



Captain Arthur Holford Ardagh

Worn, December 21, 1893 Died, May 10, 1917

Joined 35th Regiment (Simcoe Foresters) in 1913 and promoted Captain, March 23, 1914. Appointed Lieutenant 35th Battalion, C.E.J., April 20, 1915. Served in France with 20th Battalion. Promoted Captain, November 19, 1916. Killed in Action, Arleux Loop, France. Buried in Lievin Communal Cemetery Extension, France.

Major John Douglas Armour

Worn, Kovember 13, 1888 Died, February 21, 1919

Joined 21st (Mestmount) Battery, 6th Bde., C.J.A. as Lieutenant, October 15, 1910. Appointed Lieutenant, 2nd Bde., C.J.A., C.E.J. September 22, 1914. Served in France with 2nd Bde. C.J.A. and 12th Bde., C.J.A. Adjutant, June 21, 1916. Staff Captain, November 25, 1917. Promoted, Captain, May 19, 1915. Acting Major, January 3, 1917 to February 12, 1917. Major, July 30, 1917. Mentioned in Despatches. Died of Sickness, London, England. Buried in Canadian Military Cemetery, Brookwood, England.

Lieut-Col. Samuel Gustabus Beckett

Born, December 2, 1869 Died, March 1, 1917

Appointed Lieutenant, 9th Mississauga Horse, March 18, 1902. Major, November 25, 1913. (Previous Service in Ranks). Lieutenant-Colonel, 75th Battalion, C.C.F., July 1, 1915. Served in France with 75th Battalion. Mentioned in Despatches. Killed in Action, Carency, France. Buried in Villers Station Military Cemetery, France.

Major George Wilhelm Bennett

Born, May 8, 1864 **Died, April** 23, 1915

Major, 57th Regiment (Peterborough Rangers) September 18, 1907. (Had 3 years' Cavalry and 31 years' Infantry Service in Canadian Militia previous to joining C.E.F.) Major, 2nd Battalion, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 2nd Battalion. Killed in Action, St. Julien, Belgium. Burial place not known.

Lieut. Carl Norwood Bennett

Worn, Aobember 10, 1895 Wied, June 24, 1918

Joined 63rd Regiment (Halifax Rifles), as Lieutenant, June 1, 1913. Appointed Lieutenant, Mo. 1 Gverseas Draft, 63rd Regiment, C.E.J., January 3, 1916. Served in France with Canadian Machine Gun Corps and Royal Flying Corps. Flying Officer (Observer), January 24, 1917. Mounded, June 2, 1917. Died of Sickness, Woolwich, England. Buried in Canadian Military Cemetery, Brookwood, England.

Lieut. Montagu Herbert Bird

Worn February 22, 1896 **D**ied, July 9, 1918

Lieutenant, 134th Battalion, January 3, 1916. Embarked for England, August 8, 1916. Taken on strength of 1st Central Ontario Regimental Depot from 134th Battalion, and shown detached to Royal Flying Corps, November 6, 1917. Seconded for duty with Royal Air Force, November 6, 1917. Seriously injured, Aeroplane Accident, March 7, 1918. Granted Temporary Commission as 2nd Lieutenant (Pilot), and to be Honorary Lieutenant, Map 19, 1918. Taken on strength, Canadian Records List, on arrival in France for duty with R.A.F., June 29, 1918. Died of Wounds at Ao. 20 Casualty Clearing Station, July 9, 1918. Buried at Vignacourt British Cemeterp, France.

Lieut. Felix Olivier Bolte

Worn, April 22, 1894 Died, September 2, 1918

Joined 2nd Regiment (Queen's Own Rifles of Canada) as Lieutenant, March 11, 1914. Appointed Lieutenant, 35th Battalion, C.E.F. May 29, 1915. Served in France with 5th C.M.R. and 3rd Battalion. Chounded, September 15, 1916. Killed in Action in shell hole vicinity of Bois-de-Bouche, by shell fire. Buried in Dominion British Cemetery, France.

