

BYE-LAWS
OF THE
INCORPORATED
DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

1st. At all the meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of this Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-laws, or any proposition be adopted by the Society or the Executive Committee thereof to which his dissent shall be expressed, until the same shall have been submitted to the next Annual general meeting of the Society, and if such alteration or proposition be again adopted at such other meeting, it shall then take effect, notwithstanding such dissent.

4th. The very Rev. the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be ex. officio, Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to eight. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer.

5th. All members of the Church are invited to unite with the Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop, and all Lay-members of the Church of England subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arrear. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

6th. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and the Treasurer of the

Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as hereafter provided; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the local Committees, according to the ninth By-Law.

7th. An Annual Meeting of the Society, open to all its members shall be held at Halifax in the month of October, or at such time as the Executive Committee shall appoint; at which meeting the vacancies in the Executive Committee shall be filled up, the Secretaries and Treasurers shall be elected, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

8th. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of July, August and September; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or in his absence, by a Vice President.

9th. The members of the Church in every part of the Province, are invited to co-operate with the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing any one member of the Society to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society; but when the Local Committees desire it, they shall receive Books at cost and charges, to the amount of one-fourth of their remittance, or the said one-fourth may be placed in the hands of the Endowment Sub-Committee, for the benefit of the Parish or Mission where the money was contributed.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision, to be appointed by the

Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee; and, lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.

- 6.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.
- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society, to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants of their own neighbourhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. At each Annual Meeting of the Society, the first five on the Executive Committee shall go out of office, but all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members shall be first proposed and seconded, then elected by ballot and placed at the bottom of the list.

14th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at a General Meeting of the Incorporated Society; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected

REPORT.

THE Executive Committee of D. C. S. present to the Society the 30th Annual Report of the manner in which they have discharged the trust committed to their care. They cannot but regret that so far as the financial interests of the Society are involved their Report is less encouraging than usual. The Funds at their disposal have materially suffered from the general depression which has of late affected the Province. The Committee have, however, been enabled to meet the claims upon the Society for missionary purposes during 1867, but they have not been able to give much assistance in furthering the other objects recognized by the Society. Your Committee, not discouraged, desire to express their trust that Almighty God will still continue to bless the work in which we are engaged, and that the manifest good which this Society is allowed to promote will bring more hearts and hands to unite in the labor.

The Committee regret that there are several clergymen whose incomes are now below \$600 per annum, which they think should be the minimum stipend. In order as far as possible to remedy this, it may be advisable, whenever a change of missionary is made, so to graduate the grants from this Society, as more nearly to equalize the salary of the Clergy receiving aid from the D. C. S.

The Committee beg to state that the work of the Society is much curtailed by the promised, and the necessary *additional* payments to meet the yearly deficit in the Block Sum of S. P. G. They would gladly hear it announced that the Church Endowment Fund is in a position to relieve them from the obligation.

The Committee submit the following statement of receipts and payments, during the year 1867, together with extracts from the minutes of the Executive Committee and the several sub-Committees, tending to shew the mode in which the interests of the Society are attended to.

The Committee have the satisfaction of stating that the proceeds of the Legacy of the late Rev. T. C. Leaver, are now available for general purposes, to the amount of nearly \$200 per annum.

The income for the year 1867 was :

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

The annual general meeting of the Society was held in Halifax, on Tuesday July 2nd, 1867.

The Right Rev. the President took the chair at 2 o'clock P. M., in the National School Room.

The following officers were appointed for the ensuing year. The Rev. E. Gilpin, Secretary and Treasurer, B. G. Gray, Esq., Asst. Secretary, also as new members of the Executive Committee, Messrs. H. Clarke, W. M. Brown, S. P. Fairbanks, Charles Bullock and M. B. Almon, Jr.

It was *Resolved*, that a salary at the rate of \$200 per annum be paid to the Treasurer for the present year.

The following Report from the Church Endowment Committee was submitted and adopted:—

"The Committee desire to report to the annual meeting of D. C. S., that there has been paid in \$57,549 on account of subscriptions and donations—that \$11,361 interest has been realized, making in all \$68,910. Of this sum \$34,872 is invested on mortgage; \$15,500 in Provincial Debentures, and \$16,900 in Deposit Receipts Bank of Nova Scotia.

"That in October last a Circular was addressed to the clergymen of the several parishes, embodying the Resolution of the D.C.S., July 2nd 1866, and calling their early attention to the subscriptions due, and earnestly requesting them to adopt such means as they might deem advisable to obtain the subscriptions, and recommending the appointment in each parish of some confidential person to make the collections who might be allowed Ten per cent. on the amount paid to the Treasurer.

"The Committee hoped that this course would have called forth greater effort in the several parishes, but they regret that the result has not been more satisfactory, \$548.50 only having since been paid in from the country parishes.

