BERESFORD ROASTS NAVY

Indulged in Scathing Criticism in the Imperial House of Commons Yesterday. The department lacks initiative. Treasury Control is fatal to the efficiency of the navy fleet.

THE DEPARTMENT LACKS INITIATIVE

Treasury Control is fatal to the efficiency of the navy fleet. London, June 20.—During the course of the discussion of the navy estimates in the House of Commons to-day, Rear Admiral Lord Charles Beresford (Conservative) scathingly criticized the deficiencies of the navy. He declared the whole admiralty system was rotten and led to the great extravagance and the general want of efficiency of the navy, on which depended the existence of the empire.

UNCLE SAM COCKSURE

Sir Wilfrid Laurier was quoted the other day as having stated to a New York newspaper man that the refusal of the United States to arbitrate the question of the Alaskan boundary is a menace of open conflict between the two countries. It is interesting to note how at least a section of the American press views this assertion. The New York World says: The only "question" is the question whether the Russo-British treaty of 1825 means what it says. It states that the line shall be the 60th parallel, shall thence run along the summit of the mountains "parallel to the coast of the United States, then for the distance of ten marine leagues to the meridian of the "Frozen Ocean"; but, wherever the mountain summits are more than ten miles from the coast, the boundary, in the treaty's exact words, "shall be formed by a parallel to the coast, which shall never exceed the distance of ten marine leagues therefrom."

THE STEEL TRUST DECISION

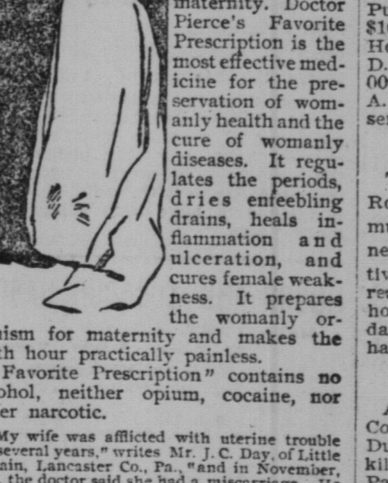
Unless the decision is reversed in a higher court, the United States Steel Corporation will be restrained from carrying out the great scheme its officers had formulated for converting preferred stock of the corporation into common stock of the corporation. The plan called for the retirement of \$200,000,000 worth of 7 per cent. stock, issuing in its place \$250,000,000 worth of 5 per cent. bonds. The operation was to be engineered by a syndicate, of which Mr. Morgan is the directing spirit, for the stock of 7 per cent. The stockholders, except for a few dissenters, had agreed to the proposition and some progress had been made in the work of exchanging securities.

THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY

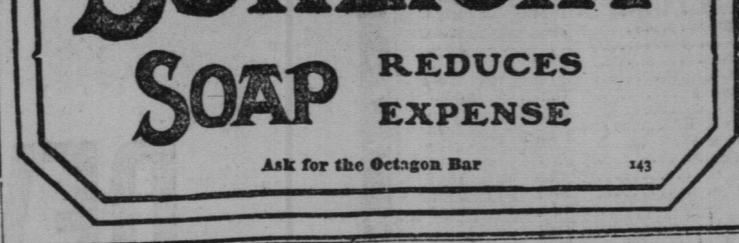

## NO EVIDENCE AGAINST KANE

Proprietor of the Ocean House, Charged With Receiving, Relieved of the Imputation.

### TWO MORE CONDUCTORS COMMITTED

Alfred Ferguson and Joseph Henry Will Stand Trial for Theft From Street Railway Company.

When the street railway cases were called in the Police Court yesterday, it was announced by Crown Attorney Curry that there was "no evidence" against John Kane, proprietor of the Ocean House, at the junction of King and Queen-streets, charged with receiving stolen property, and he was, therefore, discharged. Theodore Murphy, who keeps a barber shop adjoining the Ocean House, who was also charged with receiving, was remanded for a week.

