WOMAN CONCEIVES A BIG FINANCIAL SCHEME

But the Idea Does Not Work out as He Anticipated It Would.

And Brings Trouble and Probable Disgrace on the Head of its Originator—Financial Loss for Hundreds of Small Depositors—Mr. J. K. Kerr, Q.C.'s, Unlucky Connection With the Toronto Financial Corporation—Hon. E. J. Davis Also Involved in the Affair.

Toronto has two big and nasty failures on its hands. They are both very rank. They have both tainted the local commercial atmosphere.

The Toronto Financial Corporation, which was incorporated by an act of the Ontario Legislature in 1873. The act is styled 36 Victoria, chapter 127.

The company may acquire, hold and dispose of stocks, bonds, debentures and municipal securities, and the obligations of corporate companies and Government stocks or debentures, and may buy and sell such securities on margin.

The intention of the promoters would seem to have been to incorporate a company for carrying on a brokerage business. For reasons unknown, the charter lay dormant, and business was never done under it.

The charter amended. In the fall of 1883, Mr. J. K. Kerr, Q.C., secured a charter for the company, and made application to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for an Order-in-Council varying and greatly enlarging the powers and objects of the company.

The company was given a free hand to take deposits, to issue capital stock, and to issue a variety of securities, including debentures, and to acquire by purchase any security upon which it is authorized to lend.

By these changes the company was turned from a mere brokerage concern into a more comprehensive financial institution, and its powers were greatly enlarged.

Mr. Kerr's Scheme Disclosed. What his purposes were is made plain by what follows. The amended charter was obtained on Dec. 5, 1883.

The company was organized with a board of which Mr. Kerr was president and E. J. Davis, then and now M.L.A. for North York, a member. The chief business, apparently, was to consider a proposal for the purchase of Mr. Kerr's equity in Mr. Kerr's Toronto real estate.

He produced a valuation of those equities, made by Edward Galt, plus his value at about \$300,000 over the existing mortgages.

Mr. Kerr subscribed for a large block of stock, and upon this he was credited with payments of more than \$140,000. He was further credited with \$75,000 on an account with the company, which was to remain with the company for five years without interest.

ENGLAND THE GREEK LOAN

The British Government Will Not Promise to See that the Terms of the Treaty are Carried Out—Germany Steps in and Puts a Stop to Railroad Building in Shan Tung Province, China—Other News by Cable.

London, Feb. 25.—In the House of Lords today Lord Salisbury said that the negotiations for the Greek loan for the payment of the war indemnity to Turkey had been long, because of the necessity of agreeing that portions of the Greek revenue would be security for the loan.

He has issued a circular from Avondale, in which he says: "The poverty and almost absolute want which my mother, my sisters and I are facing, render it imperative for me to ask the corporation to entrust me with the duties of City Marshal, through the devotion of my brother to the cause of Ireland, Avondale, the home of my family for generations, must go under this hammer."

CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES BOROURED. Glasgow, Feb. 25.—The Fisheries Protection Association has informed that the future its members will not purchase rattle carried on vessels which carry catch from the United States and Glasgow and Liverpool for co-operative societies.

BOOM OF THE CLYDE. Shipbuilders Have Orders on Hand to Keep Them Busy for 18 Months. Glasgow, Feb. 25.—There is a great boom in the Clyde shipbuilding industry. 50,000 tons having been ordered in February, against 25,000 tons in January.

ELECTION MATTERS IN RUSSELL. Returning Officer Doesn't Know Where He is—New Proclamation Will be Required—Robillard Not Anxious.

Ottawa, Feb. 25.—(Special.)—Election matters in Russell County are at a complete standstill. The returning officer does not know where he is, and has asked Premier Hardy for instructions. It is conceded that a new proclamation for the election will be required, and that it is not likely to be issued until after March 1.

CAMPAIGN NOTES.

Eastern Ontario will go almost solid for Whitney. A prominent Belleville man who was in town yesterday brought word that the Liberal down there concede all three of the Hastings ridings to the Opposition.

Mr. J. C. Carleton of Napanee, who was down yesterday, declared positively that Lennox, Addington and Frontenac will all return supporters of Mr. Whitney. If this is so, it means that the leader of the Patrons is to go down in the fight.

Likewise, Mr. J. H. Burnham of Peterborough claims the two Peterborough and the two Lincolns for the Tories.

In North Ontario, writes "Elector," the Conservative candidate, Mr. Hoyle, finds his prospects brightening. Many Liberals, tired of the Government, demand a change and will vote for Hoyle's opponent, Mr. Chapple's workers are Hardy's officials, with G. T. Bruce of Beaverton in the lead.

Like news comes from the west and the north. According to the best information obtainable, the Conservatives will carry Peel. Candidate Beynon is expected to split the vote in Calton Township, and, if he does this March 1 will prove a red letter day for him. The most rabid Grits concede that the Tory candidate is the better man.

Haughton Lennox of Barrie, who has been tendered a nomination for Ontario, has not the slightest doubt that all four will return Whitneys.

Col. Clarke has received word from Returning Officer Robillard that he was unable to reach the place of nomination in Russell County on nomination day, and that, therefore, he has issued a new proclamation. This probably means that the contest in Russell will take place a few days after the general election.

According to section 4 of 55 Vic. cap. 3, an act passed in 1896, the Ontario election law provides that no person shall be nominated as a candidate for any office at a general election, unless he has been nominated by a meeting of the electors of the district.

Mr. Y. McLean, the Liberal candidate in South Huron, is very ill at his home in Exeter.

Tonight's rallies include a Crawford Street Association meeting at 7:30, and Liberal meetings at Brockton Hall, Euclid-avenue Hall and Temperance Hall.

