

FOR YEAR 1894.

In March 1881, The Ladies Bible Society became connected with the City Mission, in order to carry on its work more efficiently and to a greater extent, if possible.

The work during the past year has been faithfully carried on by the same Bible Woman (Miss Latimer) and her work is indeed a blessed one, she is an acceptable visitor in most of the poor homes, and is always ready to comfort and help those who talk to her of their troubles by reminding them of their best friend, our Heavenly Eather. Whose Word she reads to them and Whose aid she asks for them. She brings food and clothing to the destitute whom she finds in her daily visiting.

During the past winter her visits numbered 515.

The Committee has met on the 2nd Wednesday of each month at Mrs. W. R. Dean's, the President's house, to receive Miss Latimer's monthly report of work done.

The Mothers' Meetings have been held every Friday from 2 to 4 o'clock, in the Jeffery Hale School Room, some one of the Committee presiding and giving a Bible lesson. A fair number of Mothers attend: the smallest number being 8, the largest 19. They testify to receiving help and comfort. A small number of Bibles were sold. The Hospital is visited by our Bible Woman, and many a face is seen to brighten, and many a heart cheered when she enters their ward, she reads and prays with those who will listen. We could mention many who have been brought from darkness into light through her instrumentality.

From her monthly reports we feel encouraged to go on and seek for the lost, knowing that His Word will not return unto Him void.

Our Committee has to regret the loss, by marriage, of one member, Miss Ross, who always took a warm interest in the work, and contributed once a month a tea for the Mothers She will be much missed.

Thanks are also given for all donations of old clothing for the poor, and any such parcels addressed to the "City Mission" will be gladly received at the W. C. A., 125 Anne Street.

A donation of \$40 was given by the W. C. A. to help the distressed for which the Committee return thanks.

From the different societies, the St George's, St Andrew's and Irish Benovolent, Miss. Latimer has received help, for which she is truly grateful.

Miss. Latimer collected in December \$166 50 for Xmas dinners for the poor, fuel, etc., every cent of which has been most carefully distributed and many hearts made glad. The best summary of the whole report of work done is our Saviour's Own Words "She hath done what she could."

The Committee regret that owing to Miss Latimer's continued illness, an Assistant Bible Woman had to be engaged. Mrs. Salters application for the situation was accepted, and it is hoped that she may prove as useful and faithful as Miss Latimer.

In October, the Ladies City Mission received from F. Ross, Esq., the sum of \$5,000 as its portion of the estate of the late Hon. Jas. G. Ross, which was thankfully acknowledged.

The Committee hope for a continuance of the sympathy and help given in the past and pray for renewed prayerful energy during the coming year, so that there may be more of the blessed Word sown which is "able to make wise unto Salvation."