Alfred Ferguson was placed on trial for robbing the fare boxes, and Detective George Porter and Detective Verney gave evidence touching the man's arrest. Then the Pinkerton, Caulfield, went on the stand. He said he conferred with Ferguson about his dealings with the railway company, in the use of the Ocean House. "I told him," said Caulfield, "that the amount I was drawing from the company was not enough to pay my expenses, and I hinted that there were other ways of making money. Ferguson shook hands with me and told me that a dollar of the company's money did him as much good as a dollar he earned. On April 18, while he had charge of a motor car, he came back to my car and used a 'digger' to get six cents pieces out of his fare box. He made no bones about it. Later that same day I saw him use the 'digger' again on Bathers' street."

Mr. Curry produced the two 'diggers' found in the asylum grounds on the day after the first arrests, and they were of a different model than the others, and Caulfield was able to identify them as connected with Ferguson. They were not put in as evidence. Ferguson was committed for trial.

The next conductor arraigned was Joseph Henry. Detective Verney testified that Henry surrendered on June 18, having been charged with a warrant, and accompanied Henry to his room, but found nothing there. Detective Caulfield told him that he had made when there were 35 cash fares and he had got about half of them. He was committed for trial.

Albert Cooper, the last of the accused conductors to be tried, and the first who was admitted to bail, stood out of the case. He had been charged with the arrest of this man, and of finding nothing in his room. Caulfield swore that Cooper told him he would show him how to make a 'digger' if he would get some steel from Rice Lewis. On another occasion Cooper said he was going to bring a wife from Grimsby in the fall, and he must have \$150 by that time. On May 15 he showed the witness a 'digger,' which he had made, and he told him that if he got any colors in his box and did not have a 'digger' with him he (the prisoner) would get them out for him. Caulfield was remanded till next Friday, as the Crown did not have all the evidence ready.

Restocking Inland Lakes. Yesterday a carload of fish were taken from Lake Erie to Lake Ontario, where they will be liberated. This is the commencement of the work of restocking the inland lakes.

### ISTHMIAN CANAL IN SIGHT

United States Senate, by a Majority of Eight, Passes the Spooner Amendment.

### THE PANAMA ROUTE IS FAVORED

If a Clear Title Can Be Secured—Bill Provides for Borrowing of \$150,000,000.

Washington, June 20.—An isthmiadid people going to church ran 50 per cent. while yet absolutely assured, is nearer to construction than it ever has been. The Senate, to-day, by a majority of 8 votes, adopted the Spooner substitute for the Hepburn Nicaragua Canal bill, the vote in the Senate being 42 to 34. After two amendments to the measure had been adopted, one providing for a commission to supervise the construction of the canal and the other providing for the issuance of \$150,000,000 of 2-per-cent. gold bonds to raise money with which to construct the waterway, it was passed by a vote of 67 to 6.

It has been evident for several days that the Spooner substitute would command the votes of a majority of the Senate. The Panama route was considered more desirable by the Senate than the Nicaragua route. The only question left open is the date for the opening, and that the President will determine. If the House should adopt the Senate's amendment to its bill, the Spooner amendment provides that the President, after the law is passed, shall determine whether a clear title can be obtained of the Panama Company's property, rights and concessions. If he shall be satisfied that such title can be obtained, he shall proceed to construct an isthmiadid canal by the Nicaragua route.

The bill further provides that a commission of seven shall be appointed by the President, with which to construct the canal. The Senate had some debate over the trouble which will be caused by the House over an amendment to the Army Appropriation bill, and finally passed a conference with the House, ignoring the "offensive" message which caused the trouble.

### MORE HORSES FOR POLICE.

The police have made arrangements for an additional supply of horses for mounted officers. In the event of a strike, there are eight mounted policemen now in the employ of the department, and two horses in the stable. The total complement of horses will be twenty.

The bride wore a gown of fawn-colored organdy, with rose tulle, and a long ostrich plume. Mrs. J. J. Robins wore a handsome emerald set, made over in a little black gown. The ceremony was followed by a reception and wedding breakfast for the immediate members of the family, served at the Marlborough Hotel.

