The stroke of a hammer upon a nail caused a \$40,000 fire at Olean, N. Y., on the 24th ult., and eleven men escaped being hurt, and one died. The men were roofing a 25,000 barrel oil tank which was filled with crude oil, when it was discovered that the oil had ignited. A rush was made for the stairway and nine of the men made their escape by that means, the other two being obliged to seek safety by jumping into a tree and going down the trunk. An instant later the tank was a mass of seething flames.

The Calgary Herald states that from all parts of Alberta reports come that this is the best crop year ever known. Mr. Harry O'Connor of the C. P. R., who recently returned to Winnipeg from a western tour as far as Moose Jaw, and south to Estevan, speaking of the crop prospects in districts through which he passed, stated that in some places there will be a light crop, but on the whole there should be a 25 or 30 bushel per acre yield. The wheat crop of Norfolk county, Ont., is the greatest the present generation of farmers has seen. It is estimated the yield will average fully thirty-five bushels to the acre with many returns of forty and forty-five bushels. The recent rains have not done any damages as yet.
