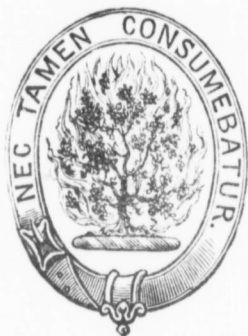

The Weekly Prayer Meeting is held on Wednesday evening at 8 o'clock, in the Lecture Room.

Ordinary meetings of the Kirk Session are held on the first Saturday in each month.

The Sacrament of Baptism is administered, and a sermon to children is preached, on the first Sunday in each month.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper is observed on the last Sunday in January, May and October.

Meetings of the Board of Managers are held quarterly on the first Monday in the months of January, April, July and October, at 7.30 p.m.

Pew rents are payable to the Treasurer, quarterly in advance, at the Managers' Room, on the 21st day of March, June, September and December. Sittings not paid for within six weeks thereafter may be re-let by the Managers.

The Managers will be in their Room on the first Monday in each month, from 7.30 to 9 p.m., to attend to applications for sittings. Those who give up their sittings

should notify the Managers, as sittings cannot be transferred to other parties except by the Managers.

Packages of envelopes will be furnished, on application to the Managers, to Members and Adherents of the Church who are willing to adopt the "Envelope System" of making their weekly offerings. The plan is the following: Each envelope bears a number corresponding to the number opposite to the contributor's name on the 'Treasurer's book. Each contributor undertakes to give a fixed amount weekly, and to make up the deficiency in case of absence on one or more Sundays.

Meetings of the Women's Association are held fortnightly, on Friday, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Collectors appointed by the Women's Association call monthly for contributions to the Missions of the Church, and distribute copies of the *Presbyterian Record* to all contributors.

The Penny Savings Bank, under the management of the Men's Association, is open every Saturday from 7 to 9 p.m., at 168 Adelaide St. West. Deposits from 2 cents upwards.

Meetings of the Young People's Association are held fortnightly, on Friday evening.

The Minister will, as a rule, be found at home between one and two o'clock p.m., except on Mondays and Fridays. He will also endeavour to be at home on Friday afternoon and evening, after 4 o'clock; and will be glad if members of the Congregation, and especially those who are comparative strangers, will avail themselves of the opportunity of coming to the Manse.

## Missions and Schemes of the Church.

---

Contributions for the following objects are collected monthly by the Women's Association :

1. HOME MISSIONS.—For the support of Mission Stations in the needy districts of Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, the North-West Territories, and British Columbia.

2. FOREIGN MISSIONS.—The Western Section of the Church provides for the support of Missions in three fields. (1) Among the Indians in the North-West ; (2) In Formosa, where Dr. Mackay is at the head of the work ; and (3) In Central India. \$40,000 is needed for this year.

3. FRENCH EVANGELIZATION.—Missionaries, Colporteurs and Teachers are employed, under the direction of the Assembly's Board, in spreading a pure gospel among the French Canadians. The estimated amount required for the current year is \$35,000.

4. COLLEGES.—There is a common fund for the support of Knox, Queen's and Montreal Theological Colleges. The amount required this year is \$19,000. This congregation is responsible for two scholarships--one of \$60 and the other of \$50--to be competed for by students of Queen's University who have the ministry in view. A grant is also made for the support of Manitoba College.

5. MINISTERS' WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.—For providing annuities for the widows and orphans of ministers who die in the service of the Church.

6. AGED AND INFIRM MINISTERS' FUND.

The Fund for the AUGMENTATION OF MINISTERS' STIPENDS is not included in the above. During the year just closed, the amount given to this fund was raised partly by

special collection and partly by the appropriation of a portion of the ordinary revenue of the Congregation.

### Minutes of the Annual Meeting.

---

The Fifty-Third Annual Meeting of the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church was held in the Lecture Room of the church, on Wednesday evening, the 16th January, 1884, a large number of the members and adherents being present.

The Rev. D. J. Macdonnell was appointed Chairman, and Mr. Wm. Mitchell Secretary, of the meeting.

The Chairman opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting were confirmed.