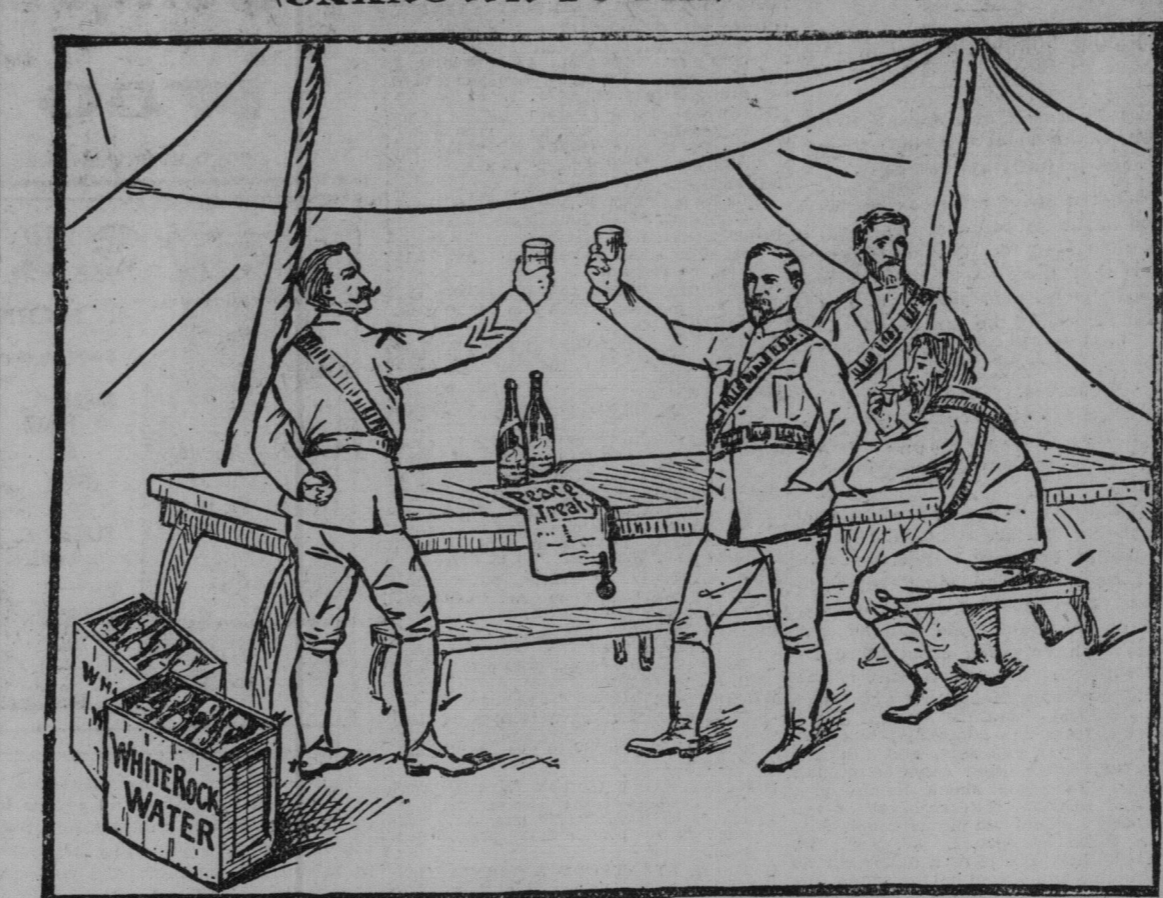

### COAL MINERS' STRIKE.

Wilkes-Barre, Pa., June 20.—The arrival of President W. R. Russell and Secretary Treasurer R. D. Ryan of the Illinois Mine workers' organization, for a conference with National President Mitchell, was the chief event of any importance around strike headquarters to-day. The following figures of the possible general strike were given out: Total number of miners in the U.S.A. 440,769. Total daily output 3,700,000 tons. Total yearly value (250 days) \$161,924,000. Coal mined each year, 275,457,118 tons. Value of coal mined \$306,500,000. Amount invested in the industry \$2,537,500,000.
