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## TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

SIR:—

In consequence of the notice you have been pleased to give on the part of the United States to Her Britannic Majesty's Government concerning the abrogation of the Fishery Clauses of the Treaty of Washington, I respectfully ask permission to submit a brief description of certain proceedings pertaining to the matter.

As in duty bound I have sought the opportunity to display these proceedings to the Imperial Government as well as to the Canadian Government, but my efforts have hitherto been fruitless.

The proceedings relate to deceptions practised upon the Governments of the United States and the United Kingdom of which no public mention has yet been made, the full proof having only been very recently discovered by me.

The magnitude and atrocious character of these deceptions and their influence on the spread of unbelief, distress and crime, throw into the shade the impostures already revealed concerning the official records of the United States and Canada.

The duty which compels me to make this open declaration manifests itself as a necessary outcome of the character of the discoveries and proofs herewith respectfully submitted.

As this letter will contain a very brief summary only of the deceptions referred to, I shall adopt the arrangement best suited for precise exposition.

Prior printed communications which I have addressed to the Governments of the United States and Her Britannic Majesty, including the Canadian Government, supply the necessary data for filling the place of any omissions which may appear to a novice in the matter, requisite to complete the chain of evidence respectfully submitted.

### PART I.

In general terms it may be stated that nefarious work has been secretly carried on against the interests of the United States for several years in the joint falsification of United States and Canadian Records of Government, and the masking of the frauds by the use of figures apparently taken from the thirteenth Chapter of the Revelation of St. John the Divine.

The masking figures employed by the conspirators are to be found in the following verses of the thirteenth Chapter of Revelation, or are compounded from figures therein contained.

#### The Number 666.

"Here is wisdom. Let him that hath understanding count the number of the beast: for it is the number of a man; and his number is SIX HUNDRED THREESCORE AND SIX."—(Verse 18).

#### The Number 42.

"And there was given unto him a mouth speaking great things and blasphemies; and power was given unto him to continue FORTY and Two months."—(Verse 5). (42 months, or 168 weeks, or 1176 days).

#### The Number 2.

"And I beheld ANOTHER beast coming up out of the earth; and he had Two horns like a lamb, and he spake as a dragon."—(Verse 11).

#### The Numbers 7 and 10.

"And I stood upon the sand of the sea, and saw a beast rise up out of the sea, having SEVEN heads and TEN horns, and upon his horns TEN crowns, and upon his heads the name of blasphemy."—(Verse 1).

As the result of various endeavours I must state that I have arrived at the conclusion that no other group of figures but those named, (666, 42, 10, 7 and 2) will satisfy the conditions required in the perpetration and masking of the Frauds herewith exposed. The occurrence of this group in well-known sacred writings suggests conclusions which any and every honest believer in Christianity will willingly reject should any other explanation of the agreement be reasonably admissable. Of the frauds there is, unfortunately, no possible doubt.



In the published letters I had the honour to address to the Hon. F. T. Frelinghuysen, Secretary of State, dated Oct. 16th, 1882, Nov. 1st, 1882, Nov. 30th, 1882, I pointed out with considerable detail, the concerted agreement between the Canadian and United States Export and Import figures during the fiscal year 1872-73. I now turn to the year 1874, which exhibits further developments of surprising concerted fraud.

During the fiscal year 1873-74, as manifested by their work when analyzed, the conspirators adopted two standards, by which to adjust their forged returns. These standards are as subjoined:—

Mr. Commissioner Johnson of the Canadian Customs Department revealed his work by the abstraction of \$666,303 from the Exports of the Province of Quebec in 1874, as shown by the document entitled "Appendix—Memorandum concerning Article XXI of the Treaty of Washington." This fact is illustrated on page 19 of the Congressional Record for January 7th, 1881, (a) being a copy of my published letter to the Governor General of Canada, entitled "Falsified Departmental Reports," dated Nov. 23rd, 1880, page 34, which letter formed the subject of very distressing discussion and deception in the Senate and Commons of Canada. The record will attach itself to the life history of the misguided speakers and conscious hearers. (1)

The subtraction of 666,303 from 969,969, revealed the guide or standard, 303,666, (being 666,303 reversed,) of Dr. Edward Young, Chief of the Bureau of Statistics at Washington.

Mr. Hamilton Andrews Hill of Boston, who prepared the Exhibits presented at Halifax for the Government of the United States from Dr. Young's official figures, accidentally omitted in his enumeration of the United States Fish Exports in 1874, certain free Foreign articles exported by the United States to Canada in that year.

Mr. Hill gave \$79,153 (2) as the total value of the Foreign and Domestic United States Exports of Fish to the Dominion of Canada in 1874, omitting the Free Foreign items.

The addition of these items makes a total of \$86,799 instead of \$79,133, an unimportant difference *per se*, but when the omission is added to the total Foreign and Domestic Exports of Fish and Shell Fish

According to the official trade returns these figures have been distorted to the following extent:— The imports from the United States are about \$110,000, or 16 per cent. *in excess* of the trade returns. (See page 8.) The exports to other countries are more than half a million dollars, or 24 per cent. *less* than the trade returns. The total exports are consequently more than half a million dollars short in 1874.

The several provinces have been defrauded by the compiler of this table to the following extent:—

to the Dominion, the clue to the secret of the conception and composition of both the United States and Canadian figures is revealed, as presented below.

Total U. S. For. and Dom. Exp. of Fish and Shell Fish to the Dominion, \$158, | 969  
Deduct Mr. Hill's omitted items, 7, | 666

Remainder, 151, | 303

The figures to the right of the line form the half of the reversible quantity 969,969 and its components 666.303; 303,666. Thus—

969, | 969 The total Fish Trade Standard.  
303, | 666 Dr. Young's Standard.  
666, | 303 Mr. Johnson's Standard.

After much continuous labour I have ascertained beyond doubt that these figures are derived from the number 666 as hereafter shown, and form the basis of the fraud it now becomes my positive duty to expose. I shall prove:—

*First*—That the United States and Canadian Fish Trade aggregates for several years are forgeries against the interests of the United States in the matter under review, forming by the aid of masking numbers an arithmetical proportion with the above standards.

*Second*—That the relation of these forged aggregates is masked or concealed by selected numbers also in arithmetical proportion.

*Third*—That certain palpably fraudulent, or omitted entries, or abstractions from Exports, are similarly related to the same standards or masking numbers.

*Fourth*—That these and other deceptions have been effected in the Bureau of Statistics of the Treasury Department of the United States and in the Department of Customs at Ottawa, by joint and concerted use of numbers identical with those found in the thirteenth Chapter of Revelation already cited.

Before I explain the system I must illustrate its application and power by means of examples, both with the figures as used by the conspirators and by reversing the figures and producing the same results.

I attach a full table of United States Exports of Fish, Shell Fish, Fish Oil, and Products of the Sea to all British North and South America for the year 1874. The masking items are contained in the section headed "Products of the Sea" and include the items,

Sperm to Quebec, &c., \$945  
Sperm to British West Indies, &c., 210  
Whalebone to Quebec, &c., 838

The full Canadian alleged Fish, Shell Fish, Fish Oil, and Products of the Sea Imports from the United States for the year 1874 are given in my letter to the Canadian Secretary of State dated Feb. 8th, 1883, herewith respectfully enclosed.

## I.

THE RELATION OF THE UNITED STATES EXPORTS AND THE CANADIAN IMPORTS OF 1874 TO THE GENERAL STANDARD 969,969, AND THE MASKING QUANTITY 731.

