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CONSTITUTION

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OF THE

ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

NAME AND OBJECT.

- 1. That this Association shall be denominated "The Ontario Rifle Association."
- 2. The objects of the Association are the promotion and encouragement of rifle shooting generally, and more especially amongst the Active Militia of the Province of Ontario, and to assist in giving permanence to the Force.

MEMBERSHIP.

- 3. The individual membership fee shall be one dollar per annum, payable in advance.
- 4. A donor of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, shall be entitled to be enrolled as a life member of the Association.

AFFILIATION.

5. Associations shall pay \$5 per annum for the privilege of affiliation, irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, entitling the Association to a medal, to free entrance for one team in the match open to teams from Affiliated Associations, and entitling five members of the Association who have never won a prize at any Provincial, Dominion or National Rifle Association to compete at the Annual Prize Meeting without payment of the individual membership fee.

PATRON.

6. There shall be a Patron, to be named by the Council.

OFFICERS.

- 7. There shall be a President, who shall be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.
- 8. There shall be four Vice-Presidents, one for each Military District in Ontario, to be elected at the same time and manner as the President.
- 9. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council and holding office during pleasure.
- 10. There shall be two Auditors, who shall be appointed at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

COUNCIL.

- 11. There shall be a Council, composed as follows: (1) Four members from each of the Military Districts in Ontario, who shall be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association; (2) the President and Vice-Presidents of the Association; (3) the Presidents of affiliated Associations or Clubs being members of the Association, seven of whom shall form a quorum, and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.
- 12. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account, duly audited, to the Annual Business Meeting of the Association. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
- 13. The Council shall, at its first meeting in each year, choose from its members the Chairman of the Council.
- 14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them, no by-law being in any way altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of the Council.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

- 15. The Council shall annually elect, at its first meeting in each year, an Executive Committee, consisting of ten of its members, two of whom shall be the President of the Association and the Chairman of the Council, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office the same may be filled by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council; three to form a quorum.
- 16. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council shall from time to time order affecting the affairs of the Association.

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FINANCES.

17. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, who shall be elected annually by the Council at its first meeting in each year, and who shall have a general supervision over the finances of the Association, and to whom all accounts shall be submitted before payment thereof is made by the Treasurer.

18. All expenditure for sums of current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the Chairman of the Finance Committee in writing, or, in his absence, by some other member of the Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. All expenditures of a general nature are to be made only on the authority of the Council of the Association.

19. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time in some chartered bank of Canada, which shall be named by the Council, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.

20. The Fiscal Year of the Association shall end on the 30th day of November. A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures, duly audited, shall be tendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer within one month thereafter.

PRIZE MEETINGS.

21. Prize Meetings shall be held at Toronto, at such times and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meetings of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time, as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision or the decision of a majority of them shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

ANNUAL REPORT.

22. An annual report of the affairs and proceedings of the Association shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall, having been previously submitted to the Council, be published as soon after the close of the year as may be found practicable, and shall be submitted to the members at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

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MEETINGS.

23. The Annual Business Meeting of the Association for the election of Officers, the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Toronto on the first Tuesday in March in each year, at such hour and place as may be named by the President of the Association.

24. A General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the transaction of all business of a general nature and for the discussion of matters that may be brought forward by any member attending the matches. The appointment of a committee to select the Provincial Team or Teams to represent this Association at the Annual Prize Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association shall take place at this Meeting. The election of representatives from this Association to the Council of the Dominion Rifle Association, and the election of a Committee to select a team from the shooting members of this Association from Ontario to compete in the London Merchants' Match of the Dominion Rifle Association, to take place at this meeting.

25. There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council in each year, the first of which shall be held on the day of and immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association; the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

26. Special Meetings of the Council shall be summoned by the Chairman if required by any six members of the Council, notification being sent to each member of the Council at least seven days previous to such meeting, and the requisition for the meeting and the notices to the members must state the object or objects of such special meeting.

27. The Association, Council, Executive and Finance Committee shall keep minutes of their proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in books kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and shall be open to the inspection of all members of the Council.

ALTERATION OF CONSTITUTION.

28. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members, as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting, at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

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REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION

FOR THE YEAR 1897.

The Council has the honor to submit to the members of the Association the 29th Annual Report of its proceedings, and to report a continued and increasing interest by all concerned in its affairs.

ANNUAL PRIZE MEETING.

