A BYE-LAW RELATING TO CATTLE

GOING AT LARGE.

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the County of Northumberland:

1. That any Cattle, or any Cattle shall be allowed to go or be at large within the following Districts:

In the Parish of Newcastle within the District bounded westerly by the upper line of the lands owned and occupied by James Falconer, easterly by Leiden Hill or Lane, northerly by the Queen's (new) Highway, and southerly by the Miramichi River.