Therefore the four quantities are in arithmetical proportion, and the Canadian Imports less the masking number 368 are as much greater than 666,303, as 303,666 are greater than the United States Exports less the masking number 363. (5)

(1) The origin and relation of this number is shown in Example XX.

(5) The reader must distinguish between an arithmetical proportion and a geometrical proportion. The value of an arithmetical proportion is the difference between the terms of the ratios; the value of a geometrical proportion is the quotient of the terms of the ratios. In an arithmetical proportion the sum of the extremes is equal to the sum of the means, in a geometrical proportion the product of the extremes is equal to the product of the means. It is a geometrical proportion which is used in the ordinary "Rule of Three."

NOTE—Unless specially mentioned, the term Canadian Imports from the United States, relates only to the Imports by the Provinces concerned in the Treaty of Washington and to the quantities sworn to in evidence at Halifax in 1877.

The relation may be expressed as follows:—

$$728,553 - 666,303 = 303,666 - 241,416$$

$$\text{and } 728,553 \text{ plus } 241,416 = 666,303 \text{ plus } 303,666$$

THE RELATION OF THE UNITED STATES EXPORTS AND THE CANADIAN IMPORTS TO THE SPECIAL STANDARDS  
666,303, 303,666 AND CERTAIN FRAUDULENT ENTRIES.

It will be observed that the quantity \$109,213—the value of the "Furs, Skins and Tails—undressed," recorded in the Canadian Trade and Navigation Returns, would not have satisfied the conditions, but produced another number besides 666,303, namely, 666,305. The conspirators added 2 to the transformed items. One method of effecting this fraud and masking it, is pointed out with some detail in my published letter entitled "Falsified Departmental Reports," addressed to the Governor-General of Canada dated Nov. 23rd, 1880. This artifice is so important that I reproduce the extract from my letter.

"On page 418 of the "Correspondence respecting the Halifax Fisheries Commission," we find the imports of Fish and Fish Oil from the United States into the Dominion of Canada given as amounting to \$728,921 in the year 1874. The sum \$728,921, is made up of the following details:—

"When we compare these figures with the sums total of the fish items for each Province in the Trade and Navigation Reports for 1874, we find that

Ontario has, - - - - -	119 dollars too much.

Total, - - - \$110,268 too much.

On page 369 we find the transformed entry, "Furs and Skins, the produce of fish or MARINE ANIMALS" imported from the United States, \$110,256, which number is made up of the following:

"Furs, Skins and Tails—undressed"—Imported from United States,

Quebec, - - - - -	\$109,213, page 115
Nova Scotia, - - - - -	330, " 170
New Brunswick, - - - - -	713, " 217

Total, - - - \$110,256

"These Terrestrial items being thus transformed into a Marine item, were then added to the Fish imports from the United States in the proportion given."

Especial attention is directed to the addition of the number 2 to the alleged imports of Quebec. Quebec has \$109,215 too much, and the transformed entry is only \$109,213. This is an important feature, which will be noticed subsequently. The 2 (horns) are incorruptible elements of proof. They appear in 1875, and are partly developed in Example XXXVII, and Example XL, to which the reader is referred. Dr. Young must have known all about "Appendix—Memorandum."

Of course the converse is true, so that when from this number 303,666 the United States unmasked imports of Fish and Shell Fish are deducted, we get the fraudulent item,

Furs, Skins and Tails—undressed, \$109,215

which were added to the imports of Quebec from the United States; and when from 303,666 we deduct Furs, Skins and Tails—undressed" we get the United States Fish Exports less the masking items "Sperm."

These relations show that Dr. Edward Young, the United States Chief of the Bureau of Statistics, knew all about the contemplated use of the number 666,303.

There is no other printed public document in existence besides "Appendix—Memorandum concerning Article XXI of the Treaty of Washington" which reveals the details of this transaction; and no other means exist of knowing that while the total of \$672,849 were abstracted from Dominion Exports, that of this number \$666,303 were apportioned to Quebec, \$1,003 to New Brunswick and \$5,543 to Nova Scotia.

Dr. Edward Young also knew all about the use of "Furs, Skins and Tails—undressed"; for there is no other printed public document in existence besides "Appendix—Memorandum concerning Article XXI of the Treaty of Washington" which reveals that of the quantity \$110,258, the sum of \$330 was apportioned to Nova Scotia, \$119 to Ontario, \$109,215 to Quebec and \$594 to New Brunswick, *the quantity being added to one of the transformed items.*

This is an inexorable but horrible conclusion, which the circumstances of the case force upon the conscientious analyst, for it will be observed that the additions to the Canadian Exports do not conform to the fabricated entries: but the entries are divided among the separate Provinces as shown in the extract from my letter to the Governor-General and in the Documents cited. Without this knowledge it would have been impossible for Dr. Edward Young to have so adjusted the U. S. annual Records of Exports that they exactly coincide, both in aggregates and in parts, not only with the Canadian Figures, but with the Standards, with the Frauds, and with all combined.

II.

THE RELATION OF PARTS OF THE UNITED STATES AND CANADIAN EXPORTS AND IMPORTS TO THE MASKING QUANTITIES.

This number, 908,082 possesses remarkable relations. It is derived from the sum of the United States Exports to all British North and South America and Mr. Johnson's Standard 666,303, thus:—

This number reveals the properties of the figures composing the United States *details* of Exports as exhibited in the following *reversions* of these figures.

*First*—From 303,666 take the masking number 838, (Whalebone) the remainder, which I call the First Remainder, is 302,828.

*Second*—Reverse 151,303, the United States total Foreign and Domestic Exports to Canada, less the Free Foreign Articles omitted by Mr. H. A. Hill. It becomes 303,151. From this quantity also take 838, (Whalebone) The second remainder is 302,313.

*Third*—Reverse 151,303 a second time, and from 303,151 take 210, (Sperm) one of the masking quantities. The third remainder is 302,941.

These are necessary results arising from the artificial structure of the numbers employed. They may be varied to a great extent with surprising results. Put in the form of six-sided squares the numbers may be made to read up and down or down and up with the same results, giving the Canadian Imports or the United States Exports vertically. By reversing the figures and deducting or adding the embodied masking numbers very curious and interesting combinations appear, which it would be out of place to introduce here.

One curious illustration of the effect of reversing the figures employed by the conspirators I beg to submit, because it reveals the importance of the masking number 731, whose origin is deplorable.

EXAMPLE XV.

The United States total Exports to all British North and South America, less the masking number 731, amount to \$241,048. (See Example II)

By this method of taking to pieces all the masking numbers can be discovered. The deduction is of importance in regard to the conception of the entire Fraud and its relation to the number 666, which forms the basis of the whole, as shown in the next example.

THE NUMBER 666, THE BASIS OF THE FRAUDS.

EXAMPLE XVII.

Divide 666 into two parts as below :—

This is the RATIO the conspirators adopted for Imports and Exports, and it is written 666,303—303,666.

The relation of the elements of this Ratio to the Masking Numbers is shown in the next example and in the MASKING SERIES.

It is shown in Example III. that the United States and Canadian Exports and Imports, when the Masking Numbers 368 and 363 are deducted, form with these quantities an ARITHMETICAL PROPORTION, and that their sums are equal. Therefore they are couplets in the same arithmetical proportion. It will be further observed that the subtrahend is the reverse of the figures from which it is taken, and that the system on the right is identical with the figures revealed by the omission of Mr. H. A. Hill.

THE RELATION OF THE MASKING NUMBERS.

EXAMPLE XVIII.

