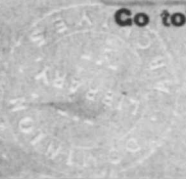

EXPLANATIONS OF THE ARTICLES OF CALENDAR

—AND—

ASTRONOMICAL NOTICES FOR THE YEAR 1891.

On the left hand page for each month are given the rising and setting of the Sun, with the length of the day, with the data necessary for Solar observations for time, namely:— The Equation of Time (Sun fast or slow of clock), which is given for the instant of Apparent Noon, and the Sun's Declination at Mean Noon, both Greenwich Time. With these two exceptions, all the calculations are reduced to the nearest minute of Local Mean Time at Charlottetown. Latitude $46^{\circ} 13' 55''$ N.; Longitude $63^{\circ} 7' 23''$ W., giving 4 hours, 12 minutes, 29.5 seconds difference slow in Greenwich.

If required, the Sun's Declination at Greenwich Apparent may be obtained from the data here given, by multiplying the hourly variations of Declination by the Equation of Time for the same day reduced to the decimal of an hour, and applying the result according to the conditions, as under.

From the Sun's apparent Semi-diameter, which is given to the nearest tenth of a second for each day of the year, may be found the Sun's Horizontal Parallax, which equals the apparent Semi-diameter of the earth as it would be seen at the distance of the Sun, by dividing by the constant quantity 107.44 *i. e.*, the ratio the Sun's actual diameter bears to that of the earth. Thus, on July 1st, when the Sun is at its greatest distance the apparent Semi-diameter is $15' 46'' = 946$, this divided by 107.44 gives 8.805, the Sun's Horizontal Parallax at that time. So also on December 31st, when the Sun is in Perigee the Semi-diameter $16^{\circ} 18' 3''$ gives 9.105 for Sun's Horizontal Parallax.

From this may be obtained the Parallax in altitude multiplying by the cosine of the Sun's apparent altitude at the time of observation.

On the right hand pages of each month are given the phases of the Moon, its Rising, Southing, and Setting, and the time of High Water at Charlottetown, all to the nearest minute of Local Mean Time.

As aids in the matter of weather forecasts, are added the bearing of the Moon at the time of Full and Change, the Perigee and Apogee, and the time of the Moon crossing the Equator and reaching its greatest North and South Declination. It being generally found that these Lunar Equinoctials are accompanied by atmospheric disturbance the more or less marked as they agree with the Moon's changes and Perigee—** or *** are added where two or three of these influences concur within the space of 48 hours.

ECLIPSES.

During the year 1891 there will be four Eclipses, viz.: two of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. A total Eclipse of the Moon, May 23rd, Greenwich Mean Time of Opposition in Right Ascension, 6h. 18m. 55.7 sec.; commencing 12.30 p. m., ending 8.05 Charlotte-town time, the Moon being below the horizon.

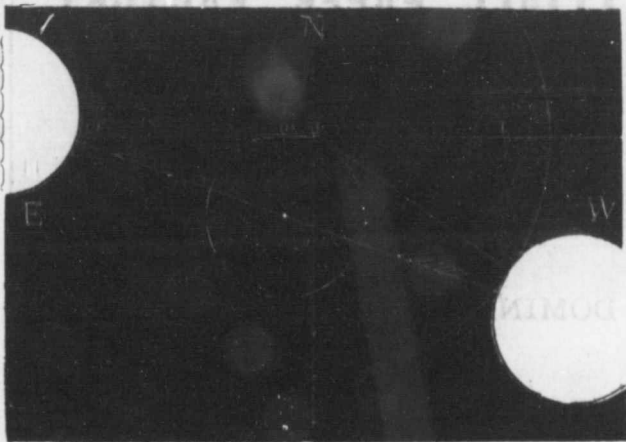
II. An annual Eclipse of the Sun, Greenwich Mean Time of Conjunction, June 6th, 4h. 38m. 0.2 sec., only visible as a partial Eclipse in Europe and North America, as far south as a line from the Straits of Belle Isle to the Gulf of California.