"That the Chairman, by request of the Committee in December last, addressed a letter to the Hon. Enos Collins who subscribed £1000 on £10,000, and £1000 on £20,000, being paid in, which he declines to pay for reasons assigned in his letter to the Chairman, which correspondence is submitted.

"There are four vacancies in the Committee—two by death (C. W. H. Harris and J. C. Cogswell) and two who have resigned (P. C. Hill and Brenton Collins.) The Committee regret that they are to lose the services of the Secretary and Treasurer (N. Clarke) who has sent in his resignation,—these vacancies have not been filled up.

"The Committee earnestly hope that the present year may be attended with larger payments of subscriptions, and they will be glad to receive any suggestions from your Society, but they feel the necessity of the clergymen in the several parishes, earnestly impressing upon their people the importance of fulfilling their obligations, whereby the Fund may come up to the amount required to bring it into operation."

All which is respectfully submitted,

The Society then proceeded to fill up the vacancies in the Church Endowment Committee.

The following were appointed, J. M. Jones, Esq., Com. Gen. Graham, W. Gossip, Esq., Henry Pryor, Esq.

It was *Resolved*, "That the W. & O. Committee be instructed to provide a scheme and report to the next annual general meeting by what means greater benefits may be secured to the orphans of Clergymen holding certificates."

Notices of motion for change in the 2nd and 5th Rules of W. and O. were also referred to the W. & O. Committee to report thereon.

In accordance with notice of motion, it was *Resolved*, "That the Church property in any parish, which is actually occupied by the Incumbent of the said parish, be valued by competent valuers upon his taking charge, and be considered at the same value for purposes of salary during his incumbency; and that the valuers be appointed as follows. viz: one by the parish, one by the Executive Committee D. C. S., and another by those two."

Attention having been drawn to the deficit in the Block Sum of S. P. G. now amounting to \$1450 for the year 1867—

It was *Resolved*, "That the Executive Committee be authorized to pay to the Block Sum of S. P. G. \$250, in addition to the £75 stg. already guaranteed for the current year."

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

At a special meeting August 9th, 1867, the sum of \$112.50, being half the amount paid for the passage money of two candidates for orders, returned by S. P. G., was granted to the Rev. P. Brown as an outfit.

The Bishop having informed the Committee that he was about to visit Engla. for the purpose of attending the Council of Anglican Bishops, it was *Resolved*, "That the members of the Executive Committee of D. C. S. fully recognize the importance of the Synod or Council convened by the Archbishop of Canterbury, to consult for the welfare of the Church both at home and in the colonies; and they cannot allow their own Bishop to depart on his sacred mission without bidding him "God speed," with the earnest prayer to Jesus Christ the Great Head of the Church, that He will endue him with wisdom from on high, and sanctify all his endeavors for the glory of God; and they take this opportunity of thanking his lordship for the unremitting attention to the work and welfare of the Society, and expressing the high esteem they entertain for the diligent discharge of his sacred duties, and the wise and faithful teaching and preaching of the Gospel of our Salvation."

Notice of motion was given for uniting the mission of Barrington with that of Tusket.

It was agreed that the Resolution of May 17, 1867, relative to £40 stg. from the Block Sum to Pugwash should be acted upon.

NOVEMBER 15, 1867.—A letter from the Solicitor of the Estate of the late Rev. T. C. Leaver was submitted, stating that the balance of the Legacy in favor of Truro would shortly be paid to the Society, and that the annual interest of the reversion of a Legacy in favor of the Society would in future be at its disposal.

DECEMBER 20, 1867.—An application was presented for leave to draw the grant for a missionary without the fulfillment of the conditions. It was *Resolved*, “That in future similar requests must be accompanied by an application to the same effect from the Wardens and Vestry, shewing the causes which have prevented the people from fulfilling their engagements.”

FEBRUARY 21, 1868.—An application for aid to the missionary at Newport was referred to the Committee on Salaries.

The Auditors reported that the accounts of the Treasurer for 1867 were correct and satisfactory.

Messrs. W. M. Brown and Henry Clarke were appointed Auditors for the year 1868.

It was directed that the request of the Secretary, approved by the Chairman of the Church Endowment Committee be sufficient authority for the Secretary of D. C. S. to affix the seal of the Society.

APRIL 17, 1868.—The annual general meeting of the Society was appointed for Monday, 29th June, at 2 P. M.

The Secretary submitted a statement of the grants of the Society for 1868, equal to about \$4698, and that there was a probability of about \$3400 coming in to meet the claims.

MAY 15, 1868.—A draft of the 30th Annual Report was presented by the Secretary, adopted and ordered to be printed and distributed as usual.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The Sub-Committee have much satisfaction in reporting to the general meeting of the Society, that although the pension to Widows has been much increased, yet they have been enabled not only to meet all claims, but to add somewhat to the Funded Capital. The Committee observe, that while some of the parishes yearly contribute in proportion to their ability, yet in others the interests of the Fund are quite ignored.

