among the members of the Church of England—that it has enjoyed the patronage of all former Governors of this Colony, especially of your own immediate Predecessor—that its agency has been largely blessed of GOD in extending the benefits of religion along the coasts Newfoundland and Labrador, and that it may be re-

garded as the association through the instrumentality of which, in connection with the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, the ministrations of our Church are to be dispensed to her numerous and scattered children within the wide limits of Your Excellency's Government—there being in this Colony no endowments or local rates for this sacred and all-important purpose.

We trust Your Excellency will be pleased to accord to us Your countenance and support, and to allow us to add your name to the list of former Governors, as Patron of this Society; and in conclusion we beg to assure you that our humble prayers shall not be wanting for God's abundant blessing on you in your administration of your high trust, that it may tend to the promotion of the best interests of all Her Majesty's subjects placed under your Excellency's care.

STANDING RULES

OF THE

Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

1.—THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY'S Special Fund, for assisting the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen of the Diocese of Newfoundland, shall consist of all monies paid to the Treasurer of the Society for that object.

2.—The Committee of the Church Society shall have the management of the Fund.

3.—Every Hundred Pounds of available surplus shall be invested by the Committee as opportunities occur. Smaller sums shall be deposited every quarter in the Saving's Bank.

4.—All Clergymen in the Diocese holding the Bishop's license may secure the benefit of this Fund by contributing within six months from the time of obtaining their License from the Bishop as follows:—
(1) Unmarried Clergymen and Widowers without a child, one pound (£1) per annum: (2) Married Clergymen (and such as shall afterwards become married,) and Widowers with a child, two pounds (£2) per annum.

5.—Annual subscriptions shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January in each year:—provided that Clergymen on entry shall for that year pay only

a rateable proportion of the annual subscription up to first day of January following. Thirty days grace shall be allowed; but every Clergyman, neglecting to make payment within that time, shall forfeit his claim upon the Fund, to be recovered only upon payment of arrears, with ten per cent thereon, before the following first day of January.

6.—Any Clergyman neglecting to subscribe according to Rule 4, or to pay his annual subscription within the time limited by Rule 5, may, if the Committee see fit to admit or re-admit him, secure the benefit of the Fund by the payment of two pounds ten shillings (£2 10) if married or a widower with a child; and one pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) if unmarried or a widower without a child, from the day on which the last annual subscription he paid was due, or from the date of his being licensed by the Bishop, and from the date of such admission, or re-admission, he shall come under the operation of Rule 4.

7.—Every Clergyman securing the benefit of this Fund will be required to make a yearly collection for the same in his Mission, and to forward the amount with his own annual subscription to the Treasurer.

8.—The Widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid his annual subscription, and forwarded an annual collection, till his death, or till incapacitated by mental or bodily infirmity, shall be entitled to receive a yearly Pension of thirty pounds (£30) currency, during widowhood.

9.—If the Fund should at any time permit, the Committee may increase the amount of Pension to any sum not exceeding £50; such an addition, however, being subject to be withdrawn wholly or in part, should the state of the Fund not warrant its continuance.

10.—If the Widow die or marry again, the Pension shall be paid to Trustees for the benefit of such Children of the deceased husband, as may be, if boys, under sixteen, if girls, under eighteen years of age.

11.—The Trustees named by a deceased Clergyman, in the event of the death or marriage of his Widow, shall be recognized by the Committee in paying the Pension for the benefit of the child or children; but if the Trustees so named are unwilling or unable to act, the Bishop of the Diocese shall act as Trustee in the application of the Pension.

12.—If the wife die before her husband, his child or children shall receive the Pension, so long as there is a claimant under Rule ten.

13.—The Pensions shall be paid half-yearly by the Bishop's order on the Treasurer on the first of January and first of July. The first payment to be calculated for the interval from the husband's death to the day of payment.

14.—If a Clergyman, having joined the fund after the 24th June, 1863, removes from the Diocese after having served less than fourteen years, his connection with the fund shall cease, and he shall be entitled to receive back half the amount of the annual subscriptions he has paid. If he removes after having served fourteen years and less than twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of six pounds, or nine pounds if residing within the tropics; or he may receive back half his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. If he removes after having served twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of five pounds, or seven pounds ten shillings if residing within the tropics; or

he may receive back three-fourths of his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. All Clergymen in connection with the Fund previous to the 24th June, 1863, to be governed by the original Rule 14 thereof.

15.—A yearly statement of the Treasurer's accounts with this Fund shall be published with the Society's Report.

16.—None of the above Rules shall be altered, or repealed, except at a general meeting of the Church Society, and after a full years notice to the members of the proposed change.

“The following is the original Rule 14, governing Clergymen in connection with the Fund before June 24, 1863.

14.—If a Clergyman removes, with the Bishop's consent, from the Diocese, after officiating in it not less than seven years, he shall be allowed his claim upon the Fund, on the payment of an annual subscription of three pounds (£3); or, if he desire it, may receive back half the amount he has paid; which repayment shall release the Fund from all his claims upon it.”