III. A total Eclipse of the Moon, November 15th, Greenwich Mean Time of Opposition, in Right Ascension, 12h. 8m. 45.2 sec. (ii).

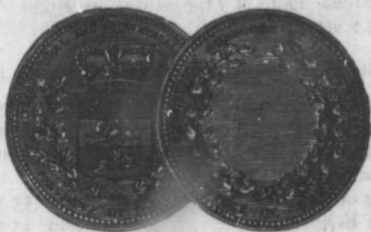

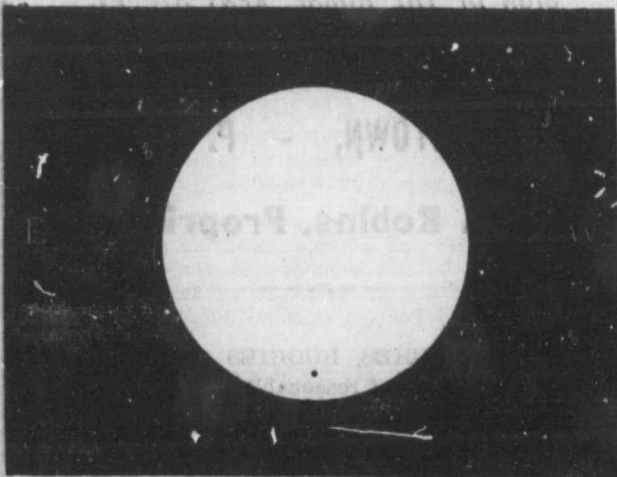

IV. A partial Eclipse of the Sun, December 1st, Greenwich Mean Time of Conjunction in Right Ascension, oh. 7m. 47 sec., p. m.

Transit of Mercury.

The most notable astronomical event of the year will be the passage of Mercury across the Sun's disc, which will occur May 5th, Greenwich Mean Time of Conjunction being 15h. 55m. 40.6 sec. A cut is subjoined, though unfortunately it will not be observable here, commencing as will be seen half an hour after sunset 7h. 41m. 15 sec., ending 38m. 5 sec. past midnight.

THE PLANETS.

MERCURY will be at his greatest elongation west of the Sun as a Morning Star, and to the east as an Evening Star, as follows: February 6th, $25^{\circ} 40' W.$; April 18th, $19^{\circ} 50' E.$; June 5th, $23^{\circ} 47' W.$; August 16th, $27^{\circ} 22' E.$; September 28th, $17^{\circ} 51' W.$; December 11th, $20^{\circ} 55' E.$ Between these dates his motion will be alternately direct and retrograde, coming in conjunction with the Sun January 13th, Inferior (*i. e.* between the Sun and earth); March 23rd, Superior (*i. e.* beyond the Sun); May 9th, Inferior; July 6th, Superior; September 12th, Inferior; October 27th, Superior; December 28th, Inferior. Mercury will be occulted by the Moon December 2nd, 9 p. m.

VENUS will commence as a Morning Star, with direct motion to her superior conjunction with the Sun, September 18th, after which she will re-appear in the west as an Evening Star till the end of the year. She will be occulted by the Moon, June 3rd, 9 a. m.; November 2nd, 3 p. m.

MARS with direct motion throughout the year, will commence as an Evening Star till his conjunction with the Sun, July 30th, 4 a. m., re-appearing as a Morning Star till the year's end, he will be occulted by the Moon May 10th, 1h. 30m., a. m., December 26th, 10 a. m.

JUPITER will commence the year as an Evening Star, coming in conjunction with the Sun February 13th, 9.45 a. m.; re-appears as a Morning Star till his opposition to the Sun, September 5th, his motion will be direct till July 7th, retrograde till November 3rd, and direct to the end of the year.

SATURN will retrograde till May 12th, after which direct to the end of the year. In opposition to the Sun March 4th, in conjunction September 13th. The earth in its orbit will cross the plane of Saturn's rings, which in consequence will be invisible except by the help of a powerful telescope.