The Secretary read the Annual Report, and submitted the Financial Statement of the Board of Managers for the past year, whereupon it was moved by Mr. Cassels, seconded by Mr. Rogerson, and resolved, "That the Report and Financial Statement of the Board of Managers, now submitted, be received and adopted."

The Chairman of the Board of Managers, on behalf of the Managers, presented Mr. Russel Inglis, their Treasurer, with a handsome Tea and Coffee Service, as a token of their esteem, and in recognition of the faithful manner in which he has discharged the duties of that office during the past thirteen years.

Mr. Gemmell moved, seconded by Mr. Sutherland, the motion of which he gave notice at last Annual Meeting, to amend the Constitution by altering the number of Managers from 7 to 12. After deliberation, the motion was put to the meeting by the Chairman, and declared lost by a large majority.

The Chairman then called upon the meeting to elect three Managers in room of Messrs. Gilmor and Perry, and Dr. Thorburn, whose term of office now expires.

Mr. Small moved, seconded by Mr. Cassels, "That the election of Managers be made by nomination and ballot."

Mr. W. A. Shepard moved in amendment, seconded by Mr. A. Hay, "That the election of Managers be made by open vote."

The Chairman having put the amendment and motion to the meeting, declared the amendment carried.

Messrs. Gilmor, Perry, Thorburn and Sutherland were then separately proposed and seconded; a vote having been taken upon each, the Chairman declared Messrs. Gilmor and Perry, and Dr. Thorburn duly re-elected.

The Secretary read the report of the Memorial Committee, whereupon Mr. McGee moved, seconded by Mr. Gemmell, "That the report be received and adopted, and the Committee reappointed."—Carried.

The Superintendents of St. Andrew's, St. Mark's and Dorset Sunday and Evening Schools, read interesting reports, showing satisfactory progress in the work committed to their care.

Reports were also read of the Men's Association and Savings Bank, of the Young People's Association, and of the Women's Association, showing that good work is being done under the auspices of these organizations.

Moved by Dr. Thorburn, seconded by Mr. W. A. Shepard, "That the various reports now read be received, and the thanks of the Congregation tendered to the different workers connected with these organizations."—Carried.

Moved by Mr. MacLennan, seconded by Mr. Kay, and resolved, "That the following be appointed to assist the

Managers as Ushers for the current year, viz.:—Messrs. John Bowman, Jas. Patterson, Thos. J. A. McDonald, J. F. Muir, James M. Rogerson, R. W. Sutherland, P. McIntyre, W. McC. Miller and G. S. Michie.”

Moved by Dr. Geikie, seconded by Capt. Perry, and resolved, “That Messrs. David McGee and W. D. Beardmore be appointed Auditors for the current year.”

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Rogerson, “That the thanks of the Congregation are due, and are hereby tendered to the members of the Choir for their efficient services.”—Carried.

Mr. McIntyre gave notice that he would move at next annual meeting of the Congregation, “That the Constitution be so altered as to make the election of all office bearers by nomination and ballot, and that women be allowed to vote.”

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Fulton, “That the Chairman and Secretary of this meeting be a committee to arrange, revise and have printed, all Reports submitted to this meeting, together with such other matter as they may deem advisable.”

The Chairman then submitted a Statement from the Kirk Session, and closed the meeting with prayer.

## Fifty-Third Annual Report of the Board of Managers.

---

The Treasurer's Statement, herewith submitted, shows in detail the Receipts and Disbursements during the year just closed.

The total receipts from all sources controlled by the Managers were \$15,896.84, made up as follows:—From property, \$5,582.83; from Sunday collections, \$5,644.46; from pew rents, \$4,669.55. Of the Sunday collections, \$3,100.59 was received by envelopes, and \$2,543.87 by open collection, the average ordinary Sunday collection being \$108.28.

The sale of the Humber property, as authorized by the Congregation, was completed in June last, and a payment received on account of \$5,299. The balance of the purchase money, \$15,750, is secured by mortgage on the property, payable within six years from May 1st, 1883, with interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum, payable half yearly.

