FIRST EDITION. IS IN TERROR OF HIS LIFE. A WITNESS OF THE HENNESSY MURDER ASKS FOR PROTECTION.

New Orleans Police Claims to be Making Great Progress in the Case and to Have the Assassins in Jail—He Declares the Mafia-Branches in Many Cities.

At the moment that Hennessy was arrested, Macheux and the four assassins were at a public supper at Faber's saloon, so that an ally, so far as the murder itself is concerned, is proved. Macheux was seen four times, at 4 o'clock in the morning, in the rear of the city, in consultation with several suspicious Italian.

Mr. A. J. Penler, who saw the shooting of Hennessy from the gallery of his house at Giro and Beas streets, and who has identified several of the assassins, has called upon the mayor, and asked for and been assured of police protection. He stated that he had been afraid to go about the city, especially in the neighborhood of his home, alone.
