In A F R I C A, are these Provinces, viz. Egypt, Barbary, Biledulgerid, Ethiopia, Nubia, Congo, Abyssinia, Monomotopa, Guinea, &c. the Islands. Madagascar, St. Thomas. Islands of Cape Verde, Canary Islands, Medeira.

AMERICA, the south Part of the World, & of the latest Discovery, consisteth of these two Ports, Mexico or North-America, & Peru, or South America. The province of Mexico are New-Spain, Florida, New York, New-England, New-France, or Canada. The provinces of Peru are, Brasil, Peru, Chili, Terra firma, Paraguay Amazonia. The chief Islands of America are, Hispaniola, Cuba, Jamaica, Newfoundland, and Porto-Rico.

All patents, commissions, &c, coming from the King are perused by him. His office is during the King's pleasure. Its yearly income is 7000l.