The Managers have been notified by the executors of the estate of the late Mr. James Michie, that he had bequeathed to the Congregation the sum of \$4,000, to be applied in reduction of the debt on the Church.

In July last the Managers, at the suggestion of the Kirk Session, agreed to set apart, during the remaining six months of the year, a portion of the ordinary revenue from Sunday collections, as a contribution to the General Assembly's Scheme for the augmentation of the stipends of the more poorly paid Ministers of the Church. \$500 has accordingly been given from this source for this purpose, in addition to.

\$2,244, taken up by special collection on Sunday, December 2nd.

The following statement shows the position of the debt on the Church at the end of the year :—

Looking back eight years, we find that the debt then amounted to \$80,000, this being the time when the Congregation removed from the old church into the present edifice. It will thus be seen that during these eight years the debt has been reduced to the extent of \$60,000, in addition to paying interest and current expenses. This is surely cause for great thankfulness, but it is hoped that the congregation will not rest satisfied until the whole of this debt is paid off. Let the use of envelopes for the Sunday collections be more generally adopted, and let every pewholder pay his dues promptly at the commencement of each quarter, and this desirable object may be attained within the next five years out of the ordinary revenue, without any strain upon the Congregation.

The three Managers who now retire by rotation are Messrs. Gilmor and Perry, and Dr. Thorburn, all of whom are eligible for re-election.

### Report of the Memorial Committee.

The Memorial Committee have to report that the duty relegated to them by the Congregation, of erecting within the Church a suitable memorial to the late Mr. James Michie, has had their earnest attention, and the works connected therewith are now in progress.

The design, prepared by Mr. Storm and adopted by the Committee, consists of three stained glass windows, the centre one of which will illustrate the parable of the "Good Samaritan," and will be the Memorial Window. These windows will be placed within the south arch in the auditorium above and in rear of the pulpit. Polished granite columns will support the arches of each of the windows, and columns of the same material will be substi-

The space under the windows and in rear of the pulpit will be richly panelled in cherry wood corresponding with the pulpit, and with the pews throughout the Church ; the whole, while forming a rich and beautiful finish to that part of the Church, will at the same time be a fitting tribute to one whose memory the Congregation desires to perpetuate.

The Memorial Window will bear the following inscription :

“In loving remembrance of James Michie. Born in Corgarff, Aberdeenshire, Scotland, 29th February, 1828. Died at Toronto, 13th January, 1883. Chairman of the Building Committee of this Church, and for twenty-two years a member of the Board of Managers.

“When the ear heard him, then it blessed him, and when the eye saw him it gave witness to him. The blessing of him that was ready to perish came upon him, and he caused the widow’s heart to sing for joy. He was a father to the poor, and the cause which he knew not he searched out.’ ”

These figures indicate growth, though we do not now look for large accessions to our numbers, but rather for the development of spiritual power within the Congregation. An unusual number of those who have been longest connected with the Church have been removed by death during the

past year. The blanks thus made will be filled, we trust, by faithful men and women, who will do the Lord's work with earnestness and wisdom.

Contributions to the Session Fund on the three Communion Sundays, together with one-half of the collection made on Thanksgiving Day, amounted to \$476.44, as compared with \$360.96 in the previous year. This amount has been, as usual, expended partly by the Session and partly by the Dorcas Committee of the Women's Association, and has been almost entirely devoted to the relief of the poor connected with the Congregation.

The Session rejoice to know of the good work done in the several Schools connected with the Church, as set forth in the reports which have been submitted, and they commend the Schools to the hearty sympathy and support of the Congregation. They rejoice in the success attending the efforts of the various Associations, and they record especially their appreciation of the valuable help rendered by the Women's Association through its committees in several departments of Church work.

The contributions made to the various missionary, benevolent and educational objects connected with the Church, have been largely in excess of those made in the previous year. The amount raised by monthly contributions collected by the Committee of the Women's Association is (with interest added) \$1,943.97. Adding to the special collection made on 2nd December, for the augmentation of stipends, contributions which were sent in subsequently, and the amount appropriated by the Board of Managers for this object, the sum of \$2,862 has been reached. #### Report of the Women's Association.

