EPOCHS.

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ECLIPSES.

During this year there will be four Eclipses, three of the Sun and one of the Moon.

I. On the 10th of January there will be an Annular Eclipse of the Sun, but it will not be visible in America.

II. On the 7th of July there will again be an Annular Eclipse of the Sun, but this also will not be visible here.

III. On the 17th of December there will be a partial Eclipse of the Moon very early in the morning, visible about one-fifth of the Moon's disc. At Montreal it will begin at 33 minutes past 2, and end at 15 minutes past 4. At Toronto it will begin at 9 minutes past 2, and end at 51 minutes past 3.

IV. On the 31st day of December there will be a total Eclipse of the Sun, but only partial in this country. On that day the Sun will rise eclipsed about 6 digits. To those who delight in such phenomena, this eclipse will afford much, although brief, pleasure.

Until May 11th Venus will be Morning Star, and then Evening Star the rest of the year. Until August 27th Mars will be Evening Star, then Morning Star the rest of the year. Until February 10th Jupiter will be Morning Star, then Evening until August 30th, then Morning the rest of the year. Until February 24th Saturn will be Morning Star, then Evening Star until September 5th. The transit of Mercury over the Sun's disc, which occurs on the 12th of November, will not be visible in America. On the 12th of May Mars will be eclipsed by the moon for one hour, between 7.30 and 8.30. Mercury may be seen in the West soon after sunset about February 24th, June 22nd, October 17th; and in the East just before sunrise about April 15th, August 13th and Dec. 2nd.

REGULATIONS AND RATES.

Letter Rates.—Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Province pass, if prepaid, for 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. but if posted unpaid are charged 7 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

On letters to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward's Island the rate is 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., with optional pre-payment.

The rate on letters to the United Kingdom will be,

By Canadian Packet $12\frac{1}{2}$ cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce.

" Cunard " 17 " "

Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on arrival in England.

Letters for British Colonies and possessions, beyond sea, and for Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid.

The rate on Letters for the United States, (except California and Oregon,) 10 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

“ “ for California and Oregon 15 “ “

“ “ British Columbia, 15 cents, to be prepaid.

The rate on Letters for the following destination, per Canadian Ocean Steamers, is 23 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and must be prepaid :—

Africa (West Coast of), Australia, (including all the Colonies embraced in this general name) Buenos Ayres, Cape of Good Hope, Ceylon, China, Egypt, Gibraltar, Gold Coast, Hayti, Hong Kong, India, Liberia, Malta, Mouritius, Monte Vides, Natal, New Zealand, Penang, St. Helena, Singapore, Sierra Leone, Spain, Tasmania, West Indies (British.)

For the principal German States the rate is 29 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

For France and Algeria, 17 cents per $\frac{1}{4}$ oz.

On Letters to the above destinations forwarded by the Cunard Line of Steamers, an additional charge of 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. becomes necessary.

Registration Charges.—For the Registration of a Letter addressed to any place in British North America the charge is 2 cents.

For the Registration of a Letter to United Kingdom 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ c.

“ “ “ “ United States 5c.

Miscellaneous Charges—The charge on Parcels by Parcel Post to any place in Canada is 25 cents per lb., (with 5 cents additional if registered.)

One cent per oz., payable in advance by postage stamp, is the rate on Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Hand Bills, and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office addressed to any place in Canada, British North America generally, or the United States.

The charge upon Books, &c., by Book Post to England is 7 cents on packets not exceeding 4 oz. in weight ; 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents on $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. packets ; and 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents additional for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. These charges must be prepaid.

Book Post with France—For a packet of Printed Matter, or single Newspaper, Book, &c., not over 2 oz., 4 cents.
Do. exceeding 2 oz., and not over 4 oz., 8 “

Newspapers and Periodicals.—Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication addressed to any place in Canada at the following rates, if paid quarterly in advance, by either the publisher at the Post Office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office :

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either Publisher or Subscriber, such papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

Transient Newspapers.—Transient Newspapers, that is to say Canadian Newspapers, posted otherwise than from the Office of Publication, and American or British Papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid 1 cent each, by Postage Stamp, or they cannot be forwarded ; except only *British Newspapers* distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers and News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mail.