* 23RD RULE, S. P. C. K.—“That members be at liberty to apply for books at non-members price, for any purpose; but that no member be at liberty to apply for Books on the terms of the Society except for his own use and distribution, or for sale to the poor, or for the use of charitable institutions with which he is locally or parochially connected; and that a printed copy of this Rule be annexed to the printed form of application for Books.

APPENDIX.

RULES OF THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The following is the 11th object of the Diocesan Church Society :

"It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor."

1st. In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for the object to be called "The Widows' and Orphans' Fund." This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, and other contributions, given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all premiums received under these rules, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this particular object, and no other.

2nd. A standing sub-Committee of seven members shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, (who shall be paid as Secretary of this sub-Committee,) shall be vested the whole management of this Fund.

3rd. The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay, out of this Widows' and Orphans' Fund, the pensions which become due under the following rules.

4th. Every Clergyman of the Church of England within the Diocese wishing to avail himself of the benefits of this fund, shall, within six months from the 10th October, 1855, or within one year from taking orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary for a certificate of pension, and shall pay the annual sum or premium therefor, as hereafter mentioned.

5th. Any applicant, after such period of time, shall only be permitted to receive such certificate at the option of the sub-Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

6th. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable by every clergyman applying for a certificate, according to his age at the date of his first application; it being understood that any parish or congregation contributing to the fund more than £2, then the excess be counted toward payment of the premium of the minister or ministers for that year :

7th. If any clergyman marry the second time he shall pay the annual sum or premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

8th. Upon payment of the first sum or premium, the applicant shall receive a certificate, as hereafter mentioned, and the same sum shall be paid by him, up to the time of his death, on the first day of January in each year.

9th. If any person fail to pay the amount of his premium within forty days after the payment become due, all claim to the pension under his certificate shall be forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become null and void. But if he desire to have his claim to the pension renewed, it shall be in the power of this Committee to readmit him on such terms as they see fit.

10th. Permanent removal of the Clergyman from this Diocese to any place beyond the limits of British North America or the United Kingdom, except with the leave of this Sub-Committee, expressed in writing, or under such conditions as they may impose, forfeits all claim to the pension.

11th. If any Clergyman shall go beyond the limits mentioned in Rule 10th, without the leave of the sub-Committee, he shall forfeit all claim to the pension.

12th. The widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid the annual sum or premium (subject to the above exceptions) shall receive a pension of £25 per annum during widowhood.*

13th. If at any time it is the opinion of the sub-Committee that the state of the funds will safely warrant their doing so, they shall have power to increase the amount of the pensions.

14th. If the widow die or marry again before the expiration of ten years from her husband's death, the child or children of her deceased husband shall receive the pension for the residue of ten years. But no part of the pension shall be received by those children who have arrived at the age of sixteen years, if males, or eighteen years, if females, while those who are still under those respective ages will receive the full amount of the pension.

* The Committee have increased the pension to £50 per annum. †

15th. If the wife die before the husband, his child or children shall, at his death, receive the pension for not more than ten years, under the above limitation of ages.

16th. The pensions shall be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the first day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days which shall happen after the decease of each person holding a certificate, and terminate on the first of those days which shall happen after the death of the widow or child, or the happening of any other event by which, under these rules, such pension is to cease.

17th. The clergy of Prince Edward's Island shall be entitled to participate in the benefit of this fund on equal terms with the Clergy of this Province.

18th. The certificate to be granted shall be in the following form * * * * under the seal of the Society and the signature of the Secretary; and on the back thereof or annexed thereto shall be printed the above Rules.

19th. None of the above Rules and Regulations shall be altered except at a General Meeting of the D. C. S., after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

At the general meeting of the Society, Oct. 4th, 1865—"It was the opinion of the meeting that, for purposes of insurance in the W. and O. Fund, Bermuda should not be considered within the limits of British North America."

SUPERANNUATION FUND RULES.

Extract from the 11th object of the D. C. S.—It shall be one of the objects of the Society to provide * * * * for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the Society's fund shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

No. 1.—In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Superannuation Fund."

This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this object and none other.

No. 2.—A standing sub-Committee of six laymen shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Bishop of the Diocese as chairman, shall be vested the whole management of this fund.

No. 3.—The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay from the proceeds of this fund the pensions which may become due under the following rules.

No. 4.—Any Clergyman of the Church of England within this Diocese wishing to participate in the benefits of this fund, shall make application to the sub-Committee, who shall decide each case upon its own merits, and have power to grant such amount of pension, (not exceeding \$200,) as they think

expedient. But should the sub-Committee refuse to grant the pension, an appeal may be made by the applicant to the Executive Committee of the D.C.S.

