General News.

—The death was announced at midnight, N. S., that Tuesday, of A. N. McDonald, who represented Guyborough in the Nova Scotia Legislature from 1878 to 1883. He was 47 years of age and largely engaged in shipbuilding and mercantile pursuits.

Ottawa, Dec. 22.—The justice department has received information that the decision of the jury council in the case of Cass et al. against the Dominion, even those cases referring to the endorsement of the Stock Act and adulterated liquors.

—A young boy, named Parker, aged 15 years, died at the Fort Park here today. His last words were "Wash up, for the great jubilee is coming." Parker had been a slave in Alabama, Georgia and Texas for nearly 100 years of his life. He was the original of "Old Black Joe" in Miss Beecher's famous character organ being that title.

Ma. E. Gleason on an Iron Palladium.—Mr. Herbert Gleason has written a letter in which says: "Nothing could induce him to consummate a separation of iron from Green Britain. But if the state of the fish people desire a parliament in Dublin to manage local affairs, in the name of justice and wisdom let them have it."

—Thomas Stevens, who is attempting to make the tour of the world on a bicycle, had some rough experiences in Asia Minor. The people did not know what to make of his strange deed. In some places they would not let him enter their villages, and he would have no dealings with him. In other places the inhabitants decided that he was the devil, and threw stones at him. As a rule, however, he was very well received. He was now at Jerusalem, and will spend the winter, and will start spring on his long journey across "Rhodes, Asia, Afghanistan, China, and Japan."