The number 368 is an important quantity in this matter. By an independent process and by use of the quantity 368 with the details of the Canadian Imports from the United States, I proved in my published letter, dated Feb. 8th, 1883, addressed to the Canadian Secretary of State, that the Canadian figures of 1874, when properly grouped with the masking number 368, were exact multiples of the United States figures, and that the sums of the entries taken two together, three together, four together, &c., formed an arithmetical progression with 10 as a common difference. But the proportion existing between each group of two successive terms in an arithmetical progression is an arithmetical proportion. The number 368 is not an arbitrary quantity, selected at chance, but a quantity determined by its relation to one element of the ratio, and the remaining numbers of the Masking Series. The number 731 is similarly related, as shown in Example XXIII.

The connecting link between the 45 entries in the United States Table of Exports and the 100 entries in the Canadian Table of Imports, I have explained in prior communications. (10) The items are interchangeable, the Canadian entries or items being susceptible of expression in terms of the United States entries or items, and the United States entries or items being susceptible of expression in terms of the Canadian entries or items. Also, that this perfect agreement may be secured by a properly prepared "ready reckoner" for adjusting the entries in the direction of probable commercial interchange.

In my third letter to the U. S. Secretary of State, dated Nov. 30th, 1882, in which I expose the system in relation to each single entry, I showed that Mr. Commissioner Johnson's Fish Oils of 1877, were actually manufactured from Dr. Young's Series of 1872-73 during the sittings of the Commission, and were used by Council in their arguments, being part of the quantity \$750,382, which is to be found on page 77 of the Documents and Proceedings of the Halifax Commission. So that while the peaceful contention was in progress between two foremost Nations, false evidence was being officially manufactured at Ottawa on the basis of the figures of 1872-73, to be used in the name of Her Majesty the Queen.

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CANADIAN IMPORTS AND UNITED STATES EXPORTS.  
EXAMPLE XXII.

The quantity \$3584 is the difference between the Canadian alleged Imports and three times the United States alleged Exports, thus:—

THE RELATION OF THE FRAUDULENT ABSTRACTIONS FROM CANADIAN EXPORTS TO THE NUMBERS DERIVED FROM THE 13TH CHAPTER OF REVELATION.

If any one of these ratios be disturbed, the relation of the whole will be disturbed, and no other numbers will satisfy *all* the conditions, for some of the terms or their differences in each one of the proportions, appear in other proportions or as entries either in the United States Exports or Canadian Imports.

Therefore, to alter one figure, even by unity, is equivalent to altering the tables of alleged Custom House entries of both countries, and to change the entire result.

The whole conception is a fraud, embodying palpably fraudulent Custom House entries. The fraud is masked by a group of notable numbers, which numbers have been for many centuries openly and warningly applied through the hallowed instrumentality of DIVINE INSPIRATION, and are widely known as occurring in a limited portion of Sacred Writings.

It appears to be irrational to assume that the perpetrators of a secretly arranged and artfully masked fraud of vast proportions should employ this group of notable numbers, and use them still grouped together for the purpose of concealing fraud, without intentional appropriation.

Nevertheless, it being impossible to define and limit accurately the bent of human thought, although the agreement so far is most striking and exact, yet the benefit of any doubt attaching to what appears to be an added and most sacrilegious scorn of truth, must be given to the unfortunate and misguided culprits.

Meanwhile I turn to the records of the years 1873 and 1875.

THE YEAR 1873.

Therefore twice the recorded United States Exports to all British America in 1873, and twice the recorded Canadian Imports from the United States in 1873, sworn to at Halifax in 1877, added to the omitted recorded quantities in 1873, make up the Standard 969,969. Consequently the fraud of 1873-4 was preceded by the fraud of 1872-3.

If any one of the quantities 358, 73 or 1455 be changed even by unity, this exact relation cannot be carried out. But these are alleged Custom House entries, falsely used in 1872-3 for the purpose of fraud and they form part of the aggregates which make up the quantity 969,969; therefore any change, even by unity, in any one of the entries so used, would destroy the relation of the whole.

It can be shown that the Fraud of 1874 was another form of the Fraud of 1873 by combining numbers of 1874 with those of 1873 reversed, and deducing the masking number 731 of 1874.

It would be out of place to discuss the theory of the process of reversion, which is contrary to all received relations of figures in practical life; it is essential only to prove the fact. Competent arithmeticians will understand that it arises from the artificial structure of the numbers employed and their relation to 666,303, 303,666 and 969,969. It is a dangerous and dishonest artifice in Government or in private records. I have deduced an Algebraical formula which discloses other properties.

This example is introduced to show that the conspirators might have selected other ratios than those formed from the number 666, and other masking numbers than those identical with the figures in the 13th Chapter of Revelation.

The ratio 632,337—337,632 is derived from the aggregate United States Exports and the Canadian Imports with their figures reversed. It remains to be seen what the real ratio is with their figures in the normal position. I must first show how the omitted quantity 20,419 can be derived from the ratio 666,303—303,666.

EXAMPLE XXXIV.

The quantity 20,419 being the value of the items omitted from the Canadian accounts submitted at Halifax is obtained in the following manner:—

And the four quantities form an arithmetical proportion :—

$$666,303 - 558,098 = 411,871 - 303,666$$

Taken in connection with Dr. Young's details of the Fish Trade of 1872-3 as worked out from his own figures in the accompanying MS. Table, (1) it follows from these exact relations that Dr. Edw. Young, while in the Bureau of Statistics at Washington, must have known all about the quantity \$20,411 the substituted land items enumerated; and the ratio derived from 666, with the masking numbers employed—and this knowledge he possessed during the fiscal year 1872-3, adjusting his Custom House entries to the ratio, as shown in cited communications to the United States Secretary of State and in the accompanying MS. Table.

Changing the signs :—

$$558,098 - 666,303 = 303,666 - 411,871$$

Therefore; double the Canadian Imports in 1873 are as much less than 666,303, as 303,666 are than double the United States Exports added to Canadian omitted articles.

By Example XXI, in the year 1874 :—

$$728,553 - 666,303 = 303,666 - 241,416$$

$$\text{Therefore, } 728,553 - 411,871 = 558,098 - 241,416$$

Consequently the sum of the unmasked Canadian and United States Imports and Exports of 1873 exactly double the sum of the masked Canadian Imports and United States Exports of 1873, with omitted items added.

These precise relations prove the correctness of the additions and subtractions of the values employed. Also, that if one single entry in the United States Commerce and Navigation Reports or the Canadian Trade and Navigation Returns be altered by unity only, all of these ratios and their relations to the number 666,303—303,666, or to the number 666, or to the numbers 42, 10, 7 and 2 will be destroyed.

It is quite unnecessary to give further illustrations to show that under the official supervision of Hon. Isaac Burpee and Mr. Commissioner Johnson the system pursued in 1873-4 was but a repetition of the system pursued in 1872-3 under the official supervision of Sir Leonard Tilley and Mr. Commissioner Bouchette, in both cases acting in concert with Dr. Edward Young of the United States Bureau of Statistics at Washington.

#### THE YEAR 1875.

#### THE ALLEGED CANADIAN IMPORTS FROM THE UNITED STATES IN 1875.

#### EXAMPLE XXXVI.

Referring to the remarks attached to Example V, it will be seen that the quantity \$728,921 representing the Canadian Imports from the United States is 2 two much.

Deducting 2 from \$728,921, there remains \$728,919 as the correct addition of the transformed and not transformed entries.

The effect of the addition of 2 to the alleged imports of 1874 is shown in Example V, it being borne in mind that if the subtraction had been made from 728,921 instead of 728,919, the remainder would have been 1334. This is important because 1334 appears in other relations, as seen in Example XXXVIII.

