By the first of the Proclamato s referred to, the following Counties in the District of Montreal are placed under the operation of the Police Ordinance, viz: the Counties of Montreal, Yaudreuil, Two Mountains, Tetrebonne, Lachenaye, L'Assomption, Berthier, Richelien, St. Hyacimthe, Rouville, Vercheres, Chambyl, Lapharire, Acadie, Beauharnois, and in the District of Three Rivers, by the econd Proclamation the following Counties are placed in the same position, viz: the County of St. Mautice, Champlain, Yaanske, Nicolet and Drummond; being, in fact the whole of the District.
