BYE-LAWS

OF THE

INCORPORATED

DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

1st. At all the meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of this Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-laws, or any proposition be adopted by the Society or the Executive Committee thereof to which his dissent shall be expressed, until the same shall have been submitted to the next Annual general meeting of the Society, and if such alteration or proposition be again adopted at such other meeting, it shall then take effect, notwithstanding such dissent.

4th. The very Rev. the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be ex. officio, Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to eight. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer.

5th. All members of the Church are invited to unite with the Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop, and all Laymembers of the Church of England subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arrear. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

6th. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and the Treasurer of the

Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as hereafter provided; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the local Committees, according to the ninth Bye-Law.

7th. An Annual Meeting of the Society, open to all its members shall be held at Halifax in the month of October, or at such time as the Executive Committee shall appoint; at which meeting the vacancies in the Executive Committee shall be filled up, the Secretaries and Treasurers shall be elected, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

8th. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of July, August and September; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or in his absence, by a Vice President,

9th. The members of the Church in every part of the Province, are invited to co-operate with the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing any one member of the Society to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision to be appointed by the Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee; and, lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.

- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society, to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen ; but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied ; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants of their own neighbourhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen ; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. At each Annual Meeting of the Society, the first five on the Executive Committee shall go out of office, but all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members shall be first proposed and seconded, then elected by ballot, and placed at the bottom of the list.

14th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at a General Meeting of the Incorporated Society ; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

O merciful God, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that thou hast made, nor wouldst the death of a sinner, but that he should be converted and live, have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, infidels, and heretics, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word, and so fetch them home, Blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

Almighty God, Father of all mercies, we Thine unworthy servants, do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all thy goodness and loving kindness to us and to all men; more particularly for the providential support by which this Society has been hitherto sustained; but above all for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy Blessed Son, for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory which Thou hast given us in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to whom, with Thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, world without end. REPORT
OF THE
EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

In presenting their *Thirty-seventh* Report, the Executive Committee would first acknowledge their thankfulness to Almighty God for the support which the Society has received, and for the benefits which have attended its work.

They would also express their unflinching trust in the same Divine assistance to those who with pure intention would carry out the Master's order: "Go ye teach all Nations."

The Committee still have cause to regret that some leading parishes shew but a partial interest in this Society, which, without party distinction, endeavors to support the living voice of the Church among our people.

With reference to the objects of the Society, your Committee would remark that while several of them are necessarily in abeyance, others have been furthered to the best of their ability.

The Widows and Orphans Fund is in a healthy condition, the Superannuation Fund is steadily though slowly increasing. The Endowment of Parishes Fund, since the privilege of reserving the "fourths" for the benefit of the parish has been withdrawn, has become merely a "trust" fund.

The most prominent object kept before your Committee has been the support of the ministry. Here they are thankful to acknowledge that the so-called "Quebec scheme" has proved of good service. It has tended to convince the people in many places that they must take an active and responsible part in the payment of the ministry. In most cases the conditions have been promptly fulfilled, in a few anticipated, and in one or two it may be necessary for the Society to look into the cause of delay.

In connection with this subject, the Executive Committee would

suggest that the minimum salary aimed at and sought for, should be \$800 in place of \$700, at least for clergy of some years standing.

It is found that greater advantages, so far as regards salary, are offered in other Dioceses, and that we have therefore lost several of our able men. The same loss is likely to recur unless we can increase the salaries given in this Diocese.

The Executive Committee are of opinion that \$700 is not a sufficient income for a clergyman in the present advanced cost of necessities.

They also think, that if these facts were positively set before the Churchmen of Nova Scotia, there would be such an increase of the general fund of the Society as would enable the Committee to make larger grants to meet and encourage greater exertion on the part of the people in the several missions.

They are also of opinion that it is not generally expedient to open new missions until better average provision be made for the support of the clergy in those already established. This can be done, and also the good work further extended, if all the parishes in the Diocese will shew as warm an interest in the Society as is evinced by a few.