But 838 is the United States denominational entry "Whalebone" which is equal to 666, 168 and 4. Therefore 1555 is the same as 666X2, 42 (months), X4, 4 (weeks), 42 (months) 7 (heads) and 2 (horns).

THE DIFFERENCE—EXAMPLE XXXVIII.

The difference can also be obtained directly from the relation of the Exports of 1874 to those of 1875 concealed by the Masking Numbers; one operation thus proving the other, and the correctness of additions and conclusions, as well as proving that the frauds of 1873, 1874 and 1875 are of one and the same character, the Masking quantities being practically the same, because the ratios of certain different Masking numbers are equal. This Example shows clearly the effect of equivalent arithmetical ratios.

Therefore the entire Fish Trade of 1875 of Canada and the United States as represented, is as much greater than the Standard, as the unmasked United States Exports of 1875 are greater than the unmasked United States Exports of 1874.

Dr. Edward Young, in the Bureau of Statistics at Washington, must have known in 1875 all about the Canadian contemplated omissions of the foregoing items from the accounts to be presented at the approaching Halifax Commission, or he could not have exactly adjusted the United States accounts to suit the Canadian figures. His published items of Fish and Shell Fish Exports in the Commerce and Navigation Reports for 1874, are all made up from his Custom House Entry Series of 1872-3—namely, the Series 3 to 989 inclusive, as described in my letter to the Hon. F. T. Freylinghuysen, before cited.

If any one of these quantities be changed even by unity, all must be changed, for they are mutually dependant. But the figures in II are a group by themselves in sacred association, and inseparably linked with **666**, and with the ratio 666,303 — 303,666.

The other masking numbers will be found in Example XXIII and in the "Preliminary Table Ratios."

I have limited the exposition of these frightful characteristics to the Exports of the United States and all British North and South America only, but I regret to say that they extend to certain records of the United States Exports to other countries. Application is seen in the questions relating to remission of duties, and the table of percentages found at the bottom of page 1879 in the tainted "Documents and Proceedings of the "Halifax Commission."

I have also reason to think that the ratio 666,303—303,666 is of much wider application, and is being introduced into our morality and religion with consuming power.

CONCLUSION.

No other figures will satisfy all the conditions involved in this vast imposition. The arithmetical proportions are convincing. The analogy is so striking that appropriation suggests itself at once. The impression is strengthened by the relation of 168 (weeks) to 4 times 42 months; 210 to 168 and 42; 368 and 10 to 368; all the numerical relations shown in Example XXIII, together with the fact that the numbers exactly make up the differences and the fraudulent items noticed in Example XXIV. But the arithmetical proportions cast doubt aside. If there were one failure in all the relations I have pointed out or in any necessary relation, it might justly be urged as an objection to the view of appropriation, but as far as I have been able to analyze the relations, there is no failure.

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These figures are the same as those mysterious and symbolical numbers which are displayed in the Book of Life. They have been impiously appropriated to mask a gigantic and long continued international Fraud.

A Fraud which lingers still, only awaiting further application—a Fraud which was consciously submitted under solemn oath, thus falsely attesting belief in the Providence of God and hypocritically invoking the countenance of the DIVINE AUTHOR of that wonderful message to man it further defames. (a)

All this took place secretly, and as long as it remains officially unrecognized it is still taking place between Christian Nations of the same origin and blood, of the same language and spirit, in a time of profound peace, under professions of mutual esteem, and when "*silent leges inter arma*" has no longer force.

These Christian Nations acknowledge the same beneficent God; they number one hundred millions of people. Time and again they offer to HIM thanksgiving for blessings conferred, and on bended knee humbly solicit a continuance of His mercies.

A few misguided men have thought that human reason is enough for man, and possessing the power and opportunity, have disregarded for selfish purposes, the moral and material rights of one hundred millions of people they were bound honestly to serve, overlooking, in their agnostic blindness, that the "HEADS," from which spring the "HORNS" wearing the "CROWNS," bear "THE NAME OF BLASPHEMY."

## PART II.

In the gross presence of this amazing contempt for the religious impulses of two great nations and the cherished faith of millions of individuals, apart from all considerations of honesty or comity, is it not incumbent on every real believer in Providence who possesses the opportunity, to survey the ground covered by this momentous fraud, and gather a proper conception of its design, its influence, its evil tendencies and how, if officially condoned, it may affect the faith and lives of those millions who are subjected to the authority or moneyed influence of men who are led by the pernicious principles and selfish allurements the number 666 upholds?

What I have revealed of my discoveries is but as the vestibule of a gilded temple, in which neither God, or Reason, or Human Heroism, or Human Virtues are worshipped or symbolized, but simply—  
SAMMON.

It is not just that on a single unaided man should be thrown the responsibility of tearing the tapestry aside which masks the entrance. It is now easily torn aside, but it is a work of great labour to catalogue and describe the objects exposed to view.

It is enough for me to have proved that there is an unfulfilled State duty of great moment which affects the culture, the relations and the religion of the English-speaking race, and a duty which requires the aid of many men and many differently moulded minds, sufficiently independent and fearless as to look cogent and iron-clad fraud full in the face and say—"you shall not prevail."

Therefore, I forbear or delay what ought to be the second part of this letter, developing further gross State Frauds based on the number 666 and its associated emblems; because I trust that those in authority whose records have been defamed by their sacrilegious application will publicly take the matter up.

I pass on to the object of my presuming to address the President of the United States on this subject.

I assume that the "Fisheries Question," as far as the "Ante Treaty Status" is concerned is practically settled.

The exclusive rights to the North American Fisheries are shamefully lost to Canada.

No Government of Her Majesty would attempt to defend the diplomacy of "Appendix—Memoran-

dum concerning Article XXI of the Treaty of Washington," or the invasion of the United States Bureau of Statistics and the secret introduction under alien influence, however assisted, into the official documents of the United States, Canada and Imperial England of the ratio derived from the number 666, and of kindred masking numbers so fearfully related.

No christian English Government would wish to defend a false oath administered for the nation; suborned official witness; perjured testimony proffered and accepted in the name of Her Majesty the Queen; and an award stolen under these blighting conditions.

No unfettered Imperial Statesman breathing the breath of a free born Englishman, and even without hereditary and unearned power, with centuries of history behind him, could so stretch the pander license of any Colonial "responsible" Government, as openly to defend the prostitution I have described, and contemplate the repetition, as manifested by the official announcement elsewhere referred to, (1) of these blasphemous indignities in the name of Englishmen.

But that which gives present strength and power to all this wickedness and this secret injustice to those of our free-born race who acknowledge the Providence of God, is the apparent inertness of the Government of the United States, and the tranquility of the leaders of public opinion.

This has been a most sagacious and doubtless justifiable policy under the hitherto known circumstances, which did not comprehend any knowledge of the use of the ratio 666,303—303,666; and further, because it has been associated from the first, with marked protest on the part of the Government of the United States, coupled with frequent and courteous warnings by the United States Press.

But while it is certain that different United States Governments have been successfully kept in ignorance of the magnitude and blasphemous character of a portion of the deceptions which have been practiced, this lack of information may also be properly regarded as a providential occurrence, permitted for wise and beneficent purpose, until the proper hour should arrive.

I subjoin one of the most recent illustrations of the manner in which these warnings have been received by certain of the Canadian Press, and how a portion of that Press has been unconsciously used to deceive the Canadian and British Public. The extract is from the *St. John Telegraph*, the recognized organ of the Hon. Isaac Burpee, the Minister of Customs, under whose official supervision the Canadian Customs Returns of 1874 were falsified, in continuation of and in sympathy with the pre-existing fraud practised under the official supervision of Sir Leonard Tilley and his allies.

(EXTRACT.)