The Annual Prize Meeting was held at the Long Branch Rifle Ranges on Tuesday, the 24th day of August, and the three following days. The total number of competitors firing on the first day was 268, as compared with 275 in 1895 and 367 in 1896. This heavy decrease and apparent lack of interest in the meeting is no doubt almost entirely attributable to the fact that the arm of the militia force had been changed from the Snider to the Lee-Enfield. The city corps were provided with Lee-Enfields, and did most of their practice with this rifle, whereas the rural corps were still armed with the Snider rifle. There was a marked falling off in the attendance of tyros, there being only 72 competitors to compete for the 60 prizes offered, as against 132 competitors the previous year. We have every reason to expect, however, that the above decrease is more apparent than real, and that the coming season will see an increasing interest taken in rifle shooting throughout the country.

The Association is much indebted to the Corporation of the City of Toronto for a continuance of their liberal grant of \$400.

The general prize list was further improved by the introduction of a Rapid Firing Match, the money for which, \$100, was generously donated by William Mackenzie, Esquire, President of the Toronto Railway Company.

Two "Scurry" matches were introduced, more as an experiment than for purposes of revenue.

The railway facilities afforded by the Grand Trunk Railway during the meeting were satisfactory.

The weather during the meeting was all that could be desired.

The thanks of the Council are due to the members of the Executive Committee, the Executive, Range and Statistical Officers for their services during the Meeting, and also to the Press for full reports of the Matches and proceedings of the Meeting.

The duties of Medical Officer were satisfactorily discharged by Surgeon-Major Ross, 77th Battalion.

FINANCES.

The Treasurer's Statement of the Finances of the Association, duly audited, is submitted herewith.

The total receipts of the year were \$10,995.45.

The amount received for membership, affiliation and entry fees, etc., at matches, after deducting cost of ammunition, was \$2,635.79.

The amount expended in cash prizes was \$4,012, an increase of \$343 over 1896.

The expenditure of \$42 in connection with the Ranges was necessary in order to give increased accommodation at the 500 yards Extra Series and 600 yards firing mounds.

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The adding of a fourth day to the Meeting entailed a considerable additional expense to the Association, and this, coupled with the decreased attendance and an increase in cash prizes given, militated against the financial success of the Meeting.

The claim against the Dominion Government for the amount paid by the Association during the years 1892, 1893 and 1894, for the services of a caretaker of the Ranges, amounting to \$764.50, has been paid.

The balance of assets over liabilities, as set out in the statement of 1896, excluding plant and stores, showed a surplus of \$220.89. According to the statement submitted herewith, there is a surplus of \$108.77.

RANGES.

Telephone communication between the Ranges and the city has been established, this being found necessary, and in view of the fact that the regular train service with the Rifle Ranges is unsatisfactory.

The Ranges themselves have been improved by the depositing of a large quantity of cinders for road purposes, etc.

Additional accommodation has been furnished as regards officers' quarters, so that the staff can remain at the Ranges during the Meeting.

FOR 1897.

MEETING OF THE COUNCIL.

Held at the Canadian Military Institute, Toronto, on Tuesday, 16th February, 1897, at 2.30 p.m.

PRESENT—Major J. J. Mason, in the chair; Lieut.-Col. Otter, D.O.C.; Lieut.-Col. Mason, R.G.; Lieut.-Col. J. Hughes, 45th Battalion; Lieut.-Col. White, 30th Battalion; Lieut.-Col. Jones, R. L.; Major W. C. Macdonald, Highlanders; Major Bruce, R. G.; Major Delamere, Q. O. R.; Major Mutton, Q. O. R.; Capt. Mercer, Q. O. R.; Capt. Robertson, Highlanders; Capt. Kirkpatrick, Q. O. R.; Capt. Curran, 12th Battalion; Capt. Rennie, Q. O. R.

The minutes of the previous Council Meeting were read and adopted.

The Secretary then presented the Annual Report and Financial Statement to the meeting.

A ballot for the position of caretaker was taken, and Sergt. Donnelly was declared elected.

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Moved by Major Macdonald, and seconded by Capt. Mercer,

"That Mrs. Whitaker's services be retained up to the 1st of March, and that she be paid up to that date, and that Sergt. Donnelly's appointment do take effect from that date." Carried.

The Secretary was instructed to write Mrs. Whitaker; also to draw up a memorandum of agreement between the Association and Sergeant Donnelly, setting forth his duties and making his appointment monthly.

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I.-AFFILIATION.

1. The affiliation fee is \$5 (payable by 19th August), irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, which entitles an Association to a Silver Medal, and free entrance for team prizes in the "Corporation of the City of Toronto Match."