The Committee are aware that the supply of native men for the ministry is not sufficient to meet the want, and they hope that if better provision can be made for the necessities of our clergy more of our young men may find it possible to devote their time and abilities to preparation for the ministry.

Your Committee have placed in the Appendix a statement of the position in which the several parishes and missions now stand with reference to *self support* and *external aid*, hoping that the information may be interesting, and the publication a stimulant to missions to work for the "independent position."

The Executive Committee appeal to the churchmen of the Diocese to uphold their hands in the good work, to enable them to better provide for the clergy now engaged and also to support the opening of new missions.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

THE Annual General Meeting was held in the National School Building, June 30th, at half-past seven, P. M.

The Right Rev. the Lord Bishop presided.

There were present thirty-five of the clergy several lay representatives and also other members of the Society.

After prayers and reading the minutes of the preceding general meeting,

The Bishop drew attention to the resolutions adopted by the Executive Committee in the name of the Society, relative to the late very Rev. Dean Bullock and the late Hon. Mr. Justice Bliss. The resolutions were read and unanimously concurred in.

It was unanimously resolved that the Rev. T. H. White, D.D., Rural Dean of Shelburne be requested to accept the office of Vice President of the Society now vacant. Dr. White thanked the Society and accepted the offer.

Canon Gilpin was appointed Secretary and Treasurer

C. Bullock, Esq., was appointed Assistant Secretary.

W. C. Silver, Esq., gave notice that he would move for the appointment of a General Clerical Secretary.

The bye-law adopted at the last general meeting was confirmed.

"That any person ceasing to be a member of the D. C. S. shall, *ipso facto*, cease to be a member of any Committee or sub-Committee, on which he had been appointed. The published Report shall be taken as an authentic record of the members of the Society at the date of its publication."

Notice was given by A. M. Cochran, Esq., of a change in the 5th bye-law of the Society, in order to require that the condition of subscribing not less than five shillings annually should apply (for membership) to the clergy as well as to the Laity.

The Bishop stated that there were seven vacancies to be filled up in the Executive Committee.

The following members of the Society were appointed to the Executive Committee:—Col. J. T. Wood, Messrs. Arthur Silver, Thomas Brown, Charles Stubbing, J. Foster, A. M. Cochran, and R. Taylor.

The Secretary of the Church Endowment Committee stated that they had sent in a report to the Secretary of the Society and that it would be published together with the Treasurer's statement in the Annual Report of the D. C. S. That there were two vacancies on the Committee, one (Judge Bliss) by death, the other (J. M. Jones, Esq.) by resignation.

The following were appointed to fill the vacancies:—Messrs. Charles Bullock and John Silver.

A report was submitted by the W. & O. sub-Committee recommending such change in the 14th and 15th rules of the Committee as would omit all mention of the "ten years." The recommendation was adopted and the rules so amended.

They recommended also such change in the 11th rule as would allow holders of certificates to travel within the limits usually allowed by Life Insurance Companies.

Notice of motion for the above change was given.

It was resolved that in future the table of Statistical Returns made by clergymen drawing any part of their income from this Society, should include the number of miles travelled.

A committee was appointed to make arrangements for a public meeting of the Society, if they should consider that it can be held with advantage.

It was resolved that in future arrangements be previously made for a public meeting at the time of each meeting of the clergy.

The meeting adjourned.

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE
COMMITTEE.

JUNE 19, 1874.—The report of the "Quebec Scheme" sub-Committee was adopted, recommending a grant of \$100 to Petite Riviere on condition of \$250 from the people, also of \$200 to Newport on condition of \$300 from the people, from the 1st July, 1874, subject to the rules of the "Quebec Scheme."

Notice of motion was given for a grant of \$50 for one year toward paying the expenses of the Rev. J. Tremain while performing some special missionary work in Cape Breton.

OCT. 16, 1874.—A grant of \$50 was made for one year from July 1st, 1874, to Rev. J. P. Tremain, towards expenses of special missionary work in Cape Breton.