URANUS in apparent motion will be direct till February 4th, retrograde till July 5th, afterwards direct to the end of the year. He will be in conjunction with Mars December 15th, 5.40 a. m., being at the time of Moon's diameter to the

NEPTUNE.—Motion retrograde till February 13th, direct till September 11th, and retrograde to the end of the year. In conjunction with the Sun May 27th, in opposition November 29th. He will be twice occulted by the Moon January 19th, 10.18 a. m., February 16th, 3.51, a. m.

That of Mercury to our latitude only appearing as a near approach.

CLASSIFICATION OF MAIL MATTER, RATES, &c.

First-class Matter.

Letters addressed to all places in Canada and the United States 3 cents per ounce. Partial prepayment is required in the case of letters addressed to Canada, and prepayment of one rate on letters addressed to the United States.

Post Cards issued at 1 cent each, are intended for use for Canada and the United States, but may be sent to other countries with stamps affixed to complete prepayment.

Second-class Matter.]

Newspapers and Periodicals posted from the office of publication, and authorized to pass free of postage to regular subscribers in Canada, the United States and Newfoundland.

Third-class Matter.

Matter of this class must be so packed or put up as to be easily opened for examination, and there must be no correspondence enclosed.

Newspapers and Periodicals.

All Drop Newspapers and Periodicals (for delivery where posted) transient newspapers and periodicals posted for transmission to places in Canada, the United States or Newfoundland, must be prepaid 1 cent per 4 oz or fraction of 4 oz.—weighing less than 1 oz. they may be posted singly if prepaid $\frac{1}{2}$ cent each.

Books, &c., and Miscellaneous Matter.

The postage on Books, Pamphlets, Circulars, Occasional Publications, &c., addressed to Canada or Newfoundland is 1 cent per 4 oz.—to the United States, Great Britain and all European countries, 1 cent per 2 oz. The Postage on Printers' Proof Sheets, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Lithographs, Photographs, Sheet Music, etc., addressed to Canada, the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain, or any European country, is 1 cent per 2 oz. No Package must exceed 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. The limit of weight for Canada, United States and Great Britain, is 5 lbs., for other Postal Union countries 4 lbs.

Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots and Scions or Grafts can only be sent to the United States as 5th Class Matter, when posted for delivery in Canada the Postage is 1 cent per 4 oz., and the limit of weight 5 lbs.

Patterns and Samples.

Bona fide Patterns and Samples of Merchandise not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, may be sent to any place in Canada and Newfoundland, for 1 cent per 4 oz. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or any articles sent by any one private individual to another, *not being actually Trade Patterns or Samples*, are not admissible as such. The limit of weight to the United States, England, and all countries in Europe, is *eight ounces*—Postage 2 cents for the first 4 ounces, and 1 cent for every additional 2 ounces.

4th Class Matter—Parcel Post for Canada,

Parcels closed at the ends and sides, and not exceeding

five lbs. in weight, may be posted at any Post Office in Canada for conveyance to any Post Office in the Dominion at the following rates :—

The size of a parcel must not exceed two feet in length, or one foot in breadth or thickness. The Postage must be prepaid by stamp, and the parcel should be marked "BY PARCEL POST." Parcels may be registered by affixing a 5 cent Registration Stamp thereto in addition to the postage.

Parcels cannot be transmitted by Post to any place beyond the limits of Canada, except by

Parcel Post for the United Kingdom and Newfoundland.

Parcels securely and substantially packed and closed for the United Kingdom and Newfoundland, limited in weight to 5 lbs., and in size to two feet in length by one foot in width or depth, will be received up to 8 p. m. daily, Sundays and holidays excepted, at the Registration Office, under conditions explained there to the senders, for transmission in the weekly mails despatched by the Steamers of the Canadian lines. Rates 25 cents per lb., or fraction of a lb.

