

FOREWORD.

EDITOR'S NOTE.

The collection of data for these Records was commenced some years ago by a committee consisting of Maynard Parker Freeman, of the class of 1862, and William Frederick Parker, of the class of 1881, working under the direction of the Senate of Acadia University. These gentlemen collected the data concerning the graduates from 1843 to 1886 inclusive. Later, Rupert Osgood Morse, of the class of 1891, was added to this committee. It fell to him to collect the data for all graduates since 1887. The older members of the committee passed their data over to Mr. Morse to tabulate and put into form corresponding to that in which the records of the younger graduates were written. Mr. Morse thus becomes the editor of the entire "Records." It has been the aim to bring these Records as nearly as possible down to date. In some instances, the Record is very incomplete because data was impossible to obtain. In some cases, an undue modesty has prevented some, who have achieved creditable records, from giving sufficient data from which to write a really good record of their work. The Records, as written, represent the latest available data, and give the latest known addresses. Several of the addresses have, doubtless, changed since the data was received. This is especially true of the most recent graduates, many of whom are still engaged in temporary pursuits and have as yet no permanent employment and address.

The task of gathering the records of eight hundred men and women, the dates of whose graduation range from 1843 to 1908, can best be estimated by those who have attempted such work. In such a work, inaccuracies are inevitable. The editor craves the indulgence of any whose Records are inaccurate or incomplete. He will also be greatly obliged for any information which will make possible more correct and more complete Records in any

future work of this kind that may be issued.

All graduates will confer a favor upon their Alma Mater by keeping the Registrar of Acadia University informed as to changes of address.

CLASS OF 1843.

JOHN LEANDER BISHOP, b. Greenwich, Kings County, N. S. Graduated 1843, studied medicine, first in the office of Dr. Sawers, Halifax, N. S., and later at Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia; practised his profession for some years in Philadelphia; surgeon to the Pennsylvania Reserve Corps during the American Civil War; at the close of the war in 1865, joined the Civil Service at Washington and became Chief of the Bureau of Statistics; died in Washington, September 23, 1868.

Amos Sharpe, b. Lower Maccan, Cumberland County, N. S. Graduated 1843; studied medicine at Jefferson College, Philadelphia; practised his profession, first at Hopewell, N. B., and later at Carleton, N. B.; died at Hampton, N. B., April 10, 1852.

James William Johnstone, b. Halifax, N. S., 1824. Graduated, 1843; studied law in the office of Johnstone and Twining, Halifax, 1843–1846; admitted to the bar and began practise of his profession in Halifax, 1846; continued to practise until 1876; created Queen's Counsel 1871; appointed ad hoc judge for the trial of contested election cases for Dominion Parliament, 1873; appointed first County Court Judge for District No. 1, Halifax County, 1876, which office he held until his death at Dartmouth, November, 1900. Mr. Johnstone was a Fellow of the Senate of Acadia College, 1882–1891; Governor of Acadia University, 1891–1898. He was twice President of the Maritime Baptist Convention.

CLASS OF 1844.

George Armstrong, b. Tipperary County, Ireland, 1815, reared chiefly at St. John's, Newfoundland, and at Sydney, Cape Breton. Graduated, 1844; taught schools and travelled during the next three or four years; ordained to the ministry, December 31, 1848, at Port Medway, N. S.; Pastor Baptist Churches at Port Medway and at Chester until 1852; at Bridgetown, N. S., 1852–1870; Inspector of Public Schools for Annapolis County, until 1870; Editor and Publisher of "The Christian Visitor," 1870-1880; Pastor, Baptist Church, Kentville, N. S., 1880–1886; Port Hawkesbury, C. B., 1886; Governor of Acadia College for the term ending 1883; Senator of Acadia College 1883 until his death; died, Port Hawkesbury, C. B., June, 1886. Mr. Armstrong composed and delivered his graduating oration in Latin.

RICHARD E. BURPEE, b. York County, N. B. Graduated, 1844; Missionary under the American Baptist Missionary Union to Burmah, 1845–1850; on furlough in the Maritime Provinces, 1850-1853; died at Jacksonville, Florida, February 23, 1853.

Samuel Elder. Graduated, 1844; Pastor Baptist Church, Fredericton, N. B., 1844–1852. Mr. Elder possessed not only unusual pulpit power but poetic genius as well. At the college anniversaries in 1843 he delivered an original poem on "The Expulsion of the Acadians," and also delivered an original poem as his graduating oration in 1844. Died in Philadelphia, May 23, 1853.