Notice of motion was given for renewal of the grant of \$100 to Shelburne.

The Secretary read a memo. of grants under the "Quebec Scheme," and stated that so far the conditions had been generally complied with.

Under the new Rule requiring members of Committees to be members of the Society, the following were appointed to fill vacancies:—

Widows' and Orphans' Fund.—W. Gossip, Esq.

Endowment Fund.—T. A. Brown, Esq.

Superannuation Fund.—J. T. Wylde, Esq. and R. J. Wilson, Esq.

Applications from Guysboro', Arichat and Tangier, were referred to the "Quebec Scheme" Committee.

The Bishop informed the Committee that the Block Sum grant from the S. P. G. for 1875 would be £150 less than in 1874.

NOVEMBER 20th, 1874,—The grant to Shelburne for assistant clergyman, of \$100 was renewed for the year 1875.

Their recommendation that an additional grant of \$100 from the 1st July, 1874, be made (to terminate with the former grant to that place) to Tangier was adopted.

Notice of motion for a grant for a travelling missionary in Cape Breton was given.

DEC. 18, 1874.—The recommendation of the "Quebec Scheme" Committee was adopted, that a grant of \$100 per annum, from July 1st, 1874, be made to Arichat for the missionary there, on condition that the people make up \$250 in accordance with the rules of the "Quebec Scheme" Committee.

A grant of \$300 for one year was placed at the disposal of the Bishop toward the support of a travelling missionary in Cape Breton.

FEB. 19, 1875.—The Auditors for 1874 reported that they had examined the accounts for that year and had found them correct and satisfactory.

Messrs. Gossip and Archbold were appointed Auditors for the year 1875.

Application was received for aid to the missionary at Bridgetown. Also for an outfit for the missionary at Cumberland Mines. Also for a larger grant to Melford.

The above were referred to the "Quebec Scheme" Committee.

The Bishop read a letter from the Bishop of Montreal asking if this diocese would unite in providing a salary for the missionary Bishop of "Algoma." The amount requested was \$200 per annum.

It was evident that the subject could not be taken up by the D. C. S., yet the members present expressed their opinion that the Bishop might answer that in some way the amount would be provided by this Diocese.

MARCH 19, 1875.—The Report of the "Quebec Scheme" Committee was received and adopted in the following form:—

That a grant of \$50 be made to Bridgetown for the missionary there for two years from 1st January, 1875.

A grant of \$80 was also made (additional) to Melford, on condition of \$20 (additional) from the people from 1st January, 1875, to end with the previous grant.

The Committee did not think that under the present circumstances a grant toward an outfit for the missionary in Amherst parish could be made.

Notice of motion was given for an additional grant of \$50 to Maitland on condition of \$50 more from the people. The notice was referred to the "Quebec Scheme" Committee.

APRIL 16, 1875.—The "Quebec Scheme" Committee presented the following report:—

"With reference to the proposed grant of \$50 from the D. C. S. to Maitland, the Committee report that they cannot, in justice to those clergy whose incomes are yet under the minimum salary of \$700, recommend an increase of the grant to Maitland.

"They recommend that the minimum salary to be aimed at be \$800 in place of \$700, and they request the Executive Committee to consider the suggestion, and, if they see fit to bring the subject before the next general meeting of the Society, in the hope of so far increasing the income as to admit of larger grants to meet and encourage greater exertions on the part of the parishes."

It was moved by W. Gossip, Esq., seconded by W. C. Silver, Esq., that the Report be adopted.

Moved in amendment by A. M. Cochran, Esq., seconded by T. M. Brown, Esq.:—

"That \$40 additional be granted to Maitland from April 1st, 1875, on condition of \$50 additional being made up by the people."

The amendment was adopted, and the remaining portion of the report reserved for future consideration.

Notice of motion was given for grants toward support of missionaries at Lockeport and Mills Village, and the applications were referred to the "Quebec Scheme" Committee.

