Three hoisting machines on the iron ore docks were destroyed, entailing a loss of \$80,000. A tribular steel electric light mast 200 feet high was snapped off within 30 feet of the ground. Several houses were badly damaged and falling in course of execution destroyed. Fortunately no persons were injured.

A STRAY dog occurred in Kingston, Ont., a few days ago. A reporter was called to a house by a woman, who said her father was dead. The press man went in and saw a man apparently sleeping in a chair.