Newspapers by Mail from England or United States.—Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.)

United States Newspapers, brought by Mail into Canada, are charged 1 cent each on delivery.

Periodical Publications.—The rate on Periodical Publications is, if not exceeding three ounces in weight, 1 cent ; over 3 ounces, 4 cents.

If prepaid by Postage Stamps from the Office of Publication, Periodicals, *published in Canada*, weighing over 3 ounces, may pass for 2 cents each.

Periodicals, *printed in this Province*, other than Newspapers when specially devoted to the education of youth, (both religious and general,) to Agriculture, to Temperance or to any branch of science, and addressed directly from the Office of Publication to be transmitted to any Post Office in this Province, are exempt from charge.

Transient Periodicals.—Including Canadian Periodicals not prepaid the commuted rate from the Office of Publication, nor exempted by the preceding clause, and all other Periodical Publications posted in this Province must be prepaid by Postage Stamps, the full rate, at the time of posting.

Periodicals received in the Mails from the United States are charged with the rates named in the first clause of this section.

Postage Stamps.—Postage Stamps of the respective values of 1 cent, for Newspapers : 5 cents for ordinary Provincial Letters ; 10 cents for United States rate ; 12½ cents for Canadian Packet, and 17 cents for Cunard Packet, are provided for sale to the Public.

Letter Envelopes impressed with Medallion Stamp, and equivalent to the pre-payment of Postage to the amount of 5 and 10 cents respectively are furnished for sale to the public at the following rates :—

The 5 cent Envelope, at the rate of \$5.50 per 100 or 66 cents per dozen. The 10 cent Envelope, at \$10.50 per 100, or \$1.26 cents per dozen.

Penal Clause.—The Act contains the following penal clause :

To inclose a letter, or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a Parcel posted for the Parcel Post, shall be a misdemeanor.

To inclose a letter or any writing, or make any written marks to serve the purpose of a letter, or to inclose any other thing in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers, (except in the case of accounts and receipts of Newspaper Publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers), shall be a misdemeanor.

The Orders are drawn in Sterling, the Commission chargeable, being for £2 and under, 1 shilling sterling ; from £2 to £5, two shillings. No order can be drawn for more than £5 ; but any number of Orders of £5 each may be procured.

To convert Sterling into Currency.—To the given sum add one-fifth of itself, and one-twelfth of that one-fifth.

Currency into Sterling.—Multiply by 60, and divide by 73.

This Court is composed of the Judges of the Superior Courts of Law and Equity, and has jurisdiction in Appeal from the Courts of Chancery, Queen's Bench and Common Pleas. It sits three times a year, namely, on the second Thursday after each Term, except Trinity Term.

One of the Judges sits in Chambers every day, (except during the regular vacations) for the purpose of hearing sundry applications.

Deputy Clerks of the Crown.—The Clerks of the county Courts will be ex-officio Deputy Clerks of the Crown and Pleas of their several counties as the present incumbents vacate by death or otherwise.

Law Terms.—Hilary begins first Monday in February. Easter begins 3rd Monday in May. Trinity begins Monday next after 21st August. Michaelmas begins 3rd Monday in November. Each Term ends Saturday of the ensuing week. Long vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

CIRCUITS.

There are six Circuits, viz: The Eastern, held at Brockville, Perth, Ottawa, L'Original and Cornwall; the Midland, held at Picton, Belleville, Cobourg, Peterborough, Whitby and Kingston; the Home, held at Owen Sound, Hamilton, Niagara, Merritsville, Milton and Barrie; the Oxford, held at Guelph, Berlin, Stratford, Cayuga, Woodstock, Brantford and Simcoe; the Western, held at Goderich, London, St. Thomas, Chatham, Sandwich and Sarnia; the Toronto or Home Sitzings, at Toronto.

HEIR AND DEVISEE COURT.

Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favour of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. Sitzings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. Clerk of Commissioners, W. B. Heward.

COUNTY COURTS.

Presided over by resident Judge in each county; these Courts possess equity powers.

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Chairman, the county Judge in each county, who, with one or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in his county four times a year for trials by jury in cases of larceny, misdemeanor and other offences. Sitzings, second Tuesday in March, June, September and December with power of adjournment.