The following were appointed a sub-committee to co-operate with a sub-committee of the Synod in making arrangement for a public meeting during the Session of Synod:—Rev. R. Shreve and Messrs. W. M. Brown and R. J. Wilson.

MAY 21st, 1875.—With reference to the unconsidered portion of the Report of the "Quebec Scheme" Committee, recommending that the minimum salary be \$800; it was—

Resolved,—"That the subject be brought before the General Meeting, and that the Secretary, together with Messrs. W. C. Silver and W. M. Brown, be a sub-committee to bring it forward with all necessary information and such suggestions as the Executive Committee approve."

With reference to grants for Missionaries at Lockeport and Mills Village, the "Quebec Scheme" Committee recommended the Executive Committee to defer the considerations of those applications until the operations of the present year shall shew how far grants for new missions may be within the power of the Society.

A grant of \$30 was made toward repairing the Parsonage at Port Medway.

An application was read from the Wardens at Arichat for an increase of the grant to the Clergyman there. It was the opinion of the Committee that no further aid could now be given.

It was directed that during the vacancy at Guysboro' fifty dollars of the present grant be paid to the Clergyman officiating there, on condition of \$75 being paid by the people.

The Secretary submitted a draft of the 37th Annual Report of the Executive Committee, which after emendation was adopted.

DIGBY, April 7th, 1875.

I enclose our list of names for the Diocesan Church Society. Money is very scarce here this spring, and we have raised \$63 to pay an old parish debt, concurrently with raising the D. C. S. money. These circumstances—and not a want of interest in the Society—have caused our parochial contribution this year to fall a little behind, instead of exceeding that of last year—as we had hoped.

From the Rev. T. H. White.

SHELBURNE, 3rd April, 1874.

I beg to hand you one hundred and ninety-three dollars and ninety-three cents, being the contribution from this mission to the D. C. S. I preached five times in its behalf in as many different localities. In three of which the offerings are made at the time of Divine Service, at the other two from house to house. Sandy Point, one of our out stations, last year gave \$15, this year \$20, and this at the offertory. Sandy Point is but a small place but certainly it manifests considerable zeal in relation to the Church. I hope we shall soon have a Church edifice at Lockeport. In short the mission should be divided and a clergyman stationed at Lockeport, taking the eastern part of the county from Jordan River. I think this could be accomplished if the D. C. S. would give \$200 for a few years. It is a very thriving place and now is the time. I am well, thank God, and have not been idle this winter. I am now in my 70th year, and last year travelled 3,186 miles in the discharge of my duty. My curate's eye is better but still very dim. He is much liked and although he was laid up for eleven weeks, not a word but pity and compassion was heard on every side.

SHELBURNE, March 18th, 1875.

You will, I hope, pardon my seeming negligence in not sending an earlier report, but a prolonged affliction of the eyes has hitherto hindered me.

The official report that I enclose is, as far as regards my own labors, only up to the end of November, 1874, as I was then forced to abandon work for 3 months through causes mentioned above.

During those eleven months I said prayers on 148 occasions, preached 154 times, solemnized 20 baptisms and 3 marriages, and buried 9 persons. Visited 468 families. In visiting, holding services, &c., I travelled 1984 miles. The same services have been held by me as formerly—ten stations in all—in one, once a week; in another 3 times in a month; one fortnightly; in six monthly and occasionally in remaining one.

The contributions to the D. C. S. from Shelburne (which I trust you have received before this) are, I am happy to say, an increase on former years, and the claims of the Society seem to be better understood by the people.

I regret to tell you that the anticipated alterations of our Church, in town, have, until a short time ago, been delayed, on account of our inability to procure a plan, in all points approved; but this, I rejoice to say, has not long since been furnished, by the skill and great generosity of Rev. A. S. Norfolk, formerly of Louisburg, Cape Breton. With marked kindness he has provided plans for the complete renovation of our Church. These plans are at once suitable, workmanlike and harmonious.

