FINANCIAL CABIN WRECKAGE CONFIRMS FRIENDS' WORST FEARS THAT "EMERALD" IS LOST

Theory is Advanced, That, With
Sails Frozen, Sudden Gale
Caused Her to Capsize.

Port Hope, Nov. 25.—(Special.)—
Capt. Woodcock of Toronto and
two lifelong friends of Capt. Mc-
Master of the missing schooner
Emerald, came here today from
Toronto and searched the shore
near this town. About one mile
east of Gull Lighthouse they found
wreckage that they declare is
part of the schooner. The shutter
of a cabin window and the top
of a provision box were positively
identified as portions of the mis-
sing vessel. The two captains fear
she has been lost with all on
board.

ROSE FROM DRUNKEN SLEEP FOUND WIFE DEAD ON FLOOR

In Home of Squalor, Woman Died as
She Lived, Neglectful and
Neglected.

Coroner Powell says there is no ne-
cessity for an inquest. The woman
died from natural causes. The dead
woman is Mrs. Lawrence Vale, the
wife of a shoemaker, who resides at
70 St. David-street. Had it not been
for the charity, the kindly feeling to-
wards his fellow men, and benevolence
of the Rev. Father Hand, of St. Paul's,
the body would have been taken to
the morgue. The Rev. Father generally,
when he heard of the case, became re-
sponsible for the funeral expenses.
The Vale, man and wife, have been
living at 70 St. David-street, for
some time. They have no family. Vale
is 52 years of age, his wife was 39
years old. Both have been addicted
to drink. The wife was found dead
Sunday morning. Vale was very drunk
Saturday night, so drunk that he did
not remember what time he retired.
He woke up some time during the night,
he does not know the hour, went down-
stairs, and saw his wife lying under
the table. He did not touch her nor
move her, but went to bed again.
When he awoke again, it was 9
o'clock. His wife was sitting in the
same position. He did not touch her,
but called in a neighbor. The woman
was dead. She was partially dressed,
no fire in the house, a pail of water
near her. The water was cold. There
was nothing in the house to eat.
The woman had been ill for a week.
She had a grippe, but no medical at-
tention. The rooms are squalid and
filthy dirty. When the police took
charge of the premises, they found
hot for Vale, who was shivering and
shaking like a man with the ague.
The woman is dead, and will be
buried at the expense of the Rev. Fa-
ther Hand.
There were some empty whiskey
flasks lying around, and also some
traces of food, but nothing that would
lead to any suspicion.

(Canadian Associated Press Cable.)—
London, Nov. 25.—Edward Farrer,
writing in the Contemporary Review,
says the French Canadians are dead
against the new imperialism, and 75
per cent. of the English-speaking Cana-
dians will refuse to carry the burden
of imperial armaments.
He quotes Sir Charles Tupper and
Mr. Borden in support of the view
that both political parties in Canada
are opposed to imperialism.

FAR EAST WAR EXPECTED FLEET STREET PREPARED

War Correspondents Making Arrange-
ments for Mustering in Either
Japan or Manchuria.

London, Nov. 25.—(Special.)—Three
actions for damages for alleged libel,
arising indirectly out of the Gamy
investigation, may be heard at an early
date in the courts of the land.
The plaintiff in each of these cases
is John M. McEvoy, barrister, of this
city, who was one of the counsel of
the government in the investigation,
and the amount claimed in each in-
stance is \$10,000.
The London Free Press Printing Co.
is named as the defendant in one of
the actions, notice of which has already
been served. It is alleged that The
Free Press of a recent date contained
a telegraphic report, showing mis-
take in the name of the defendant,
with the disappearance of the leaves
of the Gamy cash book at the time
of the investigation.
R. R. Gamy, M.L.A., is the defend-
ant in another of the cases, and Alex.
Wright, the organizer for the Conser-
vative party in the province, is the de-
fendant in the other. The actions
against these papers are based on
statements made in speeches by them,
also implicating Mr. McEvoy in the
misstatement of the cash book.

"BARNACLES."

Frank T. Bullen, F.R.G.S., writes in The December Strand a captivating
description of a big whale he has written in catching. He describes it as it ap-
peared when taken from the sea, and gives a lurid description of the "bar-
nacles," which at this time, after The Globe's editorial, is particularly
appropos. Bullen's references to the barnacles follow:
"Another thing more noticeable about this gigantic whale than any
other that I have ever seen was the number and mass of barna-
cles with which he was laden. Hanging down from the lower
jaw was a fringe of barnacles quite two feet in length, many of
which had their bases actually planted between the teeth, as if
they grew upon an imaginary jawbone. As he swam rapidly, they
during his staying—for no time did he appear capable of making
any vigorous exertion—this quaint beard of barnacles waving
and to the long, lank, and the glistening white shells
at their ends glittering in the water like jewels. And, hanging
the belly of the monster were barnacles, which, tho they were
shorter, grew in large numbers, while in between them clung
limpets, hummocky shells as large as a horse's hoof, and ad-
hering so firmly that they appeared to be part of the creature
himself. Here and there a remora, or sucker-fish, clung tena-
ciously to the universal host, and in other places there were ve-
getables such as you find upon the bottom of slowly-crawling ships,
after a long passage. Among these things crabs darted busily to-
and fro and small white, many-legged things—like exasperated
woodlice in shape—wandered. All this attendant world of life at-
tached to one living animal, who, as it is remembered, fat
with an abounding richness of blubber, but who looked like some
Rip Van Winkle of the whale tribe that had thus been taken pos-
session of and overgrown while sleeping away a generation or
so in some cozy ocean cave.

Port Arthur, Nov. 25.—(Special.)—A

announced, and a company, to be known as
the Northern Light Mining and De-