No Longer Reason to Doubt That the Shock Came From Below.

Magazines Had Nothing to Do With the First Explosion—Spaniards at Havana Show Their Hatred of the United States—Government at Madrid Thinks It Necessary to Prepare for the Worst.

New York, Feb. 25.—A despatch to The Herald from Havana says: There is no longer any reason to doubt that the explosion which wrecked the Maine came from underneath the vessel, and that her magazines had nothing to do with the initial explosion, and played a much smaller part in the general disaster than was at first supposed.

The evidence that has served to convince the board was obtained by Eugene Powell, an officer attached to the Fern. Mr. Powell was formerly in the construction corps, and took a two years' special course in the Glasgow School of Naval Architecture. He is therefore a competent witness.

What he discovered was that the forward part of the keel of the Maine, with its ribs and plates, was stove upward so far that parts of the shattered double bottom show out of the water, and in places sections of the green-painted outer hull are visible. Corroborative of the evidence by Ensign Powell, and of equal significance and importance, is the result of the close examination made by the divers.

The main force of the explosion seems to have been exerted slightly on the port side of the vessel. In the magazine was stowed 2500 pounds of powder in copper tanks, each of which contained 200 pounds. Several of these tanks have been found by the divers, all in crushed and shapeless masses.

The Dow torpedoes, one of the Maine has been located in the wreck. It lies in the debris forward, submerged several feet under water. The hull now imbedded in the mud to the depth of eight feet. The divers sink to their arduous duty in prosecuting their work.

Patience is Necessary. A despatch, The Tribune from Havana says: Failure is necessary on the part of the people of the United States in the investigation. No more standing vexatious delays, real progress is being made by the divers. The decision regarding the cause of the disaster ultimately rests on their work.

Spaniards Express Hatred. New York, Feb. 25.—Passengers on the steamship Concho, that has just arrived from Havana, say that the attitude of the Spaniards is horrible, from the evidence the wreckage bore of the power of the explosion, and the manner in which the Spanish officers making no effort to drive the United States boats, were sickeningly offensive.

Spaniards Stalk Warlike Feeling in Madrid that Preparations Must be Made for the Worst—Prospect of War Popular. London, Feb. 25.—According to a special despatch from Madrid reports received there from the United States, it is said that public opinion in the latter country is becoming more excited owing to the impression that the wreck of the Maine is due to an accident, are "restoring popular feeling here in Madrid, and the conviction is increasing in Ministerial circles that the Government has no alternative but to adopt a threatening attitude for the prospect of war is popular with all parties, and the more excitable newspapers are already urging the Government to take measures to enable Spain to strike the first and decisive blow."

Warlike Rumors Contradicted. Norfolk, Va., Feb. 25.—The rumor that the Government is securing from railway companies estimates of their capacity for moving troops and munitions of war between Atlantic coast ports and the interior is officially denied by Vice-President John of the Department of War, whose road was mentioned in the reports.

Meeting of the Cabinet. Washington, Feb. 25.—The first full meeting of the Cabinet in some weeks was held today, both Secretaries Alger and Sherman, who have been sick, being present. The cabinet talked about the Maine disaster at some length as a current topic of vital interest, but no action of any kind was taken or any suggestion of action made.

Vicaya Sailed Away. New York, Feb. 25.—The Spanish cruiser Vicaya was reported under way at 1:25 p.m. by the observer at quarantine. The boats of the warship were paced on the water this morning. The Vicaya had only one guard about her, the navy tug Minnie, which circled about the Spanish warship all morning. The flag of the warship was still at half-mast as she drew away from the bay.

TORONTO HUMANE SOCIETY.

Ambulance and Lethal Chamber Wanted—Docking of Horses—Bird Destruction for Military Purposes.

The monthly meeting of the Toronto Humane Society was held yesterday afternoon in the rooms on Bay-street, the President, Mr. W. R. Brock, in the chair.

Miss Dupont reported that a committee had waited upon Commissioner Coatsworth re the matter of preserving valuable dogs which may be picked up by the catchers. He advised that the society notify, through the newspaper, the time when such dogs are to be destroyed, and owners may then go to the pound and secure them.

Want a Lethal Chamber. A letter was read from Mrs. Florence Grasset, urging a scheme for canvassing the city for funds. The society, she said, needed an ambulance, and shelter for dogs. She gave notice that she herself would collect funds for the purpose of procuring a small lethal chamber for its use at all times and seasons.

Mr. G. Wood proposed that the society do for members to collect for individual schemes, and as the society was quite in sympathy with Mrs. Grasset's plan, she moved that the letter be laid on the table for consideration.

Mr. Brock thought the police ought to cooperate in the matter, and as the society is determined to set up a small lethal chamber, he thought it ought to be placed in the police yards. Also the opinion of the society was that such a lethal chamber could be made in Toronto at a much lower figure than one could be imported for. This matter will be brought up again.

Docking of Horses. The question of the docking of horses came up for consideration. At present Mr. Penny of Montreal has a bill for the Dominion House which is regarded by the Toronto Humane Society as only a half measure; it provides that horses be docked only when a qualified veterinary surgeon is present. The Western Society of Hamilton is petitioning the Government to disallow Mr. Penny's bill, and it was decided that Toronto Humane Society should follow suit.

Mr. G. Wood was appointed as delegate to represent the Toronto Humane Society at the annual meeting of the Galt Humane Society, which meets next month.

A letter was read from Dr. Hodgins, who is at present in England, the guest of Sir Andrew Scoble, asking "the Toronto Society to send its literature to the Royal Humane Society in London, England. His request will be acceded to."