The Church of the Resurrection at Church Over, and of Holy Trinity at Jordan have been neatly painted during the year, the latter, both inside and out, and it also has been provided with a suitable and sweet-toned bell, one of the many offerings of its generous donor, Edward Binney, Esq.

The kindness and consideration shown me by all, of which I spoke in the last report, has by no means been diminished during the last year and I may say especially from my good Rector. I received from the people between \$75 and \$100 more than the stipulated salary as also donations amounting to \$133. They have also added to my salary for 1875, \$100.

God grant that this is one indication that their hearts are becoming warmed more and more towards *Christ and His Church*.

From the Rev. J. R. Campbell.

YARMOUTH, March 31, 1875.

I have much pleasure in saying that the Secretary and Treasurer of this branch of the D. C. S. will, by this mail, transmit a subscription list of upwards of \$270, our offering to the general funds of the Society, for 1875; an amount in excess of that of 1874, as that was in excess of the year before. It is especially gratifying to be able to make this report in the face of the fact that money has not been known to be so scarce for many years. But we think we see in this parish a slow yet steady growth in this grace of giving which will surely bring other graces in its wake.

I have thought it worth while, as the merchants do, to take stock, as I may say of our subscribers in a way that, due allowance being made for the continual variation that is going on in every parish, probably suggests more than it proves. I observe that the

whereby it appears that the new and increased subscriptions are in a healthy excess of the subscriptions decreased and subscribers removed.

Our annual meeting on behalf of the D. C. S. for which institution the Executive Committee plead in their report—an unbroken institution in this Parish. I am told, since the establishment of the Society—was held on what turned out to be the stormiest night of an unusually stormy season. We believe these meetings to have been very beneficial to the Church; and we believe that as soon as we can, in addition to our Domestic Missionary operations, import Foreign Missionary matter in which we can tell the people what things God has done by the means of their faith, their money and their prayers, those meetings will be a still far greater benefit than they have ever yet been.

And, as we believe of the whole Church that its strength lies in being one fold under one shepherd; so we believe that the strength of the Church in this Diocese will not be developed till all its forces and several agencies are gathered into one common centre.

APPENDIX

RULES OF THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The following is the 11th object of the Diocesan Church Society :

"It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor."

1st. In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for the object to be called "The Widows' and Orphans' Fund." This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, and other contributions, given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all premiums received under these rules, and of all benefits arising therefrom ; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this particular object, and no other.

2nd. A standing sub-Committee of seven members shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, (who shall be paid as Secretary of this sub-Committee,) shall be vested the whole management of this Fund, subject to an appeal to the whole Society.

3rd. The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay, out of this Widows' and Orphans' Fund, the pensions which become due under the following rules.

4th. Every Clergyman of the Church of England within the Diocese wishing to avail himself of the benefits of this fund, shall, within six months from the 10th October, 1855, or within one year from taking orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary for a certificate of pension, and shall pay the annual sum or premium therefor, as hereafter mentioned.

5th. Any applicant, after such period of time, shall only be permitted to receive such certificate at the option of the sub-Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

6th. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable by every clergyman applying for a certificate, according to his age at the date of his first application ; it being understood that any parish or congregation contributing to the fund more than \$8.00, then the excess be counted toward payment of the premium of the minister or ministers for that year :

7th. If any clergyman marry the second time he shall pay the annual sum or premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

8th. Upon payment of the first sum or premium, the applicant shall receive a certificate, as hereafter mentioned, and the same sum shall be paid by him, up to the time of his death, on the first day of January in each year.

9th. If any person fail to pay the amount of his premium within forty days after the payment become due, all claim to the pension under his certificate shall be forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become null and void. But if he desire to have his claim to the pension renewed, it shall be in the power of this Committee to readmit him on such terms as they see fit.

10th. Permanent removal of the clergyman from this Diocese to any place beyond the limits of British North America or the United Kingdom, except with the leave of this Sub-Committee, expressed in writing, or under such conditions as they may impose, forfeits all claim to the pension.

