In AFRICA, are these Provinces, viz. Egypt, Barbary, Biledulgerid, Ethiopia, Nubia, Congo, Abyssinia, Monomotopa, Guinea, &c. the Islands. Madagascar, St. Thomas. Islands of Cape Verde, Canary Islands, Medeira.

AMERICA, the south Part of the World, & of the latest Discovery, consisteth of these two Parts, Mexico or North-America, & Peru, or South America. The province of Mexico are New-Spain, Florida, New York, New-England, New-France, or Canada. The provinces of Peru are, Brasil, Peru, Chili, Terra Firma, Paraguay Amazonia. The chief Islands of America are, Hispaniola, Cuba, Jamaica, Newfoundland, and Porto-Rico.

**T**HAT in and about Mines Basin, Windsor and that neighbourhood, at the Full and Change of the Moon, it is High Water about twelve o'clock, and of course, when the Moon quarters, it is high water about 6 o'clock.

At Cumberland and Annapolis, it is high Water at the Full and Change of the Moon about 15 Minutes after 11 o'clock.

In Five Hours from the Time of high water at Windsor, the River is fordable at Falmouth, and it remains fordable for three Hours in summer, and two Hours in the Winter season.

High Water at Windsor about 50 Minutes later than at Boston, and in Cumberland Basin and Annapolis Basin nearly the same as at Boston.