WILLIAM F. STUBBERT. Graduated, 1844; Pastor for a short time of a church in Nova Scotia but soon removed to the United States where he held pastorates at Malden, Mass., Elizabethtown, N. J., and Bloomington, N. J., where he died in April, 1891.

George Robbins Wilby. Graduated, 1844. We are without any knowledge of this man except as we quote from the "Memorials of Acadia College and Horton Academy," by Rev. S. W. deBlois, D. D.: "A versatile genius. He went to Calcutta in 1846; became assistant editor of "The Friend of India," a newspaper of high character, and while filling this position with distinguished ability was called away about the year, 1868.

WILLIAM ALMON JOHNSTONE, b. Halifax. Graduated, 1845; studied law and was admitted to the bar of Nova Scotia, 1849, and to the Inner Temple, London, England, 1853; practised his profession, first, in Halifax, and later, at Charlottetown, P. E. I., 1849–1878; died at Windsor, N. S., in 1878.

Samuel Richardson, b. Belfast, Ireland, reared at Sydney, C. B. Graduated, 1845; taught school for some years after graduation; graduated from Newton Theological Institute, 1854; Pastor of a Baptist Church in Maine, and at North Middleboro, Mass., from 1854–1861; Clements, N. S., 1861–1864; Westport, N. S., 1864-1867; in mercantile business, Carleton, N. B., 1867–1869; died at Carleton, N. B., July 18, 1869. While still an undergraduate at Acadia, in 1844, Mr. Richardson was the winner of a prize of ten guineas, offered by the Halifax "Morning Post," on the resources of Nova Scotia. In this paper, Mr. R. advocated both the confederation of the Canadian Provinces and the construction of the Intercolonial Railway.

- JOHN MOSER, b. Moser's Island, St. Margaret's Bay, N. S., 1824.
 Graduated, 1848; graduated from Newton Theological Institute, 1853; taught in Horton Academy and in various places in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. Mr. Moser was an enthusiastic student of natural science. He devoted himself especially to the study of mosses and fungi. He discovered nearly a dozen specimens new to science.

S., 1853–1855; Leinster Street, St. John, N. B., 1855–1863; died in St. John, August, 1, 1863. Mr. DeMille is remembered as a man of rare ability and of Christ-like sympathy for the poor and suffering.

- THOMAS WILLIAM CRAWLEY. Graduated, 1850; graduated from Newton Theological Institute in 1854; Pastor of Baptist churches at Chester, N. S.; New Minas, N. S.; St. Andrews, N. B.; Reading, Mass; Amenia, N. Y.; St. Andrews, N. B.; Milltown, Me.; resided during the later years of his life in Cambridge, Mass., where he died October 12, 1894.

HENRY W. JOHNSTON, b. Halifax, N. S. Graduated, 1851; teacher in Horton Academy and Acadia College until 1853; student at Brown University, 1853–1854; studied law and was admitted to the Bar of Nova Scotia, 1860; practised his profession in Halifax; became Deputy Minister of Marine and Fisheries for the Dominion of Canada; later, resigned this office and removed to London, England, where he died, May 11, 1901.

S., 1866–1870; Sydney, C. B., 1870–1872; Port Hawkesbury, C. B., 1872–1874; Bedeque, P. E. I., 1875–1877; Hopewell, N. B., 1878–1881; Jacksonville, N. B., 1882–1884, Campton Village, N. H.; Springfield, Vermont; and in general missionary work in the United States, 1885–1898; Pastor Stewiacke, N. S., 1898–1899; since 1899 has resided at Berwick, N. S.; Mr. Chipman is now, (January, 1909), the oldest living graduate of the College.

I., 1886–1887; Tryon, P. E. I., 1887; stricken with partial paralysis, Mr. Skinner was obliged to retire from the ministry and spent the evening of his days at Liverpool, N. S., where he died March 30, 1895.

Isaiah Wallace, b. Coverdale, N. B., January 17, 1826. Graduated, 1855; served as Pastor of the Baptist Churches at Scotchtown, N. B.; Newcastle, N. B.; Carleton, N. B.; Lower Granville, N. S.; Milton, Yarmouth County, N. S.; and at Berwick, N. S.; was principal, for one year, of the New Brunswick Baptist Seminary; was, on various occasions, financial agent of Acadia College; his greatest work, however, was as an evangelist under the Home Mission Board of the Baptist Convention of the Maritime Provinces. In this capacity the labors of Mr. Wallace resulted in the conversion of many souls, the organization of several churches