RECORDER'S COURT.

In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton and Kingston, the Recorder's Court takes the place of the county Sessions, the Justices for counties having no jurisdiction in the Cities—the care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen and Police Magistrate of each. The City Sessions are held on the first Monday in January, April, July and November.

DIVISION COURTS.

For the summary disposal of cases by the County Judges. Courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Courts of Quarter Sessions. The Jurisdiction of these Courts has been enlarged by the Act of 18 Vic., cap. 125.

INSOLVENT DEBTOR'S COURT.

The County Judge in each county presides.

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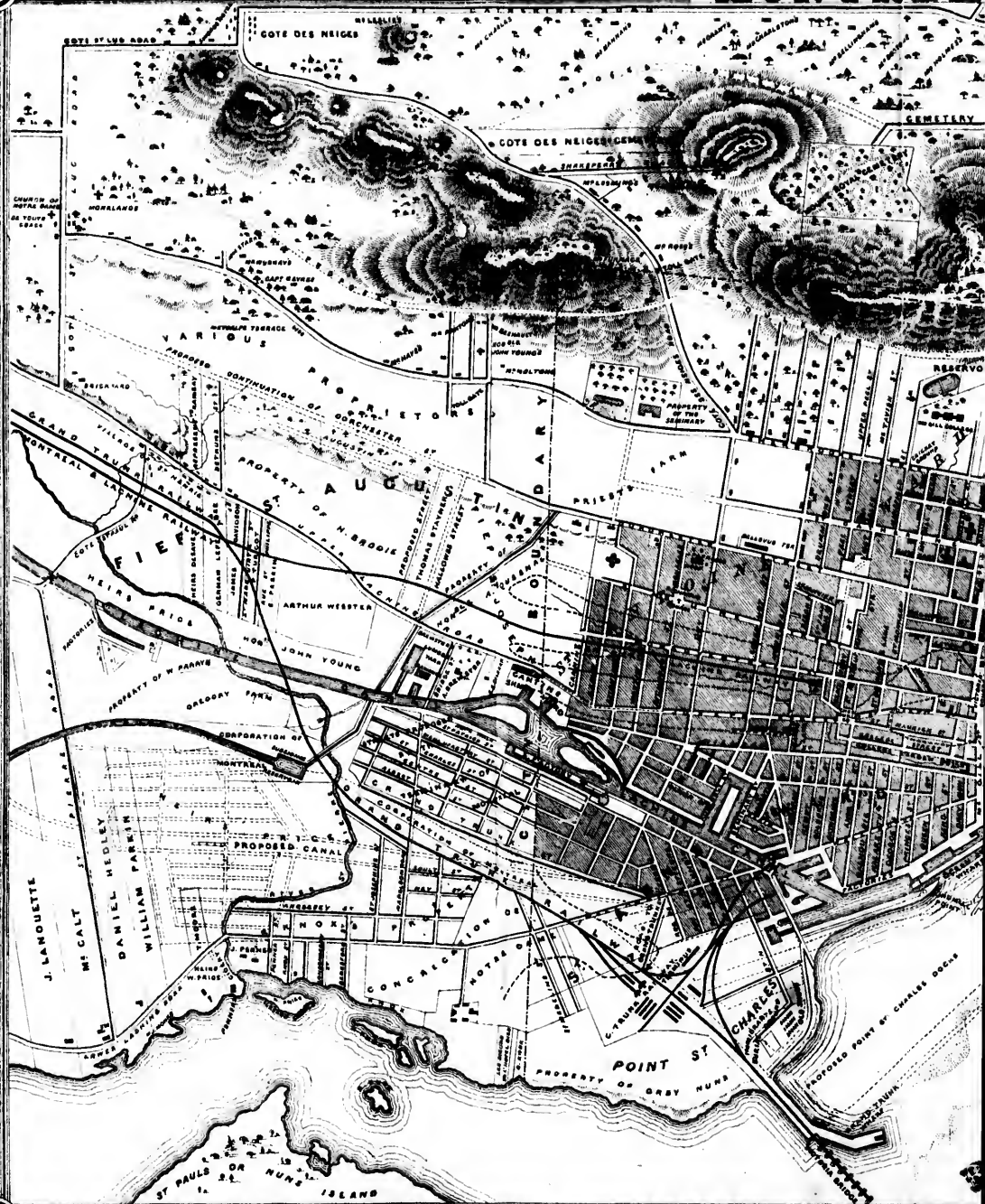

