The Secretary of Stote for External Affairs, the donourable hitchell Shrrp, announced that he had signed on April 15 in Ottawa on behalf oi the Government of Conda, an Agreement settling outstaming claims of Condian citizens against Czechoslovakia. Dr. Pudolf Ronlicek, the Czechoslovak linister of Finance, signed ine Agrcement on behalf of the Goverment of Czechoslovakia. The Agreement is to come into force on the date on which the contracting parties inform each other through an exchange of letters that the Agreement has been approved by their respective Goverments. This exchange will take place in Prague as soon as possible.

The claims covered in the Arreement arose from post-war notionalization and similor measures of the Goverament of Czechoslovakia. The Agreement covers certain properties which were owned hy persons who were Candian citizens ot the time of the motiomilization. The cleim of Fr. Tnomas Bata Jr. for the nationlization of the firm Bata a.s., $Z l i n$ and its subsidiaries in Czechoslovakia is not coverca by the Agreement.

Megotintions between officinls of the two Governments began in Prague in Niny, 1971 and subsequent discussions were held there and in Ottawa.

The Arreement provides for the pannent of $n$ lump sum of $\mathbf{~} 3.25$ million in seven equal gnmal instalments, the first instalment to be pid not later tinn ninety days from the coming into force of tive Agreement.

The Foreign Claims Comission will be authorized to make recomendotions to the Secretnry of State for Enterml Affairs and the l:inister of Finance rejarding the distribution of the proceeds of the settlement. Those persons who have filed claims with the Goverment will be notified in due course of the settlement.

Cories of the text of the Agreement will be tabled in Parliament ond will be nvailable from Information Canada.