No. 5.—No Clergyman admitted from abroad into this Diocese shall receive any benefit from this fund, unless he shall have served for at least seven consecutive years in this Diocese, or shall have paid into this fund a sum to be named by the sub-Committee.

No. 6.—The pension shall be for life, unless circumstances should arise (either from a falling off of the fund or otherwise) which may make a revision necessary.

No. 7.—If the pensioner reside out of this Diocese sufficient proof of his identity shall accompany each draft for his pension.

No. 8.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days that shall happen after the pension is granted, and terminate on the first of those days that shall happen after the death of the pensioner, or the happening of any other event by which such pension is to cease.

No. 9.—If any pensioner shall be so far relieved from his disability as to be able to resume the discharge of Clerical duty, the pension shall be suspended during his relief from such disability.

No. 10.—None of the above rules or regulations shall be altered except at a general meeting of the Diocesan Church Society; after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

ENDOWMENT RULES.

The following Rules for the guidance of the Endowment Sub Committee were adopted by the Standing Committee, May 17th, 1850 :—

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks, or other companies, money invested in mortgages or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Sub-Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the incumbent or resident Missionary, for the time being, of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said incumbent or resident Missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interests or rents arising from such Endowment.

II. The conveyance or trust of such Endowment may be made either to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or to the Church Corporation of the Parish, or to the Diocesan Church Society.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment, it shall be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowment shall be withheld from any incumbent or resident Missionary of any Parish or Mission who may be suspended by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the Churches in his Parish or Mission, during the continuance of such suspension,

V. The Endowment Sub-Committee shall hold any sums contributed toward the endowment of any Parish or Mission, as well as the reserved one-fourth of any contributions that may be made by any Parish or Mission, in trust for such Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable, consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission; and if, in the judgment of the Endowment Sub-Committee, such opportunity or proposition for Endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorise the said one-fourth to be paid to the Parish or Mission so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing rules, or if any other point relative thereto should be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the Standing Committee of the Diocesan Church Society at their next meeting then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Sub-Committee for aid, shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish, or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a resolution of the Local Committee of the Diocesan Church Society in its favor, in such Mission; and shall state the nature, situation, value, and annual profits of the investment desired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be duly registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Sub-Committee to form a correct judgment. All such applications to be made to the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, who is ex-officio Secretary of the Endowment Sub-Committee.

The Endowment Sub-Committee, in a Report to the Executive Committee, dated May 11th, 1863, made the following recommendations:—

“That while no restriction is made as to the sum which a Parish may withdraw from its *“Reserved Fourths,”* and invest as heretofore, yet that \$1000 be the minimum to which they should amount before they can be placed in trust with the Society and the interest be payable to the incumbent.

“With reference to the control of the Society over the *Reserved Fourths*, the Committee state that they have no wish to interfere in any way with the right of the Parishes to manage their own property. They would merely, for the better security of this fund, for the support of the Clergy, recommend—That a Rule be adopted which would require that, when an investment made by any Parish from its *Reserved fourths* may be paid off, the money be returned to this Society to be held under the same Rules, and on the same terms as before, until such time as the Parish may be able to procure another satisfactory investment.”

The first recommendation was adopted by the Executive Committee,—the second is still under consideration.

CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information:—

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.
- 4.—The proposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.
- 6.—That all the sittings are to be free and unappropriated.

It is the wish of the Executive Committee that no Clergyman should, when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Society, without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Society to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made on the following terms, namely: That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished. Grants to Parsonages are made on similar conditions.

"The Endowment Sub-Committee receive and hold any money given in trust to the Society for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given."

"It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that it is the intention of the fifth Bye-Law that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a member, but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."

FORM OF LEGACY.

"I give to the Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia, the sum of _____, to be applied to the general purposes of the Society." And the Receipt of the Treasurer of the Society shall be sufficient discharge for the same.

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Society.

"The Society will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the *Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission*, all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that Parish."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, October 19th, 1855, the following resolution was adopted:—

"That in future all subscription lists received before the 31st March in each year, will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, April 18th, 1856, it was directed:—

"That if reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Society."

☞ The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above resolutions.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, Feb. 19th, 1858, it was
 "Resolved, That in future all applications for aid from this Society be proposed at one meeting of the Society and considered at the next."

At a general meeting of the Society, Nov. 11, 1859, it was

"Resolved, That the Executive Committee be authorized to grant, at their discretion, a sum of money not exceeding £40, towards an outfit for any newly ordained Clergyman of the Church who may require such assistance, previous to his assumption of actual duty in the Province."

"That no person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Society, nor to be elected a member of the Executive Committee, who has not been a Subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting."


