The object of these ruthans is inco prehensible, and their daring and perseverance n their diabolical designs plainly show that In their basic test designs planny show that there must be some object beyond that of mere plunder. On the 9th instant, they succeeded in firing the Government street Theatre, which with the beautiful dwelling adjoining and a number of other buildings were totally destroyed

in three hours. It is stated that one man had been arrested and that his examination would soon take place amid a tremendous excitement.

A very important trial touching the law of Marine Insurance came on before Mr. Justice Marine insurance came on before hir sushce Bowen and a Special Jury, on Titursday last, in the Court of King's Bench, the judge sitting in vacation, and continued during the following day and half of Saturday. The action, which was brought by Messrs. Gillespie, Jamieson & Co. against the Canada Marine Insurance Company, arose out of the loss of the three masted schooner Iudustry while on her way from Montego Bay to Quebec, in Septem 1837, and was brought to recover the sum of £2000 being the amount of risk taken by the Company on a portion of the cargo owned by the Plaintiffs. The principal point moote the case, and on which the defence mainly rested, was whether the vessel was consider unseaworthy in leaving port with only one novigator i. e., understanding the theory of navigation, which was the case with the Industry, The trial resulted in a verdict for the Plaintin in the sum of £2006, with interest from the day of demand.




