

The school building was completed in time for the opening of the school. It seems to be considered very convenient and complete in all respects. There are three commodious class rooms, and the chapel room is also available for use as a class room when required, and serves also, as heretofore, for the requirements of the Women's Auxiliary and other similar organizations, it being expressly agreed by the School Corporation that accommodation is to be provided for such purposes.

On the day of the re-opening of the school, a member of the Corporation presented the school with a flag, specially made for the purpose. It displays the St. Alban's cross, a yellow saltire on a blue ground.

With increasing congregations it would be a great advantage to have the services of an additional vergier to assist in seating people. We would be glad to know of any young man who would volunteer for this work.

The Junior Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, commence work for the winter this week.