2. Competitors on affiliated Association teams must have been members in good standing of such Association for at least thirty days previous to the match, and no competitor can enter as a member of more than one Association.

II.—MEMBERSHIP.

1. The fee for membership is \$1, irrespective of entrance fees; and all competitors must be members of the Association. This does not apply to Nursery men, who are entitled to Free membership.

2. Free membership will be granted to any competitor who has never won a prize at any Provincial, Dominion or National Rifle Association Match, and such person shall be entitled to enter all matches without payment of membership fee.

III.-ENTRIES.

Entries, accompanied by the fees, for the first eight matches, must be made (upon forms to be obtained from the Secretary) on or before Thursday, 19th August, 1897; other matches, during the meeting.

Entries for Nursery Aggregate may be made up to 1 p.m. the first day.

IV.—POST ENTRIES.

1. Post entries (10 per cent. extra) will not be squadded until the regular entries have been provided for.

- 2. Should the holders of post entry tickets find it impossible to shoot before the close of the competition, the Council will not hold itself responsible; in such case the entrance fee will be returned.
- 3. No post entries will be made for any competition after the firing for such competition has commenced.

V.--RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1. Competitors who are prevented from being present at the Meeting can have the entrance fees they have paid refunded after the Meeting, provided that they return their firing tickets to the Secretary.

VI.-TRANSIT.

By arrangement with the Grand Trunk and Canadian Pacific Railways, competitors will be carried to and from the Meeting at one fare for the return trip upon applying to the station agent at the starting point for a certificate, which is to be signed at Toronto by the Secretary of the Association as proof that competitors attended the meeting. These reduced fare tickets will be good from August 21st until three days after the close of the Matches.

Competitors from west of Toronto desiring to compete also at D. R. A. Matches, will be sold single tickets to Ottawa, allowing stop over privileges at Toronto.

VII.—QUARTERS.

- 1. Competitors desirous of camping on the ranges may obtain a tent and ten blankets on payment of \$1.50, or a tent alone for \$1.
- 2. Good meals, at reasonable prices, can be obtained at the Competitors' Pavilion on the Ranges.

VIII.-EFFICIENCY.

Non-Commissioned Officers and men competing in the "Canada Company," "Tait-Brassey," and "Gzowski" Matches will be required to produce Certificates from the Commanding Officer or Adjutant of their Corps, stating that they are regularly enrolled and efficient members of the same.

IX.-RIFLES.

The Rifles shall be:

1. Martini-Henri Rifles of bona fide Government pattern, and bearing the Imperial Government viewer's mark.

2. Minin

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2. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.

3. Sights must be strictly in accordance with Government pattern, and may be *temporarily* coloured with black or white, so long as no application of a permanent nature is used; the sliding bar with its three permanent lines may be inverted and used on either side of the flap; *temporary* marks or lines removable at pleasure may be used. No paper or paper sights pasted on sliding bar will be allowed.

4. Any pad or shoe for the heel-plate of the butt, admitting of removal, and thereby allowing of variation at pleasure in the length of the stock, will be disallowed.

5. Slings may be used as an assistance at all matches; but in those restricted to the Militia the slings must be of regulation length (viz., not longer than 54¼ inches, not including the tongue or buckle) and pattern, and attached to the rifles, as in Government arms.

6. Competitors may clean out their rifles, during a competition, between distances only.

7. No competitor shall change his rifle during a match, unless it becomes unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Range Officer.

8. Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

9. No competitor shall load his rifle until he has taken his position at the firing point.

X.—UNIFORM.

In competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their Corps shall be worn, in accordance with the Regulations and Orders of the Militia. (a) Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket. Elbow caps will not be allowed. (b) Trousers. (c) Except when in the act of firing, waist belts must be worn. (d) Regimental head dress worn in the Corps, or a cap which may have been adopted and regularly worn by any Corps. A puggaree may be worn over the head dress, or a cap cover with or without a cap under it. (e) Great coats or waterproofs may be worn over uniforms. (f) In competitions not restricted to the Active Militia, competitors must appear strictly in uniform as above, or wholly in plain clothes.

In the Gzowski Match the above rules shall not apply, as special details for dress are issued.

XI.-AMMUNITION.

In all competitions, except the Revolver and Toronto Railway competition, the cost of the ammunition is included in the cost of entries. The Register Keepers will furnish competitors with the necessary number of rounds at each range. No other ammunition shall be used.

XII.—SIGHTING SHOTS.

