The Louisiana Lottery Case.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 18.—The Comptroller of the Currency and the Postmaster General are still considering the subject of the Louisiana lottery. The briefs filed with the Comptroller in behalf of the opponents of the lottery are to the effect that the national bank to which the lottery packages are now addressed is violating its charter. The point raised by the lottery people is that if the packages are received and entered to the credit of the latter it is a private account which the Government cannot interfere with. The probability is that in view of the legal doubts about this question an attempt will be made to pass a law which will render national banks liable to forfeit their charters if they become agents for lottery companies.

Exhibitors will be received from all parts of the Dominion on equal terms.

Exhibitors will close on the 15th inst., after which none can be received except by special arrangements.

No charge is made for entering exhibits.

Space will be given free in the Buildings and Stalls in the yards.

HAY, STRAW and WATER for Stock will be supplied free.

THE NECESSARY ATTENDANTS on Exhibits in the building or stock in the yard will be admitted free.

EXHIBITORS CAN OBTAIN TICKETS of admission during the Exhibition for One Dollar.

EXHIBITORS SENDING GOODS ON STOCK to the Exhibition from any part of the Dominion will pay the freight to St. John.

On their arrival at the Exhibition and on presentation of freight bills for the amount so paid will be refunded to the exhibitor and a pass given for return fare.

White it is desirable that all exhibits should be in place at the opening on Monday afternoon, those unavoidably detained, and the exhibitors, will be received on Tuesday until 10 a.m.

The Lake Superior Boats.

THE "ATHABASKA" ON THE OCEAN.

The "Athabaska," the first of the iron
steamships built on the Clyde
for the Canadian Pacific Railway, for
service on Lake Superior, is at present
on her way out to this port, and is
expected to arrive at the beginning
of next week. On arrival here she
will be put into Tater's Dry Docks,
and out in two weeks for passage
through the canal in this way.

The steamer will be taken up as far
as the head of the Welland Canal in two
sections, and there put together again
and fitted with the superstructure.

The "Athabaska" will be followed
by the "Alberta," and the "Algonquin,"
and the "Athabaska" is a steel screw
steamer measuring 270 feet by 38 feet
by 22 feet, and her hold is calculated
to carry 2,000 tons of wheat in bulk.

The superstructure contains the saloon
and the engine room, and is capable
of accommodating from 500 to 600, is
between decks. Her engines are very
powerful, and the steel boilers supply
her with 125 pounds pressure of steam.
On her trial trip she made some
good time, and is expected to run
13 knots easily.—Star.
