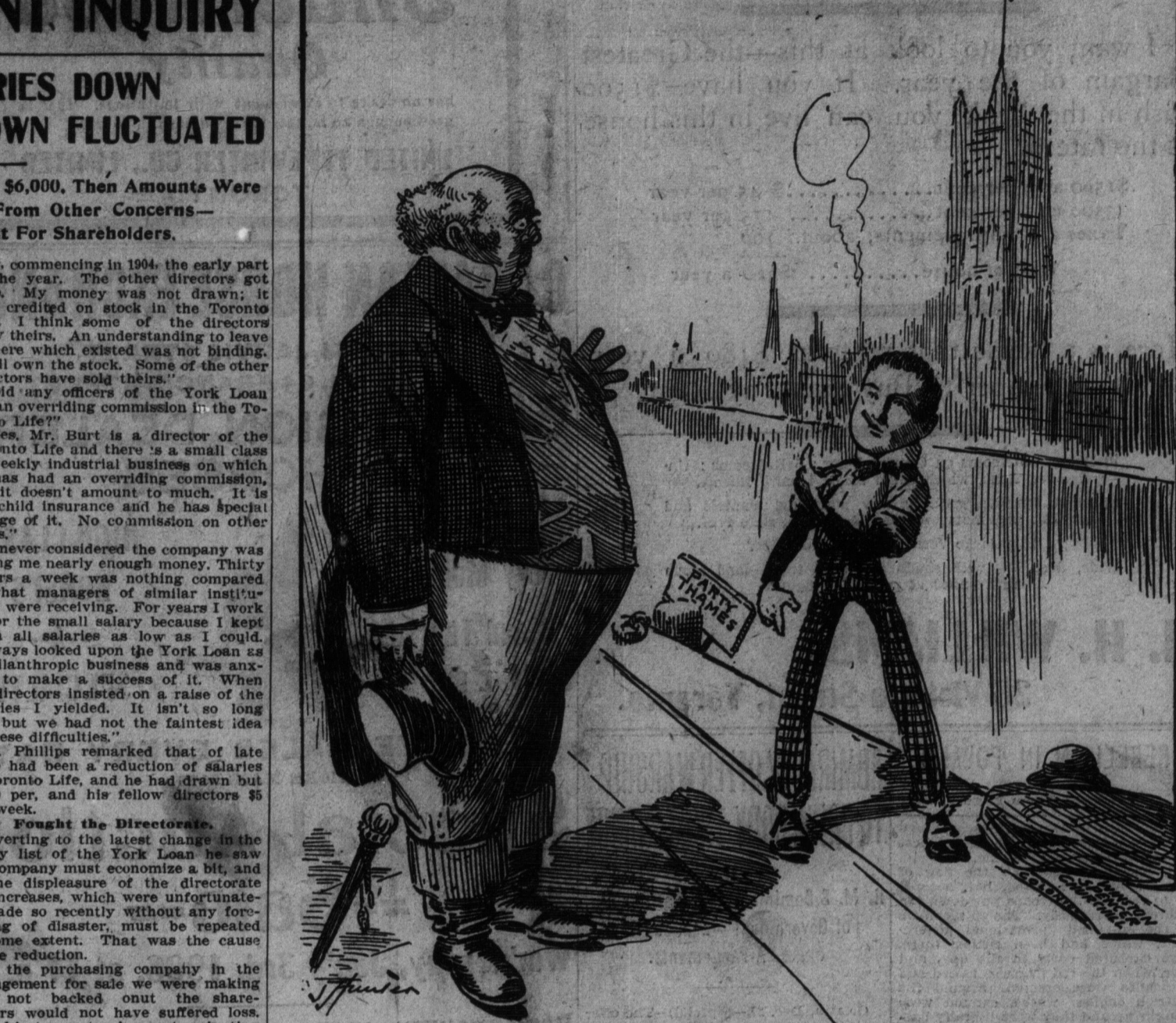

30 OR 40 SMALLPOX CASES MAY BE TORONTO'S SHARE

Incoming Holiday Traffic Will Likely Result in Spread of Disease.

"There will probably be an outbreak of from 30 to 40 cases of smallpox in Toronto following holiday week." This was the somewhat disturbing statement made by Dr. Sheard yesterday.

The doctor said further that the number of local smallpox patients might run considerably beyond that named; in fact Toronto would be rather lucky to escape with that showing.

There has been an immense influx of people for the holidays, as railway officials can bear testimony. During the present week the people will continue to come and go, and there will continue to be a constant mingling of folks from the smallpox infested districts outside. Dr. Sheard has compared the situation to that of a "hot house" given the traveling public, but there has been apparently no case taken.

"With the prevalence of smallpox outside, I don't see any other result," said the doctor in commenting on his remark as to what was to befall. He had found 80 cases in Melancthon alone, he said.

Incidentally the doctor remarked that he himself gets vaccinated perhaps a score of times a year.
