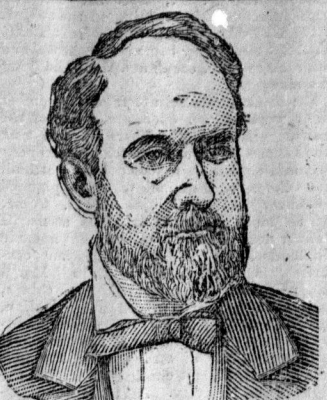


TELEGRAPHIC BREVITIES
