FIRST EDITION. WILL BE A HOT FIGHT.

TARIFF TO COME UP IN THE SENATE MONDAY.

Changes Made by the Finance Committee in Canadian Products—The New Draft Reduction of Irish Duties.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 18.—The tariff fight in the Senate begins on next Monday. It is to be a hot one, for the western Republicans do not like the committee bill as well in some respects as the McKinley bill. The sugar increases will be vigorously opposed, and all the reductions in other schedules which the Finance committee has made and did not get will be brought forward again. The southern Republican representatives are not in favor of the elimination of internal revenue provisions of the bill. The Pennsylvania and Connecticut tobacco growers have caused to join them, Stockbridge, Sawyer and Washburn get the vote on their Canadian while pine down to a dollar, while Black and Fry succeeded in keeping the duty on the same as it was.

The changes are so radical that the committee hope to get a vote by the 15th of July. The time when the bill is to go into effect is the first thing to be settled. A full meeting of the Senate Finance committee was held to-day, at which the chairman, Mr. Morrill, was authorized by a committee party vote, to report the bill with amendments. Mr. Morrill did so soon after the Senate adjourned, and it was not expected that it would be brought up for consideration earlier than a week from Monday next, the date required by Mr. Pim's resolution would be ready probably within four days. The bill was then placed on the calendar. The changes set forth below are from the House bill as it passed:

The House provision fixed an equal retaliatory duty on sugar lumber imported from countries imposing an equal duty on logs, in struck out, and a provision inserted making the duty on sugar in such cases the same as the rate under the McKinley tariff.

Saved duties of cabinet woods—20 per cent on yellow pine, 25 per cent on red pine, 25 cents per pound on sugar. No bounty is to be given for more than 500 pounds sugar per year. Persons who apply for and receive the bounty who are not entitled thereto shall pay a fine not exceeding \$500 or be imprisoned for a period not exceeding five years or both, at the discretion of the court. Sugar between year and year to be paid a duty of three-tenths cent per pound, 16 Dutch standard, 16 cents per pound, instead of four-tenths cent.

The tobacco schedule is unchanged. Dried tobacco—25 cents per bushel (reduced from 35 cents). Dried tobacco—40 cents per bushel (reduced from 50 cents).

The provision allowing a drawback on sugar used in the manufacture of condensed milk is struck out. Cotton—1 cent per pound (reduced from 2 cents).

Dried peas—15 cents per bushel (reduced from 20 cents). Fish not especially enumerated—1 cent per pound (reduced from 2 cents).

Schedules of fax, hemp and jute, and of the three-tenths cent reduction of the following changes: Yarn made of wool—50 per cent, instead of 40 per cent. Yarn made of cotton—50 per cent, instead of 40 per cent. Cotton bagging—valued at 60 cents per yard, instead of 50 cents per yard.

On woolen and worsted yarns, valued at a pound more than 30 cents per pound, the duty to be 25 cents the duty imposed on a pound of unwashed wool of the first class, instead of 20 cents, the duty imposed on a pound of unwashed wool of the second class, instead of 15 cents, the duty imposed on a pound of unwashed wool of the third class.

On blankets, hats and flannels for undershirts, valued at not more than 30 cents per yard, the duty to be 10 per cent, instead of 15 per cent. On the same as that imposed on 15 pounds of wool of the first class, instead of 10 pounds of wool of the second class, instead of 5 pounds of wool of the third class.

On tanning and bottom of which wool or worsted is a component material, the duty to be 60 cents per pound, and 50 per cent at valuation, instead of 70 cents and 60 per cent.

The following manufactures, dutiable at the rates named, are stricken out of the schedule and made free: The schedules relating to the materials of which they are composed. Feet or feet less—10 per cent, instead of 15 per cent. In the free list of belling cloths, especially for military purposes, are further limited by the definition "but not suitable for the manufacture of wearing apparel."

Feathers and down for beds are extended to include all kinds, crude and manufactured. The provision which the product of American fisheries, and fresh or frozen fish, caught in fresh waters except salmon, is made to read "fresh fish caught by the citizens of the United States at the high seas or the open waters of the lakes forming a boundary between the United States and the Dominion of Canada."

The limitation in value to \$500 of wearing apparel and personal effects of persons arriving in the United States, which may be admitted free of duty, is struck out. Works of art, etc., brought by professional artists, lecturers or scientists, for temporary use on exhibition, not for sale and now admitted free of duty for the term of six months, may be retained in the country an additional period of six months in the discretion of the secretary of the treasury.

The Conservatives cheered the result, but their cheers were drowned by the triumphant shouts of the opposition. A division was taken, and the clause was carried by the narrow majority of 163 to 157.

The scheme of the opposition is securing a vote which the Conservatives themselves were specially occupied to suppress the ministerial, who greatly feared defeat.
