REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES.

It is with sincere satisfaction that the Trustees and Managers of the Toronto House of Industry can again present to the public their Annual Report of the operations of that Institution. In all its branches of usefulness, the affairs of this excellent charity continue, with the blessing of Divine Providence, to be carried on and to prosper. The various contributors to its funds need only refer to the Report of the Superintendent, detailing the character of the relief afforded, and the number of poor assisted by the House, together with the Reports of the Medical Officer and the Treasurer, in order to be assured that the disbursements have been made in a most satisfactory manner. The design of the Institution is to afford relief to all who may require it, irrespective of creed or nationality ; and it is gratifying to know that the efforts of the Board have been eminently successful in this respect.

The Trustees and Managers are happy in being able to report that they have received this year an increase of the Government grant, in consideration of the increased demand on their funds, from the large number of Immigrants who naturally come to Toronto as being the capital of Ontario, and who, from a variety of causes, are unable to obtain immediate employment in their respective trades or occupations. Thanks are due to the Government, to the City Council, and the

large number of private contributors to the funds of the charity, for the continuance of their liberal support. They have a guarantee for the future usefulness of the Institution, in the efficiency with which the Superintendent and Matron and the other officers have in the past discharged their respective duties.

TREASURER'S REPORT.

MR. HENRY ROWSELL, Treasurer, submitted his Statement of Receipts and Expenditure, in detail, with vouchers, duly audited and found correct. The balance on hand 1st January, 1870, including previous year's balance, being \$971.79.

MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT FOR 1869.

The Health Officer reports that in accordance with the rules of the Institution, he has visited the House of Industry regularly twice a week, during the past year, and oftener when the necessities of the inmates required it.

That he has visited the poor at their own residences in various parts of the city, at the request of members of the Committee, and holds himself in readiness at all times, to visit, and examine or prescribe for, the sick poor at their own homes, if requested by any member of the Board to do so.

He has great pleasure in reporting much less sickness in the House than in former years.

Thirteen have died during the year, viz : six women, five men, and two children.

The adults all died of diseases, either incident to old age, or the direct results of former irregularities, exposures, and privations, while the two children died of head affections, probably the result of inherited tendencies.
