## CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ontario.
The holiday season does not seem to have had the effect of checking the demand for lumber. Rail shipments to local points and the Eastern States are stall quite active. The only branch which has shown any falling off in deinand is the bulding trade, as the recent cold weather has to some extent caused a cessation of out-door work. Manufacturing establishments are operating to their full capacity, and consequently there is a steady call for and consequently there is a steady call for for manufacturing purposes. There is cor manafacturing purposes. There is
still a scarcity of lath and shingles, al. still a scarcity of lath and shingles, al-
though enquiries for these have not been so numerous within the past week.
The weather has been favorable for work in the woods. From all accounts there will be a large production of logs. Acco:ding to estimates received by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, there will be taken out this winter in the neighbor hood of $800,000,000$ feet of logs. Las winter the cut was only 570 million feet which shows an increase of over 200 million feet this winter. This large production of logs will mean a considerable duction of logs will mean a considerabed
increase in the quantity of lumber placed increase in the quantity of lumber placed
on the market next season, but unless on the market next season, but unless
very unexpected conditions arise, the demand is likely to be equal to the supply.
quEnec AND New bruNswick. The tendency of lumber prices in the Quebec market is to advance, in sym pathy with the small stocks carried over this winter. The stock of square and waney pine, red pine, oak, elm and ash umber wintering at the port of Quebec is less than one year ago. In square pine the difference is slight, but in wancy pine the stock is nearly one and one-hal million cubic feet less than in the winte of 1898 . Birch is the only tumber of which the quanuty wintering shows an in crease, but even this is represented only by 3.331 cubic feet. For the best quality of white pine the quotation is from 37 to 43 cents, while waney board, 39 to 22 inches average, is quoted at 43 to 47 cents. Pine deals are very frin and are quoted a $\$ 1=0$ to $\$ 130$ for first, $\$ 85$ to $\$ 95$ for second, and $\$ 45$ to $\$ 55$ for third quality. First qualiny spruce deals average about $\$ 43$ per standard.

More favorable weather for losing operations has been encountered during the past week, and every effort is being put forth by lumbermen to get a large supply of logs for next season's sawing.
maNitoma and meitisa columbia. There is still a liberal distribution of Jumber throughout Vestern Canada. Alanufacturers on the Lake of the Woods, as well as those in British Columbia, re port that the past year was one of the most successful in the history of the rade, the sales representing an increase of fully 50 per cent. over those of the previous yeir The recent advances on certan grades are being maintained, and we would not be surprised if still linther we would nol be surprised still lighe prices ruled during the coming year The ontlook for trade is very promising There is lakely to be a considerable amount of railway construction and general building.

## UNITED STATHS

Notwithstanding that the lumber cut of the Upper Mississippi river district in the season of 1894 was $594.370,000$ feet, as against $469,701,000$ feet in the previous year, the stock of lumber on hand at the close of the year shows a decrease, as compared with $18 y 8$, of nearly $27,000,000$ feet. The decrease in the stock of shingles is $2=, 00, \infty \infty$, and in that of lath $10,000,000$. These figures reflect the situation at other producing points and are an indication of the satisfactory condition of the lumber trade of the United States throu.thout the sear just clused. Alliounh throwhout the sear just clused. Alliuugh
the demand at this season is not particuthe demand at this season is not particu-
lanly active, prices are being well mantained, and it is said that in the cast the conditions were never better for a continuance of high prices. Eastern retail yards are almost bare of stock, and a large amount of new building is in sight for the spring. The scarcity of box lumber becomes more acute as the weeks so by. At Tonawanda box lumber and No. 2 and No. 3 barn is held at a premum, and it is difficult to buy any io-inch or and it is diffcult to buy any $10-i n c h$ or
12 -inch No. 3 barn at less than $\$ 22$ per theinch No. 3 barn at less than $\$ 22$ per
thousand. Very fev dealers can fill an order representing any great quantity of stock. In inch fine common and shaky clear the situation is different, as many of the yards have quite a surplus and prices are slightly weaker. A Buffalo dealer is reported to be holding liss stock of box lumber at \$20.

The statement has been made in some quarters that hardwood prices are weakening, but this report is denied by the leading dealers in the Eistern Stites. It is admitted that the demand for hardwond lumber is not brisk, but the situation has caused no alarm. There ;s a great scarcity of the lower grades of maple, and basswood is much enquared for.

The advanced prices of wood goods 112 Great Britan have in no way cheaked the demand, as in every department of trade activity prevalis. There secms to be a marked desiree of contidence in tinancial circles, notwithstanding the war and this confidence is nowhere more wisible than n tumber circles. it recent public sales n tumber cracies. At recent public sales prices lave been realized such as have not been known for many yeats. Importers are contracting quite hberally;
chiefly for carly goods. A slight advance in the price of square timber is reported

StOCKS AND PRICES.
W. E. Dryden, of Hillsioro, N.B., expects to cut $3,000,000$ feet of lumber this winter.
The Altma Lumber Co., of Alma, N.B. are now shipping birch lumber from St John, N.B., to Great Britain by winter steamers.
At Duluth, Minn., as high as $\$ 14$ is being asked for No. 3 barn, bul $\$ 13$ is about the average quotation. Log run brings from $\$ 16$ in $\$ 18$.
The barque Freeman sailed from Tusk et Wedre, N.S., last week for Buenos Ayres, with 872,000 feet of lumber ship. ped by Dickie \& McGrath.
The South River Lumber Co., of South River, Ont., are this winter taking out a larke quantuly of pine logs, some hemlock, and 100,000 cubic feet of waney board pine.
The Newville Lumber Co., of New. ville, N.S., expect to take out this winter $4,500,000$ feet of ioss. Nearly all their next season's production of lumber has been sold for shipment to Great Britain. J. J. Wheclock, of Connors, N.B., expects to manufacture $30,000,000$ shingles during the coming season, as well as a quantity of long lumber for the local trade. He has a mill at Connors, N.B., and another at St. Francis, Maine.
It is understood that the C. Beck Manufacturing Co., of Penetanguishere, have facturing Co., of penetanguisher.e, have commenced logging operations on the two limits in the Nipissing district pur-
chased at the government sale a fortnight ago.
The W. \& A. McArthur Co., of Chey boygan, who recently purchased the McKinnon \& Welsh saw mill at Little Current, Ont., are putting in $30,000,000$ feet of logs, and will hikely operate the mill day and night next season.
One year ago dry white pine lath could be purchased in Chicago at about $\$ 2.15$ per thousand, white they are now selling at $\$ 4.50$ f.o.b. cars. In the local trade there white pine lath sold during December at from $\$ 5$ to $\$ 5.50$ per thousand. Of late there has been some easing off in
quotations, although the shortage in the supply has not been relieved to any marked degree.

## THE BOSTON KARKET

Orders are still slownibout being filled at the mills, with the water low and logs scarce. Reports from the spruce lumber regions mention a lack of snow for latuing, with one of the winte months gone and almost nothing done. A big cut has been yarded, but unless snow conie very soon and continues in good shape, the cut of logs cannot be hauled. The chances are that what was planned for a very large cut of spruce naay turn out to be a small one. Of provinciallumber here were arrivals of six lumber, 196,000 laths, and 980,000 shingles.
