Curtains Made of Glass.

Glass curtains, observes London Inventions, are a novelty in household furnishings. They are in colored glass, and have the effect, when closed, of stained glass. They consist of a series of little squares of colored glass, each set in a small zinc frame, the squares being attached to each other at the four corners by little S-shaped hooks. We are told that they can be as easily taken down and moved as any other curtains, and, in case of changing from one size of window to another, can easily be enlarged or decreased in size by the addition or subtraction of a certain number of squares. They are also easily cleaned, and one of their particular attractions is said to be cheapness.

An important scheme for the transmission of power is now being considered in Switzerland. It is proposed to dam the River Reusse and convey the water to a storage and distributing reservoir having a capacity of 3,000,000 cubic feet, and situated at Combe Garrot. From here the water is to be distributed to the communities of Neufchatel, Loche and La Chaux-de-Fonds. The power will be distributed from the turbine stations by electricity, the distances being from 7½ to 11 miles.