"Professor Hind has published some more letters about the Fishery Award, and has managed to secure a title from each of the leading New York dailies, which agree that Canada ought to meet the Professor's charges of fraud and answer them once and for all. But it is not probable that Canada will do anything of the sort. The charges have been published far and wide, and if anybody has read them, which is doubtful, no one has believed them. The Professor is very much in earnest, but not one of the very distinguished people whom he has addressed has thought his case worthy of attention. Our New York contemporaries refrain from discussing the charges, on the alleged reason that, having suffered by the so-called frauds, the United States ought not to seek to expose them. This may be all right so far as the United States government goes, but that the United States press would miss the chance of ventilating a \$5,000,000 steal on the part of Canada is asking a little too much from our credulity. The best proof that Professor Hind is making much ado about nothing is the New York papers dismiss him with a paragraph or two."—[*St. John Telegraph*, Aug. 13th, 1883.

Other viciously misleading statements have appeared in papers under the control of the last named Statesman and his money-mongering friends. Hence it happens that the leaders and certain misled organs of both political parties in Canada became entangled in the same abuse of trust and pursuit of unhallowed power or gain.

So far back as the 2nd Sept., 1879, I ventured to bring under the notice of Lord Salisbury (Letter No. 62, herewith submitted,) the bearing of the remarkable passage in Mr. Secretary Everts' despatch dated Sept. 27th, 1878, which coming directly after the dismissal of Dr. Edward Young from the Bureau of Statistics, was well calculated to arouse suspicions that what I had already pointed out to the late Sir A. J. Smith and others, had been discovered at Washington.

"That which relates to the maintenance of good understanding and good neighbourhood between the United States and the British North American Provinces can, least of all things, be admitted as a titimable element in a pecuniary compensation. The importance of such maintenance of good understanding and good neighbourhood the United States will never undervalue."

The ruthless abuse of the time-honoured principle "Fear God and honor the King," has led within in Canada to that disreputable misrule and official untruth which is the prelude to a fading belief in the Providence of God.

These are three cancer-like evils, compared with the check to their increase and spread, all justly will regard the partial loss of territorial exclusive rights as of fleeting moment, and the destruction of barely won diplomatic triumphs as the mere bursting of bubbles on the even flowing stream of that peaceful international life which is dependent on "good-neighbourhood." But they will not the less fail to lo

with measureless scorn at the men who have already virtually pawned without pledge the birthright of their fellow-subjects—won by brave men of the same blood with their lives in open palm near two centuries ago—in order to save themselves from just obloquy and national reproach, as well as to secure their ill-gotten gains.

I am thankful to be able to state that I have received no aid, or help, or hint of any kind whatever, from any person or thing, apart from the documents kindly supplied to me, at my request, by the United States Department of State under the administration of your lamented predecessor. These are referred to near the bottom of the last page of the printed and published letter, herewith enclosed, addressed to the Governor General of Canada, dated Oct. 25th, 1881. But the documents thus kindly supplied did not furnish me with any information whatever specially pertinent to the subject of this communication.

I respectfully ask that the specified enclosure, which opens many a vista, may be considered a part of this communication. It embodies a just tribute to the true and the good, with a lasting rebuke to the weak and vile.

At present the whole matter of "the Fisheries" assumes an aspect pregnant with most serious consequences to two nations if not temperately and publicly handled.

For there can be no doubt whatever, that the men who could descend to the encouragement and protection of those offences against religion, honor, comity, and the real welfare of the people they governed, which I have described and proved, would not shrink from involving the two nations in ill-founded re-terminations and hostile aspersions, if not much worse, in order to conceal their delinquencies and secure what they have got of their gains.

Of this there can be no reasonable doubt, because it is merely the human stratagem of employing a worse expedient to shelter an infamous crime, and it would be the continuation of a practice already inordinately put in force.

Now that the notice of abrogation has been given, and equal rights to the British North American Fisheries virtually secured to the United States, may I not venture to ask of you, Mr. President, to use that vast power Providence has so unexpectedly caused you to assume, for the manifest benefit of many millions of people under separate rule, but in belief or credence joined, whose principles and impulses have been cruelly outraged, and some of whom unconsciously live in the shadow of deception and the deepening gloom of official untruth.

With this view, I respectfully ask you to cause OFFICIAL PUBLICITY to be given to this communication and its enclosures, assigning as my reason for this appeal the same thoughts, expressed in the same words I addressed to Lord Salisbury more than four years ago, and before I had discovered a tithe of the proofs of those official offences against God and man I have displayed to view.

This is my reason, as then submitted to Lord Salisbury in the enclosed printed communication No. 2; such reason being based upon the conception that between enlightened Christian Nations, mutually respecting and admiring each other, public opinion, properly grounded, can be the only true basis of just international policy in the presence of detected criminal dishonesty.

"In such a matter the bright sunlight of PUBLIC OPINION is surer and better than the dark paths so frequently trodden in the practice of modern diplomacy, as the brief history I have been compelled to relate sufficiently proves.

"This course will anticipate by a very brief period the exposure which must occur, but it will beckon to the front, to be heard in self-defence, those whose tactics have been of all things, best calculated to undermine and wreck the PRINCIPLES upon which the Treaty of Washington is based, and to shake confidence in positions of PUBLIC TRUST."

The accompanying letter addressed to the Rt. Hon. W. E. Gladstone, touches on kindred matters which more especially concern the loyal subjects of Her Britannic Majesty.

The accompanying letter to the President of the United States is an appeal which must commend itself to every sincere christian man on moral grounds.

In submitting a similar appeal to yourself I feel that I am addressing one whose words and life attest sincerity of belief not merely in christian doctrine and ordinances, but in the obligation which presses any and every man reverently to recognize a Creator.

Mr. Whitcher's "Memoir" is a valuable work, and should be used again, which excites

The subject of my letter to the President relates to the condition and use made of the United States Commerce and Navigation Reports for several years, as secretly moulded under alien official patronage and influence adverse to the interests of the United States, and sought to be concealed by the continued profanation of sacred things.

The irreverence and desecration which the contemporaneous Trade and Navigation Returns of Canada display, in perfect harmony with those of the United States, but favourable to the interests of Canada, concern the Government of the Dominion. This portion of the subject I am content to leave at the disposal of the people of Canada, upon the understanding that it is fully and fairly brought under their notice, being confident that a vast majority will be found to belong to that grand old stock which has effected its guarded pathway throughout the world, bearing the device—"IN NOC SIGNO VINCES."

The "Correspondence respecting the Halifax Fisheries Commission" laid before the Imperial Parliament in 1878, by command of Her Majesty the Queen, through Her responsible officer, embodies not only the blasphemous use of the desecration exhibited in the Trade Returns of the countries named, but it embraces also the record of the triumphs won under solemn oath by this profanity, together with a list of the rewards royally scattered.

The Bishops of the National Church in parliament assembled, have officially received this tainted record. In their unconscious hands has been placed a foul witness of official Fraud and unbelief, so veiled in scornful disregard of what we humbly and confidently trust is a sacred message to mankind, that he who ventures to defend further concealment, or by any excuse gives aid and comfort to the enemy of our race, seems to palter openly with God.

For there are features distinguishing the transactions I have described which will not escape the attention of any thinking man. Apart from added physical crime, nothing worse could be created in fiction or accomplished in fact.

These transactions violate every leading principle of religion, law, honour, rule and comity.

They degrade and debase, with a view to conceal heinous fraud, for selfish individual purposes, the merciful message of Redemption vouchsafed to the human race; and in their defence it is urged that they are necessary for use over again.

