Parish Notes.

The Rev. J. F. Rounthwaite has accepted the position of Assistant Curate of St. George's Parish and will enter upon his duties on Sunday the 12th inst. We bespeak for Mr. Rounthwaite a kindly welcome from St. George's parishioners.

We have been asked by a member of the W. A. to correct a statement made in last month's magazine, viz.: that it seemed strange "that *all* the money collected and energy displayed by the Auxiliary, should go to remote parishes in the North-West." It seems that all the money does *not* go to the North-West but also to Diocesan Missions and to Algoma. The fact still remains that so much may be done for, and given to outside objects as to practically cripple parochial resources.