Captain Harry Stewart Boulter

Worn, Aobember 18, 1892 Died, April 4, 1917

Joined 9th Mississauga Horse as Lieutenant, September 9, 1915. Appointed Lieutenant, 124th Battalion, C.E.F. December 4, 1915. Served in France with 124th Battalion. Promoted Captain, January 2, 1917. Killed in Action, Porth of Neuville St. Vaast, France. Buried in Villers Station Military Cemetery. France.

Major Jeffrey Harper Bull, D.S.G.

Worn, September 2, 1888 Wied, August 8, 1918

Joined 36th Peel Regiment as Lieutenant, Wecember 14, 1914. Appointed Lieutenant, 75th Battalion, C.E.F., August 1, 1915. Promoted Captain, October 4, 1915. Served in France with 75th Battalion. Promoted Major, July 1, 1916. D.S.O. Mentioned in Despatches. Killed in Action by shell near Beaucourt, France. Buried in Beaucourt British Cemetery, France.

Major Walter Epre Curry

Worn, February 28, 1891 **D**ied, April 9, 1917

Joined 2nd Regiment (Queen's Own Rifles of Canada), as Lieutenant, January 20, 1911. Appointed Lieutenant, 3rd Battalion, C.E.f., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 3rd Battalion and returned to Canada on Sick Leave, being retained for duty, October 1, 1915. Appointed Lieutenant, 83rd Battalion, October 1, 1915. Promoted Captain, October 20, 1915, and Major, January 17, 1916. Proceeded to England with 83rd Battalion. Reverted to Captain in order to return to France, rejoining the 3rd Battalion in France, July 1, 1916. Appointed Acting-Major, Nobember 19, 1916. Killed in Action by shell, Vimp Ridge, France. Buried in Ecoibres Military Cemetery, France.

Captain Robert Clifford Darling

Born, May 23, 1886 **D**ied, April 19, 1915

Graduate Royal Military College, 1907. Joined 48th Regiment (Highlanders) as Lieutenant, Mobember 9, 1907. Promoted Captain, April 2, 1914. Appointed Adjutant, April 24, 1911. Appointed Captain and Adjutant, 15th Battalion, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 15th Battalion. Wounded, March 23, 1915. Died of Wounds, London, England. Buried in Mount Pleasant Cemetery, Toronto, Ont.

Lieut. Reginald Neville Craig Davis

Worn, January 16, 1889 Died, May 24, 1915

Appointed Lieutenant, 2nd Regiment (Queen's Own Rifles of Canada), December 3, 1912. Appointed Lieutenant, 3rd Battalion, C.E.J., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 3rd Battalion. Missing, Festubert, France. Burial Place not known.

Lieut.=Col. George Taylor Denison

Worn, November 12, 1869 Wied, May 8, 1917

Commissioned Officer in Governor-General's Body Guard for 25 years. Promoted Major December 14, 1909. Transferred to Reserve of Officers, July 14, 1913. Appointed Major 2nd Divisional Cyclists, C.E.J., November 23, 1914. Promoted Lieutenant-Colonel, February, 1915. Served in France with 19th Battalion. Reverted from Lieutenant-Colonel to Major at own request, August 2, 1916. Killed in Action, West of Fresnoy, France. Buried in Ecoivres Military Cemetery, France.

Lieut. John Edward Doheny

Worn, October 22, 1893 Died, April 29, 1916

Joined 2nd Regiment (Queen's Own Rifles of Canada as Lieutenant, August 25, 1914. Appointed Lieutenant, 20th Battalion, C.E.J., May 28, 1915. Served in France with 20th Battalion. Died of Mounds received at St. Cloi, Belgium. Buried in Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery, Belgium.

Lieut. Lindsay Drummond

Born, July 1, 1893 Died, May 18, 1917

Graduate Royal Military College, 1914. Appointed Lieutenant, 1st Divisional Engineers, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 1st Divisional Engineers, and Royal Flying Corps. Observer, R.F.C., July 28, 1916. Flying Officer, R.F.C., April 3, 1917. Missing, not known. Burial place not known.