They are essentially a Government work, treacherously and traitorously practised against another Government and friendly neighbouring people.

They have for their object the pecuniary gain of a score or so of utterly unscrupulous men, and the continuance in political power of those who aid in this unhallowed and Christ-seoffing work.

The scheme so successfully pursued has involved abilities of no mean order, but befogged with Athleteistic views. It has been encouraged by great personal influence, much prolonged concerted action, unbounded audacity and very large pecuniary resources.

The defence of the scheme and the efforts at concealment have been on a par with the perpetration of the outrage.

But they have all been darkly human.

It is now my duty to inform you with sufficient fullness respecting this matter, as developed by the discoveries I have made; for there is a far nearer approach to home responsibility than has yet openly met any eye, or has yet greeted any ear.

The subject largely concerns belief not merely in the Providence of God as extended to the nation but individual belief in the existence of a God by those appointed to assume delegated power.

It is therefore a matter from which none will dare to say you will be led to shrink by any consideration whatever, for the confidence and the comfort which your acknowledged sense of the existence of Providence inspires and encourages, arises from the continued proof you offer to the Nation of truthful professions as sustained by consistent practice in life.

The further investigation which has suddenly led me to the discovery of the ratio 666,303—303,666 was incited or prompted by the prior detection of palpable fraud in the proof copy of the Case of Her Majesty's Government officially placed in my hands by the Secretary of the Halifax Fisheries Commission to enable me to carry out the joint instructions of the Agents of the Government of the Queen and of the United States.

This is a most important point, for had not my attention been drawn to alterations in writing in the proof copy of the Case of Her Majesty's Government which disclosed gross fraud, it never would have occurred to me, humanly speaking, to have commenced an inquiry which has been attended with such terrible results.

It is also apparent that if Lord Salisbury had chosen to have looked at the absolute proof of this gross fraud which I took to England in the same vessel which carried Sir A. Galt and Sir Leonard Tilley, in 1878, the Fisheries question might have been quietly and diplomatically settled before your advent to power, without knowledge of the ratio 666,303—303,666.

Your colleague, the Rt. Hon. A. J. Mundella, used his utmost exertions to procure an investigation but Lord Salisbury would not look at the proofs which were repeatedly proffered. In all this we may discern an interposition for a wise and merciful purpose.—The cup was not yet full.

In consequence of Lord Salisbury's action that ratio has continued ready for further use by those

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the secret, either directly or by virtue of the usufructuary privileges it conferred. The stock exchanges of New York, London and Amsterdam, as will presently appear, are now made to afford an unbounded field for gambling atrocities, practically based upon the concealment of the successful employment of the sacred numbers in the 13th Chapter of Revelation, which have been used to shelter the most anti-Christian, daring, showy and dangerous fraud of its kind the world has seen.

I presume it is unnecessary for me to state that I do not suppose that either Lord Salisbury or Lord Derby had the slightest knowledge of the use of these numbers, or of the presence of the ratio 666,303—303,666 in the United States or Canadian Records of Government. This knowledge I assume has been successfully kept from them.

But Lord Salisbury's persistent resistance to efforts made to induce him to look at proofs, Sir Leonard Tilley who received the \$5,500,000, and Sir Alexander Galt who fleeced it, being at the time both in London with myself, is only partially explained.

When, in May 1877, I was summoned to Ottawa from the charge of a Scientific Expedition to the Northern Labrador, undertaken by me for the Government of Newfoundland, the printed copy of the British Case prepared under the official supervision of Lord Derby was placed in my hands. In that copy of the Case the amount claimed from the Government of the United States was twenty-two millions eight hundred and eighty thousand dollars—being twenty millions for Canada and two millions eight hundred and eighty thousand dollars for Newfoundland.

In an official table of the Canadian Fish Catch for the years 1869 to 1876, simultaneously placed in my hands, I quickly discovered a leading fraud and pointed it out. On our journey from Ottawa to Halifax I said to the British Agent, "Your statistics are wrong." This and much more is narrated in the printed documents entitled "Correspondence respecting the presence of Falsified Statistics in the 'Case of Her Majesty's Government,' presented at Halifax, June 15th, 1877."—Published November 10th, 1879.

A great fear, as I now understand, fell on the British Commission when I announced this discovery, and EIGHT MILLIONS OF DOLLARS were at once struck off the British Claim for Canada. The Case was immediately reprinted. I hold the proof copy, and I have printed copies of both of the British Cases, showing the change.

Now, is it not well to consider that beneath that twenty million dollars claim against the United States there lay hidden the number 666, the ratio 666,303—303,666; the figures relating to the remission of duties on page 437 of the "Record," secretly prepared in the United States Bureau of Statistics against the interests of the United States and moulded in unison with 666, ready to be produced; the witness ready to be suborned, the false oath ready to be taken, and a reduced but not checked National fraud based, according to the views of many, on undoubted blasphemy?

I have further respectfully, but regretfully, to ask your attention to the printed letter I addressed to the Governor General of Canada, bearing date Oct. 25th, 1881. In this letter I almost hit upon the discovery of the ratio 666,303—303,666, but it pleased Providence that the veil should still be kept closely drawn.—The cup was not yet full.

I deeply regret to have also to call your attention to the printed communications I was compelled to address to the Earl of Kimberley, as Secretary of State for the Colonies, dated Nov. 5th, 1881, and Nov. 24th, 1881. I closed the latter printed letter with these words, not then fully knowing their real import now developed by the ratio 666,303—303,666; but having so strong a suspicion of the impious bearing of certain figures that I penned the words with almost prophetic force.

"Under any circumstances, the infamy of the Colonial Office Pamphlet and Map, jointly with the forgery of the Fishery Frauds, both being indissolubly bound together, are instantly important. For in addition to these matters as they now appear, there is that which crouches behind, and when it springs to the light, it will make the dry, dead bones of those who pleaded at Runnymede quiver and quicken."

"It" has now sprung to the light, and under circumstances and conditions which reveal a state of Society and a disregard for humane and upright principles which are simply appalling—for Lord Kimberley, Colonial Secretary, must have known *ex officio* more than I choose even to hint at. The Hudson Bay Company has for half a century been to Canada the source of many known evils, but none so trying or so appalling as those which must soon come to the light.—The cup is now full.

By the use of the "Blank Appendix," together with "Appendix—Memorandum concerning Article XI of the Treaty of Washington," and the number 666 in all its dreadful deformity of truth and honor, Sir Stafford H. Northcote and the Earl of Kimberley have virtually exchanged the British North American Fisheries for the pabulum of Land speculations in the North-West Territory of Canada, and the rich harvest the Stock Markets of New York, London and Amsterdam afford to those who deal therein on such an ungodly basis as the number 666.

I do not wish to speak of the Deity with the slightest approach to irreverent familiarity, or assume the right to interpret His dealings towards mankind with any seeming tendency in the direction of judicial personality. But if we are permitted to recognize, according to our faith, what may with becoming reverence appear to us to be the guiding hand of Providence, interposed we know not how or when, then I acknowledge to be swayed by the feeling that this matter of the British North American Fisheries may be accepted as a providential instrument for directing public attention to the condition of very many of our fellow-

subjects who are secretly deceived, crushed, and God only knows how cruelly oppressed, by protected and decorated injustice.

It may also be properly viewed as a warning or check to the very few who have selfishly used power and wealth they have been permitted to inherit or acquire, for their own or their friends and protected benefits alone, despising and trampling on the claims of others and neglecting the duties which belong to station and opulence.