One Sighting Shot must be fired at each range in all the Regular Matches (Nos. 1 to 7 inclusive), but will not be allowed in the Revolver, Extra Series, and Scurry Matches. The cost of the Sighting Shot is included with the entries.

XIII.—POSITION.

In the "Standing Position" the whole of the left hand and wrist must be in front of the trigger guard and the left elbow clear of the body. "Kneeling Position" to be the ordinary Military Kneeling Position. No competitor will be allowed to sit on the side of his foot, instead of on the heel, and no article of any kind shall be placed under the instep. Any Position—If back position is used no artificial support to the body external to the clothing will be allowed.

XIV.—TARGETS.

- 1. The size of the targets will be for the regular matches:-
- At 200 yards-
- 4 feet square; Bull's Eye, 8 inches in diameter; Inner, 20 inches in diameter; Magpie, 32 inches in diameter; Outer, remainder of the target.
- At 400, 500 and 600 yards-
- 6 feet square; Bull's Eye, 2 feet in diameter; Inner, 3 feet in diameter; Magpie, 4 feet in diameter; Outer, remainder of the target.
- At 800 and 900 yards-
- 6 feet high by 12 feet wide; Bull's Eye, 3 feet in diameter; Inner, 4 feet 6 inches in diameter; Magpie, 6 feet square; Outer, remainder of the target.
- . For the "Revolver" Match-
 - The Standard Revolver Target will be used. Diameter 12½ inches; Diameter of Bull's Eye, 1¾ inches. Remainder of Target divided into 6 rings, each ring to count from 1 to 6 points; Bull's Eye, 7 points.

XV.—SIGNALLING AND SCORING.

1. Hits will be signalled at the butt and entered on the firing ticket according to the following scale:—

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2. When two shots strike the target simultaneously, both hits will be marked, and that which has the highest value will be given to the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire.

3. In the event of the Marker accidentally displaying more than one signal arm, he shall immediately correct the error, and the marking as finally signalled cannot be questioned; no competitor shall be allowed to claim more than the actual value of his shot by reason of such an error in signalling; but if a shot is not signalled, the competitor shall be entitled to challenge it, and the Range Officer shall telephone to the Non-Commissioned Officer at the butt to examine the target, and the result of such examination shall be final. The competitor thus challenging a shot must deposit the sum of fifty cents, which will be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

4. If on a target being raised the *spotting disc* appears manifestly to disagree with the *signal arm*, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstances to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the Non-Commissioned Officer in charge at the butt, but no deposit will be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.

5. All claims for shots must be made before another shot is fired at the target in question.

6. All alterations of the register must be initialed by the Range Officer, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first telephoned to the butt.

XVI.—PENALTIES AND FINES.

Disqualification.

1. Any competitor-

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d) Who shall offer money or a bribe of any kind to an employé of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or
- (e) Who, being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association, shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council or to the Executive; or
- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider to be discreditable; or
- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having elsewhere been guilty of any of the aforesaid offences;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Executive Committee, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association.

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Exclusion from further Competition during the Meeting.

- 2. Any competitor--
 - (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up; or
 - (b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the ranges, except in accordance with the regulations for shooting; or
 - (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except on the firing points in use, and within the hours of shooting; or
 - (d) Who through his own want of care shall accidentally discharge his rifle; or
 - (e) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous; or
 - (f) Who shall refuse to comply with any order that may be given by the officer in charge of the firing point to which he is detailed;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the Meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

Disallowance of Score.

- 3. Any competitor-
 - (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize; or
 - (b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the Meeting while shooting for any particular prize; or
 - (c) Who, when competing for an aggregate prize, shall omit to enter, or enter incorrectly, his previous score or scores on the ticket provided for the purpose;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed.

Fines.

4. Any competitor who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target shall be fined fifty cents.

XVII.-TIES.

Ties will be decided as follows, except when otherwise specially laid down. (See rule as to ties in El Padle Needles Cigar and Aronsberg competitions, on pages 84 and 86.) In each case should sub-section 1 prove inapplicable, or not decide the tie, then by sub-section 2 and so on, taking each sub-section in succession until the tie can be decided.

IN INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS.

1. If at more than one distance, by the range totals in order of distances, commencing with the longest.

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If still a tie.	2.	By the fewestOuters.	

- " 5. By the value of each shot in inverse order.

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- 1. All Officers of or squad meeting.
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In case of absolute ties:

(a) If for Money Prizes, by division.

(b) If for prizes in kind, by shooting off.

