Escaping from Siberia.
The Englishman arranged with a companion to take me to Tashkent.

In the July number of an English publication, "Our Corner," Miss H. B. Bradshaw, daughter of the redoubtable M. P. for Northampton, contributes an account given her by Alexander Kourbanoff, a Siberian exile, of his escape from the fangs of the Russian gale, and his walk through Europe, until he reached England. Here is a description of some of the hardships encountered during his long and tedious journey - For eight days I was without other food than grass, berries and wild fruit. I walked generally by night, and slept in the trees during the day. I chose the trees for my resting place, because there I felt more secure from the attacks of bears, of which there were a great number in the forests. But I am not going to abuse the bear, for although I hardly dared to sleep for fear of him, yet I found him a useful animal; more than once he protected me from the attacks of bears, which he drove off by leaping on them. I found the bear to be not so ferocious as the popular opinion is. I was not long in becoming familiar with the habits and customs of this wild animal. I found that when a bear had captured his prey, he would dig it round and round, clearing the ground all about; then having satisfied his hunger, he would bury the excess of his partially devoured victim in the centre of his charmed circle, thus making provision for a "rainy day." As poor bear! how perplexed he must have felt when he came back for another choice morsel to find his prey gone, and he in turn had been preyed upon. However, I never stayed long at any one place. At all times I was on the alert, for I had already learned that bears were very cunningly sly, and were in the habit of following their prey, so that I could not be too careful to keep them from seeing me. I had to be especially careful of my gun, and was only too glad to get to a safe place with my booty, so that I might have the bear's meat to eat. I had already hinted my liking for bears was considerably tempered with fear, for they manifested a most peculiar desire to see a human companion, and I could only keep them away by fire, materials for making which I took the precaution never to be without, whatever else I might lack. The wilderness was very troublesome to me, and I often flew in large packs, but a little fire soon put them also to flight.

At Yenesiek I fell in with a man who, too, was making his way into Europe. We asked each other no awkward questions. We accepted it as a matter of course that people should take a little walk of a few thousand miles across Siberia, and were glad of each other's company. From Yenesiek we went to Beluk, a village on the Chelium. Our way had laid through wild forests, and we were constantly pursued by wolves. At all times I was on the alert, for I had already learned that bears were very cunningly sly, and were in the habit of following their prey, so that I could not be too careful to keep them from seeing me. I had to be especially careful of my gun, and was only too glad to get to a safe place with my booty, so that I might have the bear's meat to eat.