Parcel Post is now extended to Australia, Bahamas, Burmuda, Cape of Good Hope, Ceylon, China, Denmark, Egypt, France, Germany, Greece, Holland, India, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, Trinidad, Turkey and Zanzibar. Rates on application at Offices.

5th Class Matter.

Postage rate 1 cent per ounce, or fraction of an ounce to be prepaid by Postage Stamp.

Miscellaneous articles of Merchandise, and generally all matter permitted to pass by mail in Canada ; which is not of the nature of a letter, and therefore subject to a letter rate of postage, and not entitled to be posted at a lower rate than 5th Class under one of the other classes, (including Packages of Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots, Patterns and

Samples addressed to the United States), may pass as 5th Class when addressed to any destination within the Dominion or the United States.

5th Class matter must be so packed or put up so as to be open to examination of contents, and must not exceed 4 pounds in weight nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. When passing between Canada and the United States it will be subject to Custom regulations if liable to duty. The Registration charged on 5th Class matter is 5 cents in addition to Postage.

Registration fee on all classes of matter for Canada and the United States, and for Postal Union countries, is 5 cents; and it is desirable that the stamp used should be a registration stamp.

All classes of matter may be registered to all destinations in Canada and throughout the Postal Union, and letters may be registered to most of the countries not included in the Union, and the sender of a registered article to Postal Union countries may entitle himself to an acknowledgment of delivery from the party addressed by the payment of a fee of 5 cents in addition to the registration fee.

All letters for Registration should be posted 15 minutes before the hour of closing ordinary Mails, and 30 minutes before closing of English Mails.

Correspondence with United States.

On all articles of merchandise the rate will be one cent per oz. or fraction of an oz., to be prepaid by postage stamp.

On books, pamphlets, occasional publications, printed circulars, prices current, hand bills, advertising sheets, book and newspaper manuscript, printers' proof sheets, whether corrected or not, maps, prints, drawings, engravings, lithographs, photographs, sheet music, whether printed or written, such as deeds, insurance policies, or other documents of a like nature, the rate will be one cent per 2 oz., or a fraction of 2 oz., to be prepaid by postage stamp.

The registration charged on all articles of correspondence of whatever description—whether letters, printed or miscellaneous matter—when addressed to the United States,

and posted for registration, will be 5 cents, to be prepaid by the appropriate 5 cent registration stamp, in addition to the ordinary postage rate.

The term merchandise will include packages of seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions or grafts, patterns and samples, and the one cent per oz. rate will apply to all these articles, and generally to all miscellaneous 5th class matter.

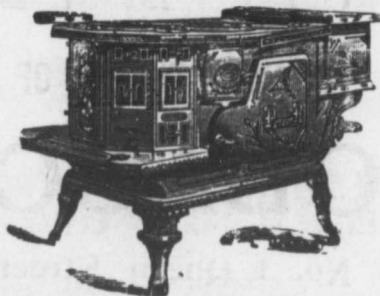



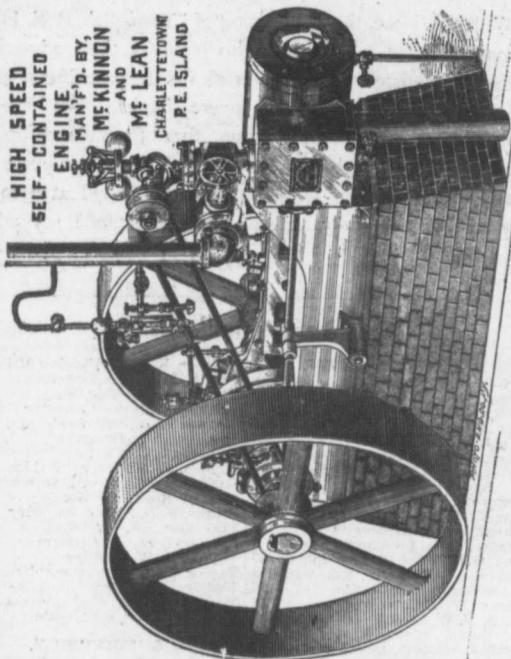