The Women's Association has held seventeen meetings during the year, with an average attendance of twenty-one,—thirty-three being the largest number present at any meeting. Sixty members have been enrolled; eighty ladies in all have taken part in the work.

The Association proper meets fortnightly on Friday, at 3 p.m., for the transaction of general business. The SEWING COMMITTEE meets on the same day, from 11 to 5 o'clock, two ladies in turn providing a simple lunch.

The funds at the disposal of the Association for giving away have been raised in various ways: by sewing and

knitting, etc.; by contributions of flowers, home-made cake, etc., for sale; by two entertainments given during the year, and by a missionary box placed on the table during the latter months. A box of clothing and other articles for a missionary and his family was made up as last year, and anonymously despatched in December.

The COLLECTING COMMITTEE reports that eighteen ladies have collected on behalf of the Session, for the Missions of the Church, the sum of \$1,934.72.

The VISITING COMMITTEE reports that all who have been known to have joined the Church during the year have been apportioned to some member, with the request to call and make the acquaintance of the stranger, and that most of these visits have been paid.

The DORCAS COMMITTEE reports that fourteen families belonging to the congregation have been assisted in the usual way. The money expended by this committee is supplied by the Session, and an account of the same is given below.

The Secretary of the Association, Miss Alexander, having, during the summer, gone to Europe, in October Miss Denny was appointed in her place.

The Association desires to express satisfaction that so much success has attended the various efforts put forward to meet the demand for work in the church; to invite the co-operation in these efforts of all the women in the Congregation; and further, to express the hope that each year as it comes will show that the Association is, through the blessing of God, an instrument of good to all connected with it.

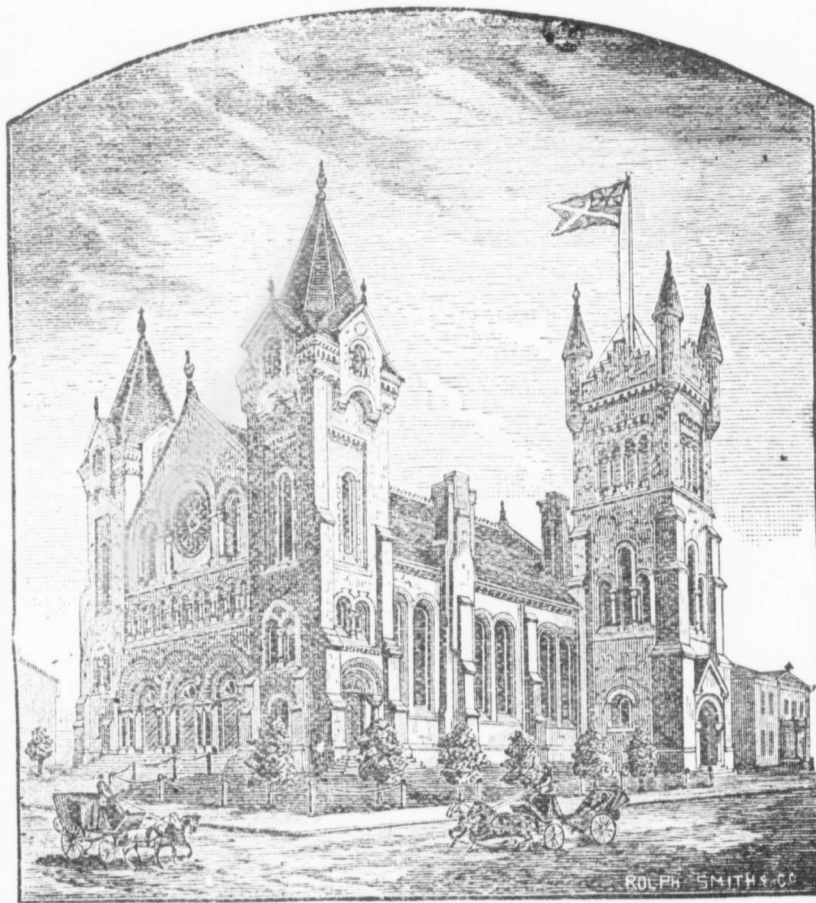