(c) If for Prizes partly in Money and partly in kind, by dividing the money and shooting off for the Prize in kind.

These sub-sections apply also to competitions at single distances.

Note.—In the case of ties in which all concerned will win money prizes of equal value, and in the case of absolute ties not decided by shooting off, the winners' names will be arranged in a bracket.

IN TEAM COMPETITIONS.

- If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in order of distances, commencing with the longest.
- 2. By the fewestOuters.

- 5. By the total of each round in inverse order.
- 6. By the highest scorer in each team shooting off.

XVIII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

Winners of Prizes must apply at the Treasurer's Office on the Ranges for them, and on receiving the amount of such prizes sign a receipt for the same.

XIX.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.

The meeting will be under the direction of a Special Match Committee, composed of five members of the Council, three of whom shall form a quorum, whose decision shall be final and binding in all matters submitted to them for their consideration; but they may, at their discretion, refer any questions to the decision of the Council, in which case the decision of the Council on such questions shall be final.

The Special Match Committee will meet each day at noon gun for "cease fire."

- 1. All competitors will be subject to the Special Match Committee, Officers or Non-Commissioned Officers in charge of their respective ranges or squads, the Camp Police, and the Regulations for the conduct of the meeting.
- 2. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations of the meeting, also with the conditions attached to the prize or prizes for which they have entered, as the plea of ignorance of such regulations and conditions will not be entertained.
- They must refer to the Notice Boards daily, and ascertain whether any orders have been issued which alter or affect the original details.
- 4. They must be present at their proper firing point, ready to fire at the hour named on their firing tickets, and deliver the same to the Register

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Keeper. Unless a competitor produces his firing ticket at the firing point, he will not be allowed to fire. Should a competitor lose his firing ticket, omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, and so by his own neglect miss the opportunity given him of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall have no claim on the Association thereunder.

- 5. The Matches will take place, if possible, at the time named. Any deviation from the rule will be posted on the Board at the Secretary's Office. Temporary discontinuance on account of bad weather will be at the discretion of the Special Match Committee.
- 6. The firing will begin daily at 8.15 a.m., except the first day at 8.30, a.m., and cease at 6.00 p.m.
- 7. Two guns will be fired for the firing to commence, one ten minutes before the named hour, to warn competitors to move to the firing points; the second being the signal that firing is to begin. Two guns also at the "Cease Fire," one ten minutes before the named hour, after which no competitor will be allowed to begin his score; the second as a signal that all the scores begun before the first gun are completed.
 - 8. "Blowing-off" will not be allowed.
- 9. Every competitor must enter and shoot under his own name, and unless otherwise specified, not oftener than once for any prize.
- 10. No member of a squad or firing party shall absent himself without leave during firing. Any competitor delaying the squad will be passed by.
- 11. In all competitions except "The Gzowski" competitors will be formed up by threes, according to the numbers on their firing tickets, viz., the lowest number on the left, the highest on the right, the intermediate numbers in the middle, and fire shot and shot alternately, commencing from the left. Only competitors firing will be allowed within the firing ropes. No person, except the Register Keeper, or Officers on duty, will be permitted to speak or offer any advice to a competitor after he has taken his place at the firing point.
- 12. Where only one competitor is present he must fire his shots without undue delay; but the Range Officer or some one named by him must witness the shooting and countersign the Register.
- 13. Register Keepers are required to call out the value of each shot fired, and the competitors must see that their scores are correctly entered on the Score Board, so that any objection to the score recorded may be investigated before the next shot is fired. The Range Officer is required to see that each score recorded on the firing ticket corresponds with that on the Score Board.
- 14. In individual competitions, a competitor may use a binocular or telescope, not mounted on any kind of stand, provided his doing so does not delay the firing.
- 15. In all team competitions (the Gzowski excepted) the Captain or Officer in command of a Team, and in individual aggregate competitions, viz., the Mulock, Nursery Aggregate, and No. 1 Extra Series, the competitor must hand in to the Statistical Office a claim card, with the scores

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etain or etitions, ne come scores made by the Team or individual, as the case may be, duly completed and signed within one hour after the conclusion of the match, otherwise the scores will not be allowed.

- 16. Any competitor protesting against the ruling of a Range Officer, or feeling himself aggrieved in any way, must make a statement of his grievances in writing, giving the names of two or more persons who can bear him out in his statements, and hand it to the Secretary; but the firing must not be delayed for that purpose.
- 17. No practice will be allowed on the ranges during the continuance of the meeting, either before or after the day's firing.
