

The Coming Contition.

The next government in England will probably be a coalition, and for these among other reasons : The franchise and redistribution of seats having been settled certain large causes of agitation are removed. Both liberals and conservatives will now cultivate the new constituencies to the best of their ability, and it may not be that the liberals will always have the lead. By conceding accomplished facts. the conservatives may make the best of the situation. We may ask them, why should they not do it?

The whole development of political reform and progress in England has gone on this line-the acceptance by the conservative party of reforms forced upon servative party of reforms forced upon them from the other side. The fact of these reforms having been forced is not denied, but the conservative party claims credit for holding back. Consequently, the conservative party is always in the wrong-that is to say, it opposes now what it will consent to ten or twenty wears it will consent to ten or twenty years

hence.

hence.
The English conservatives having conceded the reform amendments, would it be strange if public opinion called for a halt? Great changes have been made, let us see how they will work. 


