BOYS' HOME.

THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING.

The thirty-fifth annual meeting of the Boys' Home was held in the Home, George Street, on Thursday, March 7th, 1895.

Among those present were:—His Excellency the Governor-General, His Honor the Lieut.-Governor and Mrs. Kirkpatrick, Col. Sir Casimir Gzowski, the Lord Bishop of Toronto, Hon. G. W. Allan, Canon DuMoulin, Rev. Dr. Potts, Rev. D. J. Macdonnell, Prof. MacLaren, Rev. Dr. Parsons, O. A. Howland, M.L.A., Mr. J. L. Hughes, Mr. R. S. Baird, Principal MacMurchy, Dr. J. E. Elliott, Dr. J. D. Thorburn, and many others.

His Honor the Lieut.-Governor occupied the chair, and Rev. D. J. Macdonnell opened the meeting with prayer.

A brief and enthusiastic address was then given by His Excellency the Governor-General, followed by singing by the boys, after which His Excellency withdrew.

The Chairman then called upon the Hon. G. W. Allan to read the Secretary's Report as follows :

THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Lady Managers of the Boys' Home in presenting this, their 35th Annual Report, to the many kind friends of the Institution, desire to express their heartfelt gratitude and thanks to the merciful Heavenly Father, who still permits them to labor in this part of His vineyard, for His protecting care of the Home, and His gracious guidance of its work during the past year.

The total number of inmates in the Home during the past year, including those in residence on the 1st of January, 1894, was two hundred and eleven. Of these 22 were sent to places with farmers; 53 were removed by parents or friends; one died, and 107 remain in the Home.

During the past year six boys have completed their terms of apprenticeship with farmers, and are now in self-supporting situations, two of them remaining with the farmers to whom they were bound, earning wages. At the present time there are 48 boys of various ages serving their time with farmers. Although the number of boys sent to places during the past year is less than that of some other years, this has not been caused from want of applications, but because the Managers have been unable to supply the demand, the majority of the boys being under ten years of age. The Managers continue to receive evidence from the boys in various parts of the country of their comfort and welfare in the choice of homes which have been made for them.

The Managers regret to report the death of one little boy, George Patterson. He belonged to a delicate family, and early showed symptoms of decline. Upon the advice of Dr. Elliott he was sent to the Hospital for Sick Children in June, and received all the care and attention that is given in that admirable institution. He lingered until Autumn and passed away a short time before his poor mother, who died of the same disease.

The general health of the boys has been good throughout the year, with the exception of one or two slight outbreaks of the usual juvenile epidemics, inseparable from so large a number of children, particulars of which will be found in the Medical Officers' report.

The Managers cannot express too warmly their gratitude to Dr. Thorburn who for many years has continued to take such a deep interest in the health and welfare of the boys,

and also to Dr. J. E. Elliott, to whom the Managers are indebted for continued care and attention to the many calls necessary in a Home with over a hundred boys.

Yet though there is much to chronicle that is joyous, our horizon has not been without clouds, dark shadows have fallen across our pathway, and we mourn the loss by death of one of our most beloved and honored members.

As long as the Boys' Home continues to exist, the name of Mrs. Robert Gilmor will be lovingly associated with its history. In those early and trying times which attended the foundation of the "Home" her untiring energy and devotion, combined with never failing cheerfulness, inspired those whose privilege it was to work with her. The influence of her life will long linger about the scenes, and strengthen the hearts of her fellow-workers.

Collecting is not looked upon as a pleasant task, and the continued depression in financial circles has not made lighter this important part of the work of the Managers, but the many instances of kind and encouraging words from friends, and the interest manifested in the institution and its work, certainly lightens the labor. Above all, the fact that the collections by the Lady Managers have fallen very little short of those of last year, is proof that the public generally appreciate the good work done by this most necessary and deserving charity.

The Managers regret the retirement of one of their number, Mrs. Palmer, who for many years took a warm interest in the welfare of the "Home."

The Committee again acknowledge their indebtedness to Mr. Kilgour and Mr. Brush, and their young lady assistants, for their untiring zeal in the religious and musical instruction of the boys not only in the Sunday school but often during the week evenings.

To Miss Hodgert and Miss Kerr, the efficient teachers provided by the School Board, under whose tuition the boys are making very satisfactory progress, and to Miss Mackay, the faithful and untiring Matron, for her readiness at all times to further the interests and welfare of the "Home."

The Managers would also make grateful mention of many pleasant trips given to the boys by the Captains of the local steamers during the summer months, to the various parks and to the Island, all of which trips were a source of the greatest pleasure and benefit to the boys.

They would also offer thanks to their many friends for provisions and other supplies, sent in constantly during the year, and particularly for the bountiful donations at Christmas time. A large and beautiful iced fruit cake from Mrs. Kirkpatrick made this Christmas one long to be remembered.

And now to Him who has said "Suffer little children to come unto Me," we commend the work and the workers, as we embark on another year, feeling that not unto us, but unto Him be all the praise.

The Medical Officer's report was then read by Dr. J. D. Thorburn.

MEDICAL OFFICERS' REPORT.

It is with pleasure that we again, in presenting our annual report, can say that the past year has been a healthy one for the Boys' Home.

During the past summer we were visited by measles, chicken-pox, erysipelas and ring-worm. Only a few of the boys were attacked with these contagious diseases. Prompt isolation prevented their spread to the other boys. An order from the Inspector of Public Charities required the vaccination of all the boys in the Home. A few were ill with sore arms for a time but soon recovered. With the exception of a case of acute broncho-pneumonia we have had no other cases of severe illness during the year. The boy who was attacked with broncho-pneumonia in January last was a delicate little fellow with a very bad family history, his mother and several children having died of consumption. He was seized with a violent fit of coughing and died instantly.

The increased supply of water to the out-buildings has proved quite satisfactory, and has removed the objections in the last report. When the heating apparatus of the infirmary is completed we will be well equipped for any emergency in winter time.

OBJECT OF THE 'BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents ; the object of this Institution being the prevention of Juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year ; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses ; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meeting, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of the preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution and also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All

the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the Managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Society; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation shall visit the "Home" daily, each week; inspect the house; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at 11 o'clock a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the direction of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys; to conduct the household affairs generally; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., dinner at 12, and tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School and Divine service in a Protestant church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend of the institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
