The attention of the editor has been called to a letter in the Outlook of September 16th, wherein the Hon. J. H. Jackson criticises a Montreal editorial on the Pacific.

To criticise was his privilege, but we doubt much if the scale of public opinion which his criticism is of greater weight than the paragraph criticized.

The editor has faith in the ability of the government to successfully grapple with the question of revenue and prohibitory liquor law, and humbly submits that Mr. Jackson's "faith without works" quotation has been improperly applied.

A true knowledge of the financial situation under prohibition will hardly be obtained till the experiment has been made, but our critic has surely not forgotten that our critic has imperial statements, both recognized as capable and clever men, on record as expressing the belief that it would not be difficult to administer the financial affairs of the people.

Mr. Jackson forgets that prohibition does not necessarily mean an absolute loss of \$7,000,000 a year in the Dominion revenue; there are saving clauses, which when applied directly to the financial problem will overbalance the loss.

Many of the arguments of prohibition are sound, and are more the loss of revenue than the loss of revenue in parliament. Mr. Jackson is as familiar with them as the average reader, and his reproduction here is unnecessary, and takes an unnecessary space.