Captain George Gordon Duncan

Worn, January 25, 1892 Died, May 22, 1915

Joined 36th Peel Regiment as Lieutenant, April 6, 1912. Appointed Lieutenant, 10th Battalion, September 22, 1914. Served in France with 10th Battalion. Promoted Captain, April 24, 1915. Mounded, April 22, 1915. Killed in Action by shell at Festubert, France. Buried in Brown's Old Military Cemetery, France.

Lieut. Jaffrey Eaton

Born, June 6, 1886 Died, October 26, 1917

Captain, July 5, 1906. Adjutant, September, 19, 1913. Appointed Captain and Adjutant, 86th Machine Gun Battalion, C.E.J., October 11, 1915. Transferred to 147th Battalion, and promoted Major, January 1, 1916. Hon. Captain and Quartermaster, 147th Battalion, September 23, 1916. Reverted to Lieutenant and served in France with 4th C.M.R. Killed in Action, Passchendaele, Belgium. Burial place not known.

Capt. Walter Leslie Lockhart Gordon

Born, September 30, 1890 Died, April 26, 1915

Graduate Royal Military College, 1911. Joined 9th Mississauga Horse as Lieutenant, June 22, 1911. Appointed Lieutenant, 2nd Battalion, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Promoted Captain, March 17, 1915. Served in France with 2nd Battalion. Killed in Action, St. Julien, Belgium. Burial place not known.

Major Albert Newton Gurney

Born, January 5, 1890 Died, September 12, 1918

Joined 91st Regiment (Canadian Highlanders) as Lieutenant, January 23, 1915. Appointed Lieutenant, 92nd Battalion, September 18, 1915. Served in France with 4th Battalion. Acting Captain, October 10, 1916 to April 23, 1917. Acting Major, December 4, 1916 to January 3, 1917. Mounded, September 21, 1916 and September 2, 1918. Mentioned in Despatches. Died of Mounds received near Cagnicourt, France. Buried in Terlincthun British Cemetery, France.

Major Harold Kilbourne Harris, M.C.

Born Ianuary 14, 1887 Died, February 22, 1918

Appointed Prov. Lieut., 48th Regiment (Highlanders), September 1, 1914. Seconded and granted a commission as 2nd Lieutenant. The Essex Regiment (Special Reserve), June 8. 1915. Appointed Acting Captain, October 26, 1915. Promoted Lieutenant, July 1, 1917. Awarded the Military Cross (London Gazette dated May 26, 1917). Appointed Temporary Captain, April 27, 1917. Reported Missing and Wounded, February 22, 1918. Presumed to have Died on or since February 22, 1918. According to German Burial Report this Officer Died on February 22, 1918, was Buried in Single Grave No. 112, Pronville Soldier's Cemetery; Exhumed, and Re-buried in Grabe 37. Row A. Plot 8, H.A.C. Cemetery, Ecoust St. Mein.

Lieut.=Col. William Frederick Richard Hart=McHarg

Worn, February 16, 1869 Died, April 24, 1915

2nd Battalion, R.C.R., South African War, 1899-1900. Queen's Medal with four clasps. 6th Regiment (The Duke of Connaught's Own Rifles), Major, November 16, 1910. Lieutenant-Colonel, 7th Battalion, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 7th Battalion. Mentioned in Despatches. Died of Wounds received at Ppres, Belgium. Buried in Poperinghe Old Military Cemetery, Belgium.

Lieut. Geoffrey Heighington, M.C.

Born, January 8, 1896 Died, Kovember 2, 1918

Joined 48th Regiment (Highlanders) as Lieutenant, June 6, 1915. Appointed Lieutenant, 134th Battalion, C.E.F., January 16, 1916. Served in France with 4th C.M.R. Military Cross. Died of Sickness at Torquay, England. Buried in Torquay Cemetery, Debon, England.

Captain Joseph Grant Helliwell

Worn, November 26, 1888 Died, June 15, 1915

Served 5 years in 2nd Field Company, Canadian Engineers, and 3 years in 21st Regiment (Essex Fusiliers). Captain, April 1, 1912. Appointed Lieutenant, 1st Battalion, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 1st Battalion. Promoted Captain, March 7, 1915. Killed in Action, Sivenchy, France. Burial place not known.

