When Peter told the Lord that it could not be that he would be killed, Jesus was displeased. Do you wonder? He wants us to believe his word.

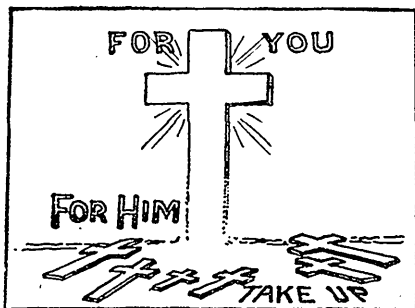
