EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETS.

The Mayor's Opinion About Alderman's Influence in the Works Department.

The attendance at yesterday's meeting of the Executive Committee was light, but notwithstanding this the members present were full of fight.

He was satisfied in the deliberations by His Worship the Mayor, Ald. Harris, Ed. Galt, William Gilliespie, D. W. Johnson, Charles (St. Thomas), Ald. Schiller, Biggar.

The first hot discussion occurred over the names of the Board of Works, recommending the construction of sewerage in Chalmers-avenue and Ottawa-street.

Both thoroughfares were 35 feet in width, and therefore inadvisable as streets, the by-law governing such matters distinctly stipulating that no street be accepted which had a less width than 60 feet.

The Mayor expressed surprise that Ald. Carlyle would advocate a proceeding which would fill the city with holes of disease, and in future at least would recommend that the rule be laid down that no streets be accepted which were not the regulation width.

The next point which raised trouble was the clause recommending the construction at once of the portion of the Grand Central sewer from College to River-street.