Inherited domination over fellow-men involves vast responsibilities, and when joined to unequal splendor and a further heartless search for power or wealth, the finger of the Almighty, time and again appears to be stretched forth to check the arrogance which may have swollen into inordinate presumption and in which there can be discerned no fear of God, or loyal honour for the throne and its just surroundings or charitable thought for the millions so far beneath.

The British North American Fisheries have been virtually lost to our country in such a further search for power and wealth, with utter disregard for Christianity and human brotherhood.

"Fire Bricks and Clay," as substitutes for "Fish," are a mere shadow of the grosser substance by which article XXX. of the Treaty of Washington was won for the Hudson Bay Company during the negotiations for the Fishery Clauses of that Treaty.

It is horrible to think that by a process I have discovered the number 68,093, which forms the basis of the Exports of *Fish only* from the United States to the Dominion of Canada for the years 1872, 1873, 1874, 1875, 1876, should be found in the figures used at Washington in 1871—as testified by the late Sir A. J. Smith—by Sir Stafford Northcote and Sir J. A. Macdonald, with their joint attack *Qui facit per alium facit per se.* (1)

Neither Lord Salisbury nor Sir Stafford H. Northcote would look at the Tables of fraudulently added Dominion Fish Catch for the years 1869 and 1870, which were again presented in 1877.

The transformation of Prince Edward Island Exports and Imports from the United States for some years was similarly used over again in 1877; coal, lumber and salt figure in the list, while superimposed on these and other frauds there lay in 1877 the number 666, the ratio 666,303—303,666, compassed the secret invasion of the United States Bureau of Statistics. To crown all, there were added the false witness, the false oath, the money won and the honours conferred.

Reverting into originating hands in 1878, the old machinery for the old plot of 1871—73, in part revealed by Sir Francis Hincks, was revived, and a stronghold outlined and fenced, into which no conspiracy possessing a strain of honour or truth was permitted to enter.

From this stronghold they have unloaded their bonds on the Stock Markets of New York, London and Amsterdam.

This portion of the matter gathers force when it is known that Dr. Edward Young, for so many years Chief of the United States Bureau of Statistics, is a Canadian, and closely related to the family of the late Sir A. J. Smith; also that the family of Sir Stafford Northcote is connected with the family of Mr. George Stephen, the President of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company, who is a cousin of the late Donald A. Smith, of Hudson Bay Company notoriety. These are matters which the pecuniary profits arising from the sustained defamation of the Christian Religion, supplies the only excuse for reluctant notice here.

The Hudson Bay Company is primarily responsible for this amazing fraud. The ex-Governor of that Company, the Earl of Kimberley and Sir Stafford H. Northcote, have taken no heed of my private letter entitled "The Conspiracy of 1871," transmitted to them and Sir John Rose in February, 1882, before my second voyage to England in relation to the matter. I beg to enclose a copy of that letter, and request that it may be considered a part of this communication. The motives I have therein assigned for the triumph of the number 666 over that symbol of our faith, THE CROSS, is my warranty for this act.

The joint influence of these statesmen as manifested by inaction, silence and submission, has culminated in the guarantee by their Canadian allies of the greater part of one hundred million dollars worth of Canadian Pacific Railway Stock, based on Canadian Public Securities.

This guarantee is given by some of the very same men who initiated and countenanced the use of the ratio 666,303—303,666, and invaded with others the United States Treasury Department, defaming its records with the number 666 and the associated sacred emblems every christian man is bound to defend to the uttermost, as mercifully delivered "for our learning." (2)

This guarantee is accepted by some of the very same men who conspired with the donors in the chain. To these communications and documents I respectfully refer, as a whole and not singly or in separated parts; and to these communications and documents as a whole, I refer for every statement herein therein made.

And I further beg of you to contrast the individual and isolated splendor created by the millions of money these men are winning through practices compared with which heathen idolatry is virtue, with the increasing bitter cry of homeless despair wrung from evicted Irish hearts, or the hopeless

endured from year to year by the London poor in their unlovely and starving homes, or the effect on humanity of a fading belief in the Providence of God, fostered by protected crime.

Is it not well to think of the children of all helpless poor; and is it not well to think too of that message the gamblers have scoffed,—“Inasmuch as ye did it not to one of the least of these, ye did it not to ME.”

There are now two or three points to which I beg earnestly to solicit your most serious attention.

FIRST—The blasphemous deceptions which I have outlined in my letter to the President of the United States, be it remembered, were with infamous audacity officially stated by the man who was most familiar with their pernicious use and unholy origin, to be necessary for the “future disposal of the Fisheries Question,” and for this purpose it was essential that their “reliability should be maintained.” This official avowal roused me to renewed and ceaseless action.

The circumstances which led to the publication of this declaration, coupled with subsequent events, appear to form such a striking illustration of the merciful Providence of God in respect of our race, when rightly viewed, that I subjoin the extract and name the men.

A “Memorandum for the Right Honourable Sir John A. Macdonald, by Mr. W. F. Whiteher, Commissioner of Fisheries,” bearing date Ottawa, 23rd Dec., 1880, was laid before the Canadian Parliament in the second week of March, 1881, according to various newspapers.

This document full of lies was published at length in the Government organ—the *Toronto Mail*—under the caption in large letters “The Hind Charges,” &c., &c.

Mr. Whiteher says in this document, and Sir J. A. Macdonald receives the statement and publishes it:—

“The statistical tables forming the basis of argument on the chief commercial feature of the inquiry, “having been derived from the TRADE RECORDS OF BOTH COUNTRIES, may readily be examined in detail, and proved beyond question. Their general effect being incompatible with the alleged use for improper purposes should be a sufficient answer to the charge of tampering with them.

“*This class of evidence, however, is intimately related to the whole subject of the inquiry; and having also an important bearing on the future disposal of the Fisheries question, it is of the highest moment to maintain its complete reliability.*

“If innocent mistakes exist which Mr. Hind has been enabled to torture into any semblance of wilful perversion, these might be now carefully ascertained and acknowledged.”

I make no further comment on this extracted passage from an official document laid before Parliament, which abounds in like outrages. I leave the man and his master to those “thorns which prick and sting,” venomous offshoots of the spirit in which they have paltered with religion, honour and truth, and sold themselves to evil and the lust of power.

You will become aware that the Marquis of Lorne as Governor General of Canada received this document in the very midst of proof showing the infamous falsehood of its contents and bearing. Lord Lorne took no notice of the warning sent out to him in February, 1878, by that gathered flower of honour, Lord Frederick Cavendish. With his eyes blinded by the fancy-formed glitter before him, he sidled into the arms of his glozing tempter.

You will become aware that the Right Hon. the Earl of Kimberley, as Secretary of State for the Colonies, also received this document. The Earl of Kimberley as Secretary of State for the Colonies possessed every means, official and otherwise, for knowing the truth of the whole matter. This document is specially alluded to in my printed letters to the Governor General of Canada, dated March 28th, 1881, and Oct. 25th, 1881. To these published letters I respectfully refer you.

No language can portray the measure of responsibility which falls on these statesmen now, for have they not sold the promise of Redemption and the Sacrifice of the Cross to the DAGON who glossed over the number 666 and pictured the endless stream of gold it would win.

In the sustained presence of this kind of rule—religion, country, life, property, character and comity become the sport of the agnostic’s brooding conceit, and are controlled by the masked hypocrisy of those who in secret and in fact scoff at Christ and defend “THE NUMBER OF A MAN.”

One source of the money which paid for all this work is a consideration of great moment. It will be observed that the dutiable portion of the Fish Imports and Exports in 1872–3, prior to the coming into operation in July, 1873, of the Fishery Clauses of the Treaty of Washington, was very large, both in Canada and the United States. Yet these dutiable items conform to the ratio 666,303—303,666, and consequently to the number 666 and its associated sacred emblems given to us by Divine Inspiration.

