Cape of Good Hope—State of the War.

Advices from the Cape to May 2nd.—The news is of great importance. Sir Harry Smith not advancing, and was merely sending out scouting parties. He was anxiously waiting for reinforcements from England.

The intelligence received by Thursday's mail is more gloomy than ever. A feeling of discouragement and alarm seems to pervade all communications from the frontier, and scarcely any of the writers find hope for the future.

The war is not yet concluded. I believe that Creli, Pat, Umkalo, Moshesh, will all be greater than ever. And, then speaking of the state of things in the interior, the writer proceeds to describe the state of the frontier.

From the Secretary the intelligence is very interesting. All the farmers in the Caledon River had formed themselves into a league for self defence. The Boers had taken 275 head of cattle, 100 head of horses, and a large quantity of provisions.

From London Papers.—A decree has been issued at Warsaw for banishing the Jewish women to cut off their hair. The Pope has presented to the King of Naples a splendid ivory reliquary containing the skull of St. Paul and St. Peter.

The Duke and Duchess de Nemours arrived at Lachen on Friday, on a visit to the King of the Belgians. The Queen of the French, who had been in London, is expected to return to the railway to meet them.

Adopted, August 1, 1853.

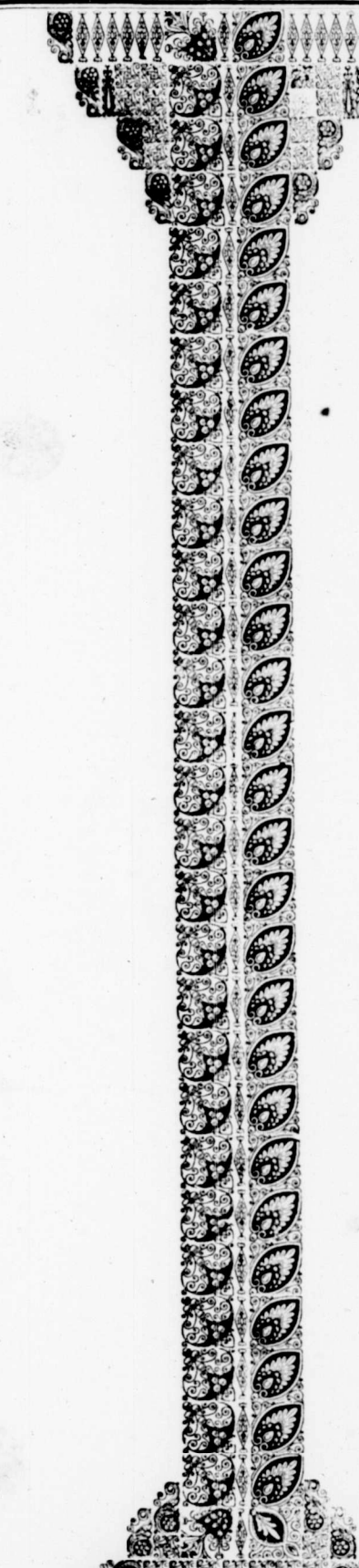
