An Act to amend Chapter six of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, respecting the election of Members of the Legislature.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend Chapter six of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, intituled, "An Act respecting the election of Members of the Legislature": Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

Preamble:

1. Every person who shall bring any action or plaint in virtue of section eighty-three of the Act above cited, shall, before obtaining his writ of summons against the Defendant, give security to the satisfaction of the Prothonotary or Clerk of the Court in which he proposes to summon the said Defendant, to an amount sufficient to cover the costs of suit in case he shall not succeed in obtaining judgment against the defendant.

2. This Act shall be read and construed as forming part of the said Act above cited, Chapter six of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada.
