




THE WHEAT MARKET



All these allowances for wife and children will be paid direct to the wife unless otherwise thought fit by the com-mission.
A married man living at home will receive 80c. a day. (This of course is in addition to the allowances for wife and children.)
A widowed mother, if dependent entirely upon the unmarried son who is receiving training, and if the son made an assignment of his pay to his mother and also arranged for her to receive separation allowance while he was on service, may be paid at the same rate as the wife of a married man with no child dren.
The parents of a man undergoing training, if both are old and past work and entirely or partially dependent up-on him, may also be paid at that rate. T. The guardian of a widower's child dren (under the maximum age) will be each child in excess of three, \$22; and \$3 for each child in excess of three, with a max-imum of \$38.
Payments under these regulations will be continued for one month after the completion of vocational training, wheth et the man has secured employment or not.
