BRITISH EVIDENCE. There is abundant British evidence of atrocious German outrages upon women and children in Belgium and France. Thus, to quote some deposiions of our soldiers:

At Basse Ville, in one particular house, we saw an old man by the fireside strangled; an old woman in a bed in a room off the kitchen, who seemed to have been strangled. In an orchard we found a young girl of about fifteen or seventeen; her dress was opened, and a bayonet in her heart. Both breasts had been cut off.

I came into a village called Wytschaete. I went into a house. A voman and two children were in the ouse. They belonged to it. The woman was thirty-five. She said her husband and a son had been killed in action. She said the Uhlans had been to her house, and had taken most of her possessions, including money, and had knocked her furniture about. She and practically every woman in the village had been maltreated.

In a yard I saw the dead bodies of two women, one forty to fifty, the ther about twenty. Their clothes were up above their heads, and the lower parts of their bodies, from the waist down, exposed to view. There vere no wounds on either body, and i ppeared plain to me that the women had died as the result of violence by the Germans, who had just left the place.
