

Engineer Wilmot on Tuesday.

At the request of the council, City Engineer Wilmot, at the meeting on Tuesday submitted the plan of a cause-way across James Bay, the estimated cost of which is \$110,000. The plan calls for a 70-foot permanent roadway, and a concrete or masonry retaining wall. The latter would stand on a foundation of piles and a filling of gravel. It would first be necessary to remove the mud, then drive the piles into the hard bottom and fill the spaces between them with gravel. This is the plan as drawn under directions from the council what Mr. Wilmot recommended in a recent report was the building of the mud flats by pumping mud from the harbor into the basin behind the barbor into the basin behind the bridge. The cost of the arch bridge would be about \$115,000.