11th. If any clergyman shall go beyond the limits mentioned in Rule 10th, without the leave of the Sub-Committee, he shall forfeit all claim to the pension.

12th. The widow of Every Clergyman who shall have paid the annual sum or premium (subject to the above exceptions) shall receive a pension of £25 per annum during widowhood.*

13th. If at any time it is the opinion of the sub-Committee that the state of the funds will safely warrant their doing so, they shall have power to increase the amount of the pensions.

14th. If the widow die or marry again the child or children of her deceased husband shall receive the pension. But no part of the pension shall be received by those children who have arrived at the age of sixteen years, if males, or eighteen years, if females, while those who are still under those respective ages will receive the full amount of the pension.

*The Committee have increased the pension to \$200 per annum.

15th. If the wife die before the husband, his child or children shall, at his death, receive the pension under the above limitation of ages.

16th. The pensions shall be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the first day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days which shall happen after the decease of each person holding a certificate, and terminate on the first of those days which shall happen after the death of the widow or child, or the happening of any other event by which, under these rules, such pension is to cease.

17th. The clergy of Prince Edward's Island shall be entitled to participate in the benefit of this fund on equal terms with the Clergy of this Province.

18th. The certificate to be granted shall be in the following form * * * * under the seal of the Society and the signature of the Secretary; and on the back thereof or annexed thereto shall be printed the above Rules.

19th. None of the above Rules and Regulations shall be altered except at a General Meeting of the D. C. S., after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

At the general meeting of the Society, Oct. 4th, 1865—"It was the opinion of the meeting that, for purposes of insurance in the W. and O. Fund, Bermuda should not be considered within the limits of British North America."

SUPERANNUATION FUND RULES.

Extract from the 11th object of the D. C. S.—It shall be one of the objects of the Society to provide * * * * for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the Society's fund shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

No. 1.—In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Superannuation Fund."

This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this object and none other.

No. 2.—A standing sub-Committee of six laymen shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Bishop of the Diocese as chairman, shall be vested the whole management of this fund.

No. 3.—The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay from the proceeds of this fund the pensions which may become due under the following rules.

No. 4.—Any Clergyman of the Church of England within this Diocese wishing to participate in the benefits of this fund, shall make application to

the sub-Committee, who shall decide each case upon its own merits, and have power to grant such amount of pension, (not exceeding \$200,) as they think expedient. But should the sub-Committee refuse to grant the pension, an appeal may be made by the applicant to the Executive Committee of the D.C.S.

No. 5.—No Clergyman admitted from abroad into this Diocese shall receive any benefit from this fund, unless he shall have served for at least seven consecutive years in this Diocese, or shall have paid into this fund a sum to be named by the sub-Committee.

No. 6.—The pension shall be for life, unless circumstances should arise (either from a falling off of the fund or otherwise) which may make a revision necessary.

No. 7.—If the pensioner reside out of this Diocese sufficient proof of his identity shall accompany each draft for his pension.

No. 8.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days that shall happen after the pension is granted, and terminate on the first of those days that shall happen after the death of the pensioner, or the happening of any other event by which such pension is to cease.

No. 9.—If any pensioner shall be so far relieved from his disability as to be able to resume the discharge of Clerical duty, the pension shall be suspended during his relief from such disability.

No. 10.—None of the above rules or regulations shall be altered except at a general meeting of the Diocesan Church Society; after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

ENDOWMENT RULES.

The following Rules for the guidance of the Endowment Sub Committee were adopted by the Standing Committee, May 17th, 1850 :—

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks, or other companies, money invested in mortgages or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Sub-Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the incumbent or resident Missionary, for the time being, of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said incumbent or resident Missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interests or rents arising from such Endowment.