Major George Mowat Higinbotham, M.V.G.

Worn, March 1, 1866 Died, March 11, 1915

Served 32 years in 2nd Regiment (Queen's Own Rifles of Canada), Major, January 15, 1913. 2nd Regiment, Q.O.R. Horth-Mest Rebellion, 1885. Medal. M.V.O., 4th Class. Appointed Major, 3rd Battalion, C.E.J., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 3rd Battalion. Died of Sickness, Shorncliffe, England. Buried in Newington Parish Churchyard, Shorncliffe, England.

Lieut. Richard Henry Hocken

Worn, February 21, 1892 Died, October 10, 1918

Joined 9th Mississauga Horse as Lieutenant, June 3, 1915. Appointed Lieutenant, Depot Regiment, C.M.R., C.E.F., Pobember 15, 1915. Transferred to 198th Battalion, March 1, 1916. Served in France with Canadian Light Horse. Killed in Action, East of Iwuy, France, (Machine Gun Bullet). Buried in Drummond Military Cemetery, France.

Lieut. Herbert Spencer Holcroft

Worn, September 4, 1877 Died, July 8, 1916

Lieutenant, The Governor-General's Joot Guards, April 25, 1906. Appointed Lieutenant No. 2 Tunnelling Company, C.E.J., January 4, 1916. Served with No. 2 Tunnelling Company in France. Died of Sick ness, London, England. Buried in Bolney Parish Church, Bolney, Sussex, England.

Lieut. Francis Carl Howard

Worn, September 24, 1894 Died, September 9, 1916

Joined 9th Mississauga Horse as Lieutenant, February 23, 1915. Appointed Lieutenant, 75th Battalion, C.E.F., July 23, 1915. Served in France with 75th Battalion. Died of Mounds whilst Prisoner of War. Buried in Pont du Hem Military Cemetery, France.

Lieut. William Campbell Ince

Born, July 14, 1890 Died, June 3, 1916

Joined 10th Regiment (Royal Grenadiers) as Lieutenant, September 12, 1914. Appointed Lieutenant, 35th Battalion, C.E.J., April 1, 1915. Served in France with 8th Infantry Brigade, M. G. Company. Killed in Action, Maple Copse, Ppres Salient, Belgium. Buried in Artillery Wood Cemetery, Boesinghe, Belgium.

Lieut.=Col. Thomas Craik Irving, D.S.G.

Worn, August 31, 1879 Died, October 29, 1917

Captain, 2nd Field Company, Canadian Engineers, June 1, 1911. Appointed Captain, 2nd Field Company, Canadian Engineers, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Served in France with Canadian Engineers. Promoted Major, September 13, 1915. Promoted Lieutenant-Colonel, October 14, 1916. C.R.E., 4th Division, October 14, 1916. D.S.O. Mentioned in Despatches twice. Died of Mounds from Bomb Mounds received at Passchendaele. Buried in Brandhoek new Military Cemetery No. 3, Belgium.

Lieut. Cecil Arthur James

Born, April 30, 1885 Died, June 15, 1915

Joined 22nd Regiment (The Oxford Rifles) as Lieutenant, February 28, 1913. Appointed Lieutenant, 1st Battalion, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 1st Battalion. Killed in Action, Givenchy, France. Buried in Beuvry Communal Cemetery, France.

Lieut. William Dummer Powell Jarvis

Worn, March 31, 1892 Died, April 24, 1915

Joined The Governor-General's Body Guard as Lieutenant, Aovember 22, 1911. Appointed Lieutenant, 3rd Battalion, C.C.J., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 3rd Battalion. Killed in Action, St. Julien, by Rifle Bullet. Burial place not known.

