PRACTICAL PICTURE FRAMING. With Moderate Skill Pretty Frames Can be Made From Plain Wood.

Handsome carved frames are very expensive, and paste frames, though less so, are often unobtainable, as the design is frequently mutilated. However, with moderate skill very pretty frames can be made of plain wood. For a medium or large-sized picture let the material be three or four inches wide and 1-2 inch thick, of some nicely grained wood. Oak is preferred ready dressed, as it should be, can not be

called. The pieces should be cut so that the inner or shorter edge is just one inch shorter than the picture to be framed. The corners are the most difficult part, but unless you are a professional joiner do not try to make an "invisible" joint, as it will always result in failure. Cut them carefully at an angle of 45 degrees, making them fit snugly. Picture-frame makers usually nail the pieces together with long, slim brads, driven through from the edge, but this is very hard to do without special appliances, in fact, almost impossible. Fig. 1 shows an inefficient way of overcoming this difficulty.