II. The conveyance or trust of such Endowment may be made either to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or to the Church Corporation of the Parish, or to the Diocesan Church Society.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment, it shall be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowment shall be withheld from any incumbent or resident Missionary of any Parish or Mission who may be suspended by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the Churches in his Parish or Mission, during the continuance of such suspension

The Endowment Sub-Committee shall hold any sums contributed toward the endowment of any Parish or Mission, in trust for such Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable, consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission; and if, in the judgment of the Endowment Sub-Committee, such opportunity or proposition for Endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorize the said sums to be paid to the Parish or Mission so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing rules, or if any other point relative thereto should be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the Standing Committee of the Diocesan Church Society at their next meeting then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Sub-Committee for aid, shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish, or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a resolution of the Local Committee of the Diocesan Church Society in its favor, in such Mission; and shall state the nature, situation, value, and annual profits of the investment desired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be duly registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Sub-Committee to form a correct judgment. All such applications to be made to the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, who is ex-officio Secretary of the Endowment Sub-Committee.

The Endowment Sub-Committee, in a Report to the Executive Committee, dated May 11th, 1863, made the following recommendations:—

“That while no restriction is made as to the sum which a Parish may withdraw from its ‘*Reserved Fourths*,’ and invest as heretofore, yet that \$1000 be the minimum to which they should amount before they can be placed in trust with the Society and the interest be payable to the incumbent.

“With reference to the control of the Society over the *Reserved Fourths*, the Committee state that they have no wish to interfere in any way with the right of the Parishes to manage their own property. They would merely, for the better security of this fund, for the support of the Clergy, recommend—That a Rule be adopted which would require that, when an investment made by any Parish from its *Reserved fourths* may be paid off, the money be returned to this Society to be held under the same Rules, and on the same terms as before, until such time as the Parish may be able to procure another satisfactory investment.”

The first recommendation was adopted by the Executive Committee,—the second is still under consideration.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

3rd.—That all parishes and missions receiving aid from the D. C. S. toward the salary of their minister, shall by their wardens, or other representatives, pay to the Secretary of the Society half-yearly, on or before the 30th of June and 31st December in each year, such proportions of the required salary as may be arranged by mutual consent of themselves and the Diocesan Church Society.

4th.—On receipt of the stipulated half-yearly amount from the parish or mission, the Secretary shall accept the order of the minister for the full half year's salary as agreed upon jointly by the two contracting parties.

5th.—Should the minister accept part of the amount payable by the parish or mission in kind at *cash* prices, his receipt for the sum in the form of a Bill of items, may be counted by the wardens or representatives towards making up the amount to be paid by the parish or mission.

6th.—Should the sums agreed to be paid by the wardens or representatives not be paid when due, or within thirty days after falling due, the proportion agreed to be paid by the D.C.S. may be continued for six months, and the Executive Committee shall enquire into the cause of such deficiency, and consider the subject at the ensuing meeting.

7th.—The receipt of the Clergyman for money given at the offertory may be received from the Wardens as part of the conditional payment required by the Society from the people.

CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information :—

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.
- 4.—The proposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.
- 6.—That all the sittings are to be free and unappropriated.

It is the wish of the Executive Committee that no Clergyman should when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Society, without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Society to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made on the following terms, namely: That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished. Grants to Parsonages are made on similar conditions.

"The Endowment Sub-Committee receive and hold any money given in trust to the Society for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given."

"It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that it is the intention of the fifth Bye-Law that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a member, but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Society.

"The Society will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the *Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission*, all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that Parish."

"All subscription lists received before the 31st March in each year, will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

"If reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Society."

☞ The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above regulations.

"All applications for aid from this Society are proposed at one meeting of the Committee and considered at the next."

"No person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Society, nor to be elected a member of the Executive Committee, who has not been a Subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting."

At the General Meeting in 1869 the following Resolution was adopted:—

"The Church property, in any Parish, which is actually occupied by the Incumbent of the said Parish, shall be valued by competent valuers, upon his taking charge, and be considered at the same value for purposes of salary during his incumbency; and the valuers shall be appointed as follows, viz., one by the parish, one by the Executive Committee of D. C. S., and another by those two."
