BOER PRISONER REFUGEE

Arrived in New York on Trinidad as a Stowaway From Hamilton, Bermuda, and Detained.

MADE DESPERATE TRIAL TO ESCAPE

Examined, He Admits His Escape, But Wants to Stay in the United States.

New York, July 9.—One of the Boer prisoners recently taken to Derrill's Island, Bermuda, from South Africa, was a stowaway on the steamer Trinidad, which was bound here to-day.

BOERS ARE SAVAGES.

Major Charlie Ross, Commanding Canadian Scouts, Heard From. Ottawa, July 9.—Mr. Frank Newby of the Department of the Interior has received a letter from Major Charlie Ross, commanding the Canadian Scouts in Africa. The letter was written from Pretoria on June 4. It is in part as follows: "I have received the rank and major and also the D.S.O. I know you will be pleased to hear this. I can not give you any idea of when this war is going to end. I said war, but it is no war; it is more like chasing bandits thru the country than war. In fact, since the taking of Pretoria (12 months ago) there have been very few real engagements. It is merely an sniping by the Boers from behind boulders and from kopjes. Anyhow, such as it is, I intend to see it thru, unless I get knocked over. You can see by the account of poor G. Howard's death the class of people we have to deal with, who are supposed to be Christians, but are in reality no better than savages, and should be so treated."

Russia Proposes to Relax Additional Duties on Sugar if America Kills Sugar Differential.

BUT OFFER CANNOT BE ACCEPTED

As the Question is Now Before the Courts and Out of Treasurer Gage's Hands.

Washington, July 9.—Another important exchange has occurred between the Russian government and the United States relative to the tariff. The Russian Minister of Finance, M. D. Witte, has proposed that Russia will vacate all of the additional duties levied on American goods, since the imposition of the sugar differential, if the United States will vacate its action on the sugar differential.

RUSSIA MENACES BRITAIN

Bear Will Shortly Invade India Unless Important Concessions Are Made.

General Soboleff Says the English Must Cease Their Aggressive Policy in Europe. Chicago, July 9.—The Record-Herald has the following from Moscow: "Russia will surely invade India unless Great Britain ceases its aggressive policy in Europe. It is logically certain that Russia will soon annex Afghanistan. The time is near when the frontier of Russia's Central Asiatic possessions will be the Hindu Kush Mountains, the natural border of India."

DIED AMONG STRANGERS.

Miss Mattie Brown, School Teacher of Port Rowan, Suicides.

Utica, N.Y., July 9.—A young woman came to this city, registered at a small hotel on Mt. George, New York, and retired to her room. The next day she was found dead, having taken laudanum. There was nothing by which she could be identified. It is now discovered that she was Miss Mattie Brown of Simcoe, Ont., who had been teaching in the schools at Port Rowan, Ont., for the past 18 months. She left in her room a letter containing her resignation from the staff of teachers, but gave no reason for her abrupt course. She was a woman of high character, and her acquaintances and relatives are unable to explain the mystery of her sudden departure.

THREE DIED CONFEE.

Cape Town, July 9.—Four Boer prisoners were today brought into Bloemfontein report that General Botha, De la Rey and Dewet recently held a conference at a point on the Vaal River.

HONOR AN AMERICAN.

Newport, R. I., July 9.—It was learned to-day that the real reason for Mr. James J. Van Alen's departure to receive a decoration at the hand of King Edward VII. When the Boer war broke out Mr. Van Alen, who was in England, organized and equipped at his own expense a hospital corps which he sent to South Africa, and which rendered valuable services during the worst of the campaign. In recognition of Mr. Van Alen's generosity the King has decided to honor him with the decoration of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem and upon his arrival in London he will be so decorated.

NEW OSHAWA TEACHERS.

L. H. Graham, M.A., and R. J. Sprott, B.A., Chosen Last Night. Oshawa, July 9.—(Special)—At a special meeting of the Oshawa School Board to-night selection was made of a teacher of science and a teacher of modern languages to all vacancies. The choice for the former was L. H. Graham, M.A., Markham, and the latter, R. J. Sprott, B.A., Toronto. They will enter upon their duties on Sept. 2. There were seventy applicants from various parts of the province in response to advertisements.

GREAT HEAT IN EUROPE.

London, July 10.—Great heat extends throughout Western Europe, from Spain to Scandinavia. Heat prostrations are reported from many points. They have been very numerous in Paris, and there were 20 deaths attributed to heat in Copenhagen yesterday. Violent hailstorms have ruined the crops in the Province of Sainnaing, Spain.

HOW'S OUR FRIEND KRUGER?

British Public Thus Greeted Those Who Attended the Liberal Caucus Yesterday.

CONFIDENCE STILL IN BANNERMAN

Sword and Olive Branch Ought to Go Hand in Hand—Asquith Supports His Leader.

London, July 9.—The much-discussed meeting of Liberals called by Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman, the Liberal leader in the House of Commons, with the object of ascertaining whether he still retains the confidence of the party, was held at the Reform Club this afternoon, and resulted in the adoption of a vote of confidence in the leader of the Opposition. All factions of Liberals attended. The Liberal-Imperialists, headed by H. H. Asquith, were there almost to a man, but Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman and Sir William Verelstoun-Hartwood were the two who received any marked recognition on entering. The crowd watching the arrivals greeted them with cries of "How's our friend Kruger?"

NEGRO SHOOTS THREE.

His Wife, and Two Farmers Attacked on the Seaside—Escapes. Douglas, Ga., July 9.—Jake Devoss, a negro laborer on James McKinnon's plantation, was working a team of mules this morning. The mule balked, and Devoss flew into a rage. Plopping fell to mangle the animals. The negro went to his home, got a Winchester rifle, and shot both mules, and he turned the rifle upon him, inflicting a wound which may prove fatal. James McKinnon, who owned the mules, and his brother Charles, attracted by the shooting, started for the scene. The now wild and infuriated negro saw the mules and shot at them. Charles McKinnon was instantly killed, and James McKinnon was so badly wounded that he will probably die. Then Devoss escaped to the swamps. The county authorities were notified and started in pursuit of the murderer with blood hounds. He has his rifle, but it is not believed he has much ammunition. More bloodshed is looked for.

WOMEN AID STRIKERS.

Spanish Workmen Throw Cobblestones at Police—Shots Fired. Sevilla, Spain, July 9.—There was a serious conflict in a street here to-day between workmen and gendarmes. Owing to the refusal of groups of the former to disperse, the gendarmes arrested a workman. The latter's comrades threw up cobblestones and threw them at the police, injuring five of them. The gendarmes, then charged, shots were exchanged, and several persons were hit. Women actively participated in the disturbance. The prefect who intervened was stoned. Finally a force of cavalry dispersed the rioters.

COMPENSATE LILLY WHITE.

British Government Will Have to Pay for His Mistake. London, July 9.—The Home Secretary, C. T. Ritchie, in the House of Commons to-day, promised to liberally consider any application for compensation in behalf of Charles Lilly White the American citizen who was arrested in New Zealand and brought to England on the charge of being Arthur Blatch, a fugitive from Colchester, England, accused of murder. Mr. Ritchie said that he had already voluntarily notified Mr. Choate, the United States Ambassador, that the government was prepared to compensate Lilly White.