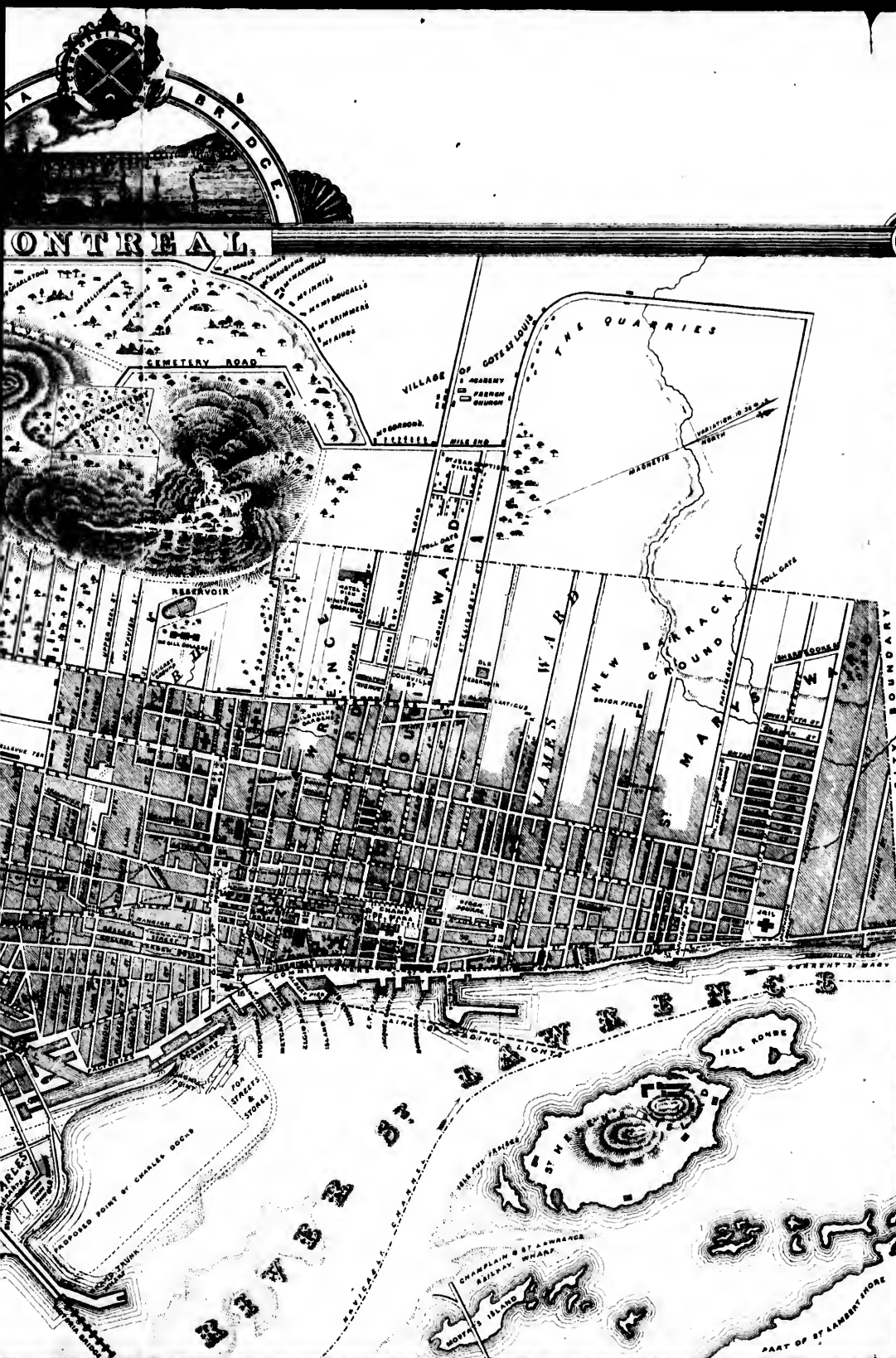