There is only one conclusion which suggests itself—the people of Canada were made to pay for the fraud which has deprived them of their Fisheries, and which has assisted in building up the mammoth fortunes and political power of the patrons of this work, through the idealized North-West, and its frozen vastness.

SECOND—The presence in the United States Commerce and Navigation Returns of entries fearfully falsified after the manner I have described, constitutes a heinous crime against the State, compassed by powerful home assistance not difficult to trace. This is a matter which the President of the United States will treat as he considers proper. But in Canada, the same crime has been perpetrated by the Government of the country.—Who is going to bring the perpetrators of this crime to justice? Shall they es-

cape? Should no legal means be available, then steps in PUBLIC OPINION.

For if the symbol 666 under which the conspirators have worked, and so far succeeded, flouting Christianity, be permitted to triumph for the men who used it, or who profit by it, either by diplomacy, undue influence, or expediency, then FRAUD in high places, and all the brood of FRAUD, upheld by a blasphemous use of Divine Inspiration, triumph over the Cross and Christianity.

And why should the means taken to secure basely won splendor for a few godless men be permitted to impair the hopes and darken the lives of millions of their fellow-creatures, whose comforting trust lies in old-time lines you are reported to have done much to scatter throughout many lands:—

If I ask HIM to receive me  
Will he say me n ay?  
"Not till earth, and not till Heaven  
Pass away."

To condone the use of the number 666 is to attempt to show that this merciful God is a myth.

Believing in the unlimited measure of your faith in the tender invitation which forms the groundwork of that old Greek hymn, "Come unto me all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest"—let me with all respect adjure you to permit Public Opinion to have a full and fair opportunity to find due expression on the matter I have presented.

THIRD—In my various communications to the Earl of Kimberley, as Secretary of State for the Colonies, the Governor General of Canada and other officials or interested persons, I have fairly and without fear or favour exposed every foul official deceit as soon as discovered.

And this is how my efforts have been met. They have been followed by official deceit more atrocious still. The record is available. There is no exaggeration or even colouring in this statement, as soon as one fraud was pointed out, instead of being remedied, it was followed by another. The documents cited in my two affidavits prove this statement, incredible as it may appear.

Let me give two or three instances.

1. After the letter of the late Lord Frederick Cavendish with my enclosure, had been transmitted to the Marquis of Lorne early in 1879, and the receipt duly acknowledged on the 12th Feb. 1879, the Commissioner Whitcher's vile letter was published on the 6th June, 1880, which led to my response, titled "Falsified Departmental Reports." Over this exposure the Senate and Commons of Canada again stumbled under merciless and guilty guides.

Mr. Whitcher then used in June, 1880, the figures framed under the mask of the number 666, which had been successful in 1877.

2. When the Marquis of Lorne permitted the impostor Macconn's, 'big' book on "Manitoba and the North-West" to appear under his patronage as Governor-General in 1882, he allowed all the false and leading figures and statements of this Government impostor, which I had pointed out in printed letters addressed to the Earl of Kimberley in 1881, to appear over again, and under the glamour attached to the name and office of the Governor-General of Canada.

And so on in many other cases.

The Society for The Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts; The Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge; The Royal Geographical Society; The Geological Survey of Canada; The Department of Agriculture at Ottawa; The Department of the Interior; The United States Consul at Washington, &c., have been used in a similar manner for diffusing false information. All this you will find outlined in my letter to the late Archbishop of Canterbury, published in August, 1882, and in subsequent letters.

Is not the cup full now?

I have been twice to England on the same mission, and remained there in the aggregate more than half a year.

For five years I have tried every means that a private man in my position in life could command—first, individual official attention to the subject, and then this course failing—public attention. The dealers in the magic of the number 666 were permitted to prove too strong for me. As already stated the record is not only available but has been already transmitted.

What is the conclusion? The conclusion is that the cup was not then full, and that the British North American Fisheries were permitted to be the waiting blessing for millions of our race, and a suspended warning to the few who have known no human brotherhood but that of their order, and joined to the worshippers of Mammon, have trampled religion and honor and sympathy under foot.

For the conspirators have used the decorated official coward's meanest device in order to keep gains. They have continually crouched in silence beneath indictments which the lowest of fellows would have had the moral courage to meet, if they were not miserably and fatally true. There is no use of words which can sufficiently degrade them as men in their Judas work.

Therefore, for the sake of the FAITH which alone can give hope to the lives of the million, and to obtain the promise of a peace which passeth understanding in the trusting hour of death, permit me respectfully to solicit from you a full and just opportunity for Public Opinion to be fairly formed and fairly find expression on a subject which is not only of moment to every individual, but of vital importance to the welfare of the Realm.

Let me conclude with a contrast. You will receive this communication shortly before Christmas, and about the same time that the balance of the authorized swollen and 'watered' capital of the Canadian Pacific Railway, FORTY-FIVE MILLIONS OF DOLLARS, is to be issued to the world, according to the official announcement of Mr. George Stephen, the President of the Company.

This 45,000,000 dollars worth of swollen stock is guaranteed by the statesmen under whose patronage and official supervision the number 666 and its related sacred emblems were introduced for the purpose of fraud, into United States and Canadian Records of Government.

This 45,000,000 dollars worth of stock is practically issued by the same men who by means of "Fire-ticks and Clay" as substitutes for Fish, and a hundred other similar devices, gained Article XXX of the Treaty of Washington for the Hudson Bay Company in 1871, and who jointly with Mr. George Stephen and his associates now own thirty million acres of land in the North-West Territory of Canada free from taxation, by contract with the same Canadian Statesmen who have since guaranteed their bonds, who have had the number 666, and who patronized the evolution of the quantity \$185,768 out of the United States Commerce and Navigation Reports, specially adjusted for the purpose, to prove the value of remitted duties on Fish.—(Doc. and Pro. Hal. Com., page 1881, Record—437.)

The preparation and evolution of this quantity develops such traitorous villainy that I have not introduced its relations into my examples of the power of the number 666. Its conception is not human. NO MAN'S LIFE OR PROPERTY IS SAFE IF THIS METHOD OF PROTECTED FRAUD IN THE MANUFACTURE OF FALSE EVIDENCE IS PERMITTED. This quantity when properly applied to the mathematical formula of the Fraud I have deduced, proves that no other numbers but those taken from the 13th Chapter of Revelation will satisfy all the conditions involved. In a variety of ways this formula proves blasphemous appropriation.

Now please observe that all this connected chain of injustice and crime has been brought about and effected because the proper authorities have refused to look at the proofs of declared and palpable fraud in the matter. This is shown in my printed and published letter and Argument, dated May 27th, 1881. The consequences of this neglect are now looming into view.

During or about Christmas week, when every hearth where the English language is spoken becomes agitated with Christmas emblems or carols, these forty-five million dollars, born of the number 666, and the desecration of the DIVINE WORD, are to be thrown on the stock markets of London, New York and Amsterdam, where they virtually assume the form of the tempter's bribe for betraying Christ once again the name of the Nation, by the official ignoring of the principles and foundation of the Christian Religion.

But not even the faintest glitter of this golden stream won by the trampling under foot of a merciful message to man divinely inspired, will reach the vice engendering dens of the London helpless poor, or be permitted to soothe the awful desolation of evicted Irish hearts at Christmas-tide, or illumine the gloom which is thickening over unrequited labour in the land, or arrest the downward rush of the thousands who mimicking the giant patrons of fraud, or lessen the black despair which comes with the wage of fallen men's nightly sin in the teeming London streets.