Major Richard William Fisher Jones

Worn, January 17, 1884 Died, April 15, 1917

Joined 3rd The Prince of Wales Canadian Dragoons as Lieutenant, April 3, 1911. Appointed Lieutenant, 2nd Battalion, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 2nd Battalion and returned to Canada for duty December 1, 1915. Appointed Captain and Adjutant, 124th Battalion, December 16, 1915. Served in France with 124th Battalion. Promoted Major, May, 1916. Reverted to Captain for purpose of proceeding to France, March 10, 1917. Appointed Acting Major, March 11, 1917. Killed in Action, Shrapnel, near Souchez, France. Buried in Villers Station Military Cemetery, France.

Lieut. Kenneth William Junor, M.C.

Born, August 3, 1896 Died, April 23, 1918

Joined 9th Mississauga Horse as Lieutenant, January 5, 1915. Appointed Lieutenant, 75th Battalion, C.C.F., July 1, 1915. Served in France with Canadian Machine Gun Corps, and Royal Flying Corps. Flying Officer, July 28, 1917. Military Cross. Missing, not known. Burial place not known.

Lieut. Ernest Reece Kappele

Born, June 25, 1893 **D**ied, April 9, 1917

Joined 9th Mississauga Horse as Lieutenant, March 22, 1915. Appointed Lieutenant, 75th Battalion, July 22, 1915. Served in France with 75th Battalion. Killed in Action at Vimy Ridge. Buried in Canadian Cemetery No. 2, Neuville St. Vaast, France.

Major Albert Edward Kimmins

Worn, December 30, 1871 Died, April 24, 1915

Served 14 years in 77th Wentworth Regiment. Major, June 17, 1911. Appointed Major, 1st Battalion, C.E.J., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 1st Battalion. Mentioned in Despatches. Killed in Action, St. Julien, Belgium. Burial place not known.

Lieut. Alexander Douglas Kirkpatrick

Worn, January 1, 1891 Died, April 23, 1915

Served 5 years in Governor-General's Body Guard. Lieutenant, 2nd Regiment (Queen's Own Rifles of Canada), August 11, 1914. Appointed Lieutenant, 3rd Battalion, C.E.F., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 3rd Battalion. Killed in Action, St. Julien, Belgium. Burial place not known.

Lieut. Herbert Norman Klotz

Born, January 19, 1887 Died, April 23, 1915

Served in Ranks, 9th Mississauga Horse. Lieutenant, 9th M.H., May 15, 1909. Appointed Lieutenant, 2nd Battalion, C.E.J., September 22, 1914. Served in France with 2nd Battalion. Killed in Action, St. Julien, Belgium. Burial place not known.

Major James Miles Langstaff

Born, July 25, 1883 Died, March 1, 1917

Joined 9th Mississauga Horse as Lieutenant, January 30, 1915. Appointed Lieutenant, 75th Battalion, C.E.F., July 1, 1915. Left Canada as Captain and Adjutant, 75th Battalion. Served in France with 75th Battalion. Appointed Acting Major, November 19, 1916. Mentioned in Despatches. Killed in Action near Souchez, France. Buried in Villers Station Military Cemetery, France.

Lieut.=Col. Edwin Woodman Leonard, **B.S.O**.

Worn, November 23, 1883 Died, April 9, 1917

Graduate, Royal Military College, 1903. Joined 6th (London) Battery, C.J.A., 1903. Major, Ianuary 17, 1910. Appointed Major, 3rd Bde., C.J.A., C.E.J., September 22, 1914. Served in France, 3rd Brigade, C.J.A. Promoted Lieutenant-Colonel, June 21, 1916. D.S.O. Mentioned in Despatches three times. Died of Mounds received at Vimy. Buried in Lapugnoy Military Cemetery, France.

Lieut. Loudon Brian Melville Loudon

Born, October 3, 1892 Died, September 1, 1918

Joined 48th Regiment (Highlanders) as Lieutenant, March 23, 1914. Appointed Lieutenant, 92nd Battalion, C.E.F., August 4, 1915. Promoted Captain, September, 1915. Served in France with 15th Battalion. Reverted to Lieutenant, March 8, 1918. Mounded, September 26, 1916. Killed in Action near Hendecourt, France, by shrapnel. Buried in Dominion British Cemetery, France.

Lieut. Frederick Ross Medland

Worn, March 23, 1885 Died, April 24, 1915
